FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
An Introduction to Msgr. Marucci's "Stay at Home" Parish Lenten Pilgrimage (Week 1)

Two months ago, a priest friend from Buffalo told me about an experience that surprised him. He was driving home late on a foggy night, the kind where the headlights seem to illuminate nothing but a wall of gray. As he crept along,

tense and unsure of the next turn, something unexpected happened: his GPS suddenly lost its signal. No map. No guidance. Just silence and fog.

He pulled over, frustrated. But as he waited, he noticed something: without the noise of the car or the pressure to keep moving, the fog around him began to thin. Slowly, almost imperceptibly, shapes emerged—trees, a fence line, the outline of the road bending gently to the right. When he finally started driving again, he did so more slowly, more attentively, more peacefully.

Later, he told me, *"It was strange. Losing direction helped me see again."* That moment is like the Lenten season. God doesn't remove the map to punish us; He invites us to look up, slow down, and notice that Christ is already drawing us forward—through fog, uncertainty, and the gentle turns we might otherwise miss.

Lent is not an obstacle course. I like to think of it as a recalibration of vision. A holy opportunity to let the Lord reset our priorities, our patterns, and our pace. This year, I invite you to journey through our **"Stay at Home" Parish Lenten Pilgrimage**. Each week you will have the opportunity to travel with Jesus through six Gospel moments that shape the heart of Lent. My intent is to write a reflection each week that shows Jesus revealing what our souls often forget: that **God is patient, God is present, and God is already working in the places we feel lost**. Here is our pilgrimage path:

- **Week 1 – Matthew 4:1–22: *Desert & Call*** Jesus resists temptation (4:1–11) and then calls fishermen to follow (4:18–22). He doesn't just free us from evil; He frees us *for* a mission.
- **Week 2 – Matthew 17:1–9: *Transfiguration*** A glimpse of glory strengthens disciples for the road ahead. We learn how hope transfigures ordinary faithfulness.
- **Week 3 – John 4:5–42: *The Samaritan Woman*** At the well, Jesus names our thirst and offers living water. No one is too far, too complicated, or too late for grace.
- **Week 4 – John 9:1–41: *The Man Born Blind*** Sight is restored, courage is born, and a community must decide what to do with the Light standing in front of them.
- **Week 5 – John 11:1–45: *The Raising of Lazarus*** Jesus steps into our grief, weeps with us, and calls us out of the tomb—unbind him, let her go.
- **Week 6 – Palm Sunday – Matthew 26:14–27: *The Passion*** We enter the week of mercy, watching Love persevere through betrayal, denial, suffering, and the Cross.

Each reflection will offer you an opportunity to journey with Jesus. I will offer a brief Gospel focus, one image to carry into prayer, and two or three simple practices you can live at home. If your Lent has felt "hit-or-miss" in the past, take heart: God is more patient than our calendars and more faithful than our attempts. He doesn't wait at the finish line—He walks beside us, now. Are you willing to journey with Jesus this Lent? If so....read on.

Week 1 — Into the Desert, Onto the Shore (Matthew 4:1–22)

In today's Gospel, **the Spirit leads Jesus into the desert to face temptation**. Jesus responds not with clever comebacks but with the living Word of God, revealing a heart anchored in the Father. Immediately after, He walks along the shore and calls ordinary fishermen to an extraordinary life: "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." The arc is intentional: **freedom from false promises becomes freedom for real discipleship**.

I would like you to consider this image for prayer this week. Imagine standing with Jesus at the edge of the wilderness at dawn. The air is cool; the horizon is clean. He looks at you—not disappointed, but delighted that you showed up—and says, **"Walk with Me."** Later, picture Him

on the shoreline, eyes meeting yours, speaking the same invitation: **"Follow me."** Desert and shoreline are two doors into the same house: **friendship with God.**

Consider the following three lessons for the week.

