**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:**  
**Lenten Pilgrimage Week 3**  
***The Woman At the Well:***  
***Truth That Quenches (John***  
***4:5–42)***

Several years ago, a man told me about a moment that changed the way he prayed. He had been traveling for work, rushing between airports, running on little sleep, and feeling spiritually empty. During a long layover, he wandered into one of those small airport chapels—quiet, dimly lit, mostly empty chairs. He sat down with no plan, no polished prayer, not even the energy to pretend he was doing well. After a few minutes, he said aloud—just once—“**Lord, I’m tired.**”

To his surprise, that was enough. Something within him softened. He later described it like this: *“I didn’t hear God’s voice. Nothing miraculous happened. But admitting the truth—my real truth—felt like drinking water after a long thirst.”* That simple moment captures the heart of this week’s Gospel.

The story of **the Samaritan woman at the well** is not about having the perfect prayer or the perfect life. It is about what happens when Jesus meets us exactly where we are—at the dry places, the complicated places, the painful places—and offers the water our souls have been craving.

In today’s Gospel, John tells us that Jesus arrived at Jacob’s well at noon, the hottest part of the day, when no sensible person would go out to draw water. Except, of course, someone who is avoiding others. Did you notice that the woman came alone—no companions, no crowd. She carried not only her jar, but also her shame, her disappointments, her messy past, and a longing she could not quite name. And there, at that very moment, Jesus sat down and waited for her.

Many people wonder WHY the Samaritan woman traveled

all the way from her hometown (Sychar) to Jacob’s well when there were closer sources of water available. Scripture does not give a direct explanation, but the details that John provides paint a vivid picture. She arrived at the well **at noon**, the hottest time of day—precisely when no one else would be drawing water. This unusual timing tells us something important: she likely wanted to avoid the other women of the town. Given her complicated past and the social stigma that would have surrounded her, the town well would have been a place of whispers, judgment, and humiliation. Jacob’s well, farther from the center of town, offered her the one thing she could not find among her neighbors—privacy.

But distance alone is not the whole story. Jacob’s well sat on land deeply connected to the faith of her ancestors, a place associated with the patriarch Jacob and fed by a reliable underground spring. For someone who carried so much emotional and spiritual weight, this well may have represented not only physical water, but a sense of safety, stability, and sacredness. In a life marked by broken relationships and disappointment, the well stood as something constant—a place where she could draw water without drawing scrutiny.

And it is precisely **there**, at the place she retreats to hide from others, that Jesus chose to meet her. Not in the bustling town square, not in the synagogue, not in a moment when she felt put together—but in her place of avoidance, in the heat of the day, at the margins. Her journey to Jacob’s well was likely an attempt to escape the eyes of others, yet it became the place where the gaze of Christ met her with truth, mercy, and transforming love.

Notice how Jesus approaches her. He began not with judgment, but with **a request: “Give me a drink.”** It is a disarming question. A beginning point. A way of saying, “I see you. I am not avoiding you. I want to be in conversation with you.”

This is the first lesson of this week’s Lenten Pilgrimage: **Jesus meets us where we are, not where we think we should be.** He did not wait for her to fix her life before approaching her. He did not shame her for approaching the well at a strange hour. He simply began with honesty, openness, and presence.

It is also important to notice that Jesus was tired when He arrived at the well. The Savior of the world chose to enter human exhaustion so that no one can say, "He doesn't understand what I'm going through." He sat at the well not to expose her weakness, but to share His own humanity.

Here is an interesting fact about today's Gospel. The dialogue between Jesus and the woman is the *longest recorded conversation* Jesus had with anyone in the Gospels. That alone should tell us something: Namely, **God has time for our complicated lives.** God has time for those who feel misunderstood; for those who feel far from perfect, and for those who come to the well at noon.

What fascinates me about Jesus in this story was that He slowly drew her into deeper truth—not to condemn her, but to free her. He revealed her history: "Yes, you have had five husbands."

He named her pain without crushing her, and He called her deeper *without humiliating her.* **Truth becomes the doorway to mercy.** And then came the extraordinary promise: "**Whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst.**"

He was not speaking of physical thirst. He was speaking of the inner thirst every human heart carries—**the thirst for love, belonging, purpose, forgiveness, stability, identity, and peace.** The woman's response was simple and stunning: "**Sir, give me this water.**" It is the honest prayer of every soul that has tried everything else and finally dares to ask God for what truly satisfies.

This week, for our "Stay-at-Home" Lenten pilgrimage, imagine this Prayer. Imagine yourself walking to the well at noon. You feel the heat, the weight of what you carry, the weariness of your life. Jesus is already there—waiting, not judging. He looks at you with kindness and says, "**Give me a drink.**" In other words: "**Let me into your real life. Start from where you actually are.**" See yourself offering Him your fears, your worries, and your struggles. Hear Him say: "**I will give you living water.**"

This week's Gospel teaches us valuable lessons: First, Je-

sus meets us in our thirst, not in our perfection. Name your thirst this week—your longing for hope, understanding, healing, reconciliation, rest. Let that be the beginning of prayer. Second, **Truth and love always travel together.** Jesus named the woman's wounds but did so with tenderness. Allow Jesus to speak truth into your life—not to shame you, but to liberate you. And Third, **Grace turns us into witnesses.** The woman left her water jar—her old burdens—and ran to the town proclaiming, "Come and see!" When you experience God's mercy, don't hide it. Share it.

Let me suggest the following **Spiritual Practices for this third week of our "Stay-at-Home" Lenten Pilgrimage:**

1. **Pray with your thirst.** Each morning, complete this sentence: "**Lord, today I thirst for...**" Let this guide your prayer.
2. **Leave one "water jar" at the well.** What habit, burden, or shame have you been carrying? Name it. Ask Jesus to carry it with you or take it from you.
3. **Offer encouragement to someone who feels alone.** The woman came to the well alone. This week, reach out to someone who may feel isolated.
4. Pray this prayer each day during the week: Lord Jesus, meet me at the well of my life. Speak into my thirsts, my fears, and my hidden places. Give me Your living water—Your presence, Your mercy, and Your peace. Help me to let go of what no longer gives life and make me a witness of Your love to others. Amen.

I hope and pray that this Lenten Pilgrimage is helping you grow in your faith.


