DESK...Lenten "Stay-at-
Home"
Pilgrimage - Week 2
Climbing Mount Tabor:
Hope is Stronger than Fear
(Matthew 17:1–9)**

A parishioner once shared a story with me from her family's hiking trip in the Blue Ridge Mountains. The trail they chose turned out to be much steeper than expected. She was not fond of heights, and each upward turn made her breathing shallow and her heart race. Half-way up, she stopped, planted her hands on her knees, and said, "I can't do this." Her son, several steps ahead, looked back and said something surprisingly wise for a twelve-year-old: "Mom, stop looking at the path. Look at the sky—just for a minute."

She hesitated, but finally looked up. In that moment, she noticed things she hadn't seen before: rays of light slipping through the treetops, the gentle sway of branches in the breeze, the brilliant blue of an unhindered sky. The trail was still steep, the climb still hard—but something inside her shifted. She later told me, "It didn't make the mountain smaller. It just made my fear less important."

This is precisely what the Transfiguration does for us. On Mount Tabor, Jesus does not erase the path ahead. Instead, He reveals a glimpse of the truth that carries us through it. Glory does not eliminate difficulty; it *reorients* it. God knows that before His disciples walk into the valley of suffering, they need to lift their eyes and see the larger horizon: **hope stronger than fear, light stronger than darkness, love stronger than death.**

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain. There, before their eyes, His face shines like the sun and His clothing becomes dazzlingly white. Moses and Elijah—representing the Law and the Prophets—stand beside Him. Then the Father speaks words that echo through salvation history: "This is my

beloved Son... listen to Him."

Why this moment? Why now? Because Jesus knows His disciples. He knows how fragile they are. He knows how easily fear can eclipse faith. Within days, they will hear Him speak of suffering, rejection, and the Cross. Their world will topple. Their convictions will shake. So Jesus gives them, in love, a glimpse of glory **before** the darkness comes. I like to think of it as a spiritual shot in the arm. Tabor is God's way of saying: **When everything falls apart, remember who I am. Remember what you saw. Remember the truth that is greater than your fear.** The same is true for us.

Every one of us walks through valleys—illness, uncertainty, grief, discouragement, temptation, anxiety. **And just as He did for Peter, James, and John, Jesus offers us grace before the trial fully arrives:** little flashes of His presence, unexpected moments of beauty, small consolations in prayer, an inspired Scripture passage, a gesture of love from someone at just the right moment. These are not coincidences. **These are "Tabor moments,"** strengthening us for whatever lies ahead.

This week, picture yourself climbing Mount Tabor with Jesus. The path is tiring; you're not sure why He brought you here. But when you reach the top, He turns toward you—not distant, not dazzling at first, but simply present. Then His glory unfolds before you, and you hear the Father's voice spoken personally: "This is my beloved... **listen to Him.**" Let that phrase echo throughout your week. Let it shape the way you face difficulties, decisions, and fears.

To guide you in your Lenten spiritual exercise this week, think about the following spiritual thoughts, and try to implement the spiritual practices that follow:

First, let God strengthen you before you think you need strength. We often wait until we are overwhelmed to pray. Jesus invites us to receive grace *ahead of time*. Ask Him each morning: "Lord, what courage are You offering me today?" **Second, listen more deeply, not more anxiously.** The Father's command is direct: "Listen to Him." Not to your fears. Not to your worries. Not to the

noise around you. Set aside one quiet moment each day and listen for a simple word from Jesus—encouragement, correction, peace, clarity.

Third, don't cling to the mountaintop; carry it into the valley. Peter wanted to pitch tents and stay on Tabor. Jesus gently led them back down. We, too, are not meant to escape life, but to live it strengthened by what we have seen in Christ. The point of glory does not escape—it is mission.

Next, try to implement these spiritual practices during the week.

- 1. The "Look Up" Practice:** Once a day, pause and literally look up at the sky. Let your heart remember that God's perspective is wider than your own.
- 2. Pray the Transfiguration Slowly:** Read Matthew 17:1–9. Picture the scene. Notice what Jesus' face looks like. Pay attention to how you feel when the Father speaks.
- 3. Offer a Moment of Hope to Someone Else:** Send one encouraging message or make one supportive phone call. You may be someone's glimpse of Tabor today.
- 4. Consider this invitation:** If it has been a while since you experienced God's mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, consider going this Wednesday (at 7:00 PM) to our parish holy hour and confessions. Sit before the Lord and simply pray: **"Jesus, let Your light break through my darkness."** Grace awaits you—not judgment, but strength.
- 5. Pray this prayer daily this week: Lord Jesus, let Your light strengthen me. Quiet the fears that rise in my heart and help me listen to Your voice above all others. As You once led the disciples down the mountain, lead me with courage into whatever lies ahead. May Your glory guide my steps and Your love steady my heart. Amen.**

I hope this Lenten "Stay-at-Home" Pilgrimage is helping you grow deeper in your faith and in your understanding of this week's Gospel.

YOUTH ALTAR SERVER MINISTRY




"Go forth from the land of your kinsfolk and from your father's house to a land that I will show you." GENESIS 12:1