1. **Name the devil when he tempts.** The tempter offers shortcuts—bread without trust, glory without surrender, religion without obedience. Temptations often mimic good desires (security, recognition, influence), but **they cut God out of the story.** This week, when a temptation surfaces, pause and ask: ***What good do I really desire here?*** Then ask the Lord to provide for you the real thing in His way, in His time.
2. **Hold fast to the Word.** Jesus answers with Scripture, not slogans. Choose one verse from this Sunday's Gospel—perhaps, "One does not live by bread alone," or simply, "Follow me." Write it on a card. Put it on your phone's lock screen. Let it become your breath prayer when you feel tired, hurried, or pulled in ten directions. Pray it often throughout the day.
3. **Respond promptly, not perfectly.** Peter and Andrew left their nets *at once*. They didn't possess a five-year plan; they possessed willing hearts. God does more with prompt willingness than with polished hesitation. Your "yes" may be small, but it lets grace move. If you are hesitating to commit to being his disciple, take a lesson from our Patron, Andrew.

During the week, implement one of the following spiritual practices:

- **Fast from the automatic reach.** Identify your default comfort (scrolling, snacking, background noise). When you feel the reach, wait 60 seconds and pray, "Jesus, I hunger for You." Then decide again.
- **Five minutes of first-fruits.** Before coffee, email, or news, sit in silence with the Lord. Make the Sign of the Cross slowly. Read Matthew 4:1–11 or 4:18–22. Speak one honest sentence to Jesus; listen for one word from Him.
- **Show Mercy to one person in a special way.** Do one concrete act of charity: check on a neighbor, call someone lonely, or donate food. Fasting opens space; mercy fills it with love.

Remember, Lent is a time for spiritual growth and renewal. If it has been a while since you last went to confession, come to this Wednesday evening's holy hour and Sacrament of Reconciliation (7:00 PM). Come to the church and simply pray: **"Jesus, it's been some time. I need you, Lord, in my life."** Sit before the Blessed Sacrament for a few minutes and reflect on what disappoints our Lord. Then, enter the confessional, make a good confession, and receive the great gift of God's mercy. The goal is never embarrassment—it's freedom to live in God's love and mercy. I hope you will enjoy this Lenten Journey.

Lord Jesus, lead me through the desert of distractions and into the freedom of Your call. Expose the temptations that drain my joy, steady me in Your Word, and make my heart prompt to follow You. Give me the courage of our Patron, St. Andrew, and the peace of belonging to You. Amen.

The Road Ahead

- **Week 2 – Mount Tabor: Hope Stronger than Fear (Mt 17:1–9):** Let a glimpse of glory strengthen your daily obedience.
- **Week 3 – At the Well: Truth that Quenches (Jn 4:5–42):** Let Jesus meet you where you actually are—and give you living water.
- **Week 4 – Eyes Wide Open (Jn 9:1–41):** Learn to see—and to stand—by the Light you've received.
- **Week 5 – Come Out! (Jn 11:1–45):** Bring your grief to Christ and hear Him call you to new life.

Week 6 – From Hosanna to "It Is Finished" (Mt 26:14–27): Walk the Passion with reverence and discover the mercy that never quits.

Last month we collected 42 casseroles for Joseph's House! A big thank you to our volunteers! We appreciate your commitment to this ministry. In addition to casseroles, we will continue collecting individual snack bags for Joseph's House clients. The next drop off for casseroles will be **Thursday, February 26 , 2026 from 10-11 AM**. Drive up to the parish hall and a volunteer will be there in the parking area. We will hand deliver to Joseph's House later in the day. Hamburger Noodle Casserole

1 lb. hamburger	1 cup cottage cheese
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce	1 cup sour cream
1 medium chopped onion	12oz. egg noodles
1 cup of green pepper	2 cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated.

Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label "St. Andrew's- Hamburger Noodle Casserole."

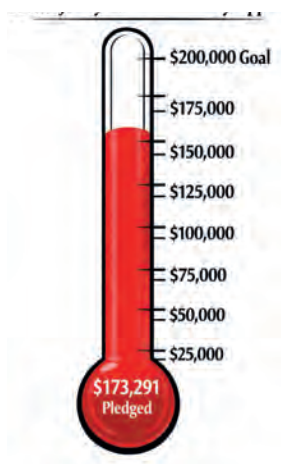

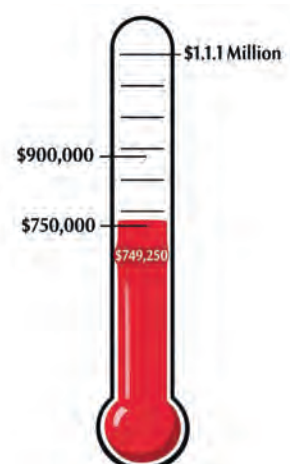
