**FROM THE PASTOR'S
DESK...Msgr. Marucci "Stay
-at-Home" Lenten Pilgrim-
age Week 5 — *Come Out!*
*New Life Amid Grief (John
11:1–45)***

A parishioner shared with me that after her grandmother died, the family gathered to go through her belongings. Everyone expected tears, and there were plenty. However,

something unexpectedly funny happened. She opened her grandmother's old purse, the one she carried everywhere, and inside she found... a stash of chocolates, even though her grandmother was a diabetic, a grocery list with only two items on it ("milk" and "candy"), and an envelope that said in her grandmother's handwriting: *"Do not open until I'm gone."*

Her heart stopped — she thought it might be something profound, maybe a final message or a blessing. Inside the envelope was a single handwritten line: **"If you're reading this, it means someone finally cleaned out my purse, and lol, now you know where I stashed my chocolate candy. I'm Loving you from heaven!"**

She said, "Monsignor, I bawled and cracked up at the same time. It was like she reached out of the grave, just to make me smile one more time." Then she paused and said something beautiful: "It reminded me that death doesn't seal everything shut. Love has a way of slipping through the cracks — sometimes even with a laugh — and reminding us that what feels dead isn't always gone."

That experience resonates with this week's Gospel. The story of **the raising of Lazarus** is not merely about a man who returns from a tomb. It is about the places in our lives that have grown sealed-off, silent, or dead—and the voice of Christ calling us back into life. As we enter the fifth week of Lent, Jesus stands before every sealed stone in our hearts and speaks the words we long to hear: **"Come out."**

Today's Gospel begins with a story of friendship. Lazarus is not a stranger; he is someone Jesus loved deeply, along with his sisters, Mary and Martha. When Lazarus became ill, his sisters sent a message with confidence: **"Lord, the one you love is ill."** They assumed Jesus would come immediately, but He didn't. He delayed his visit and that delay hurt them deeply. In my opinion, I believe he delayed his visit intentionally.

In Jewish Tradition, some believed that a person's soul lingered near the body for three days before departing completely. By waiting until the fourth day, Jesus made it clear that Lazarus was truly dead and that his resurrection was a divine act, not a coincidence. This reinforced Jesus' power over death and decay.

There is a significant difference in Jesus raising Lazarus, who had been dead and buried for four days, from the people Jesus brought back to life near the same day that they died. Unlike the others, Lazarus was a witness to Jesus' ability to raise the dead from the grave long after they had died.

Ultimately, Jesus' delay was intentional. It revealed God's power, strengthened faith, and demonstrated that God's timing is perfect—even when it did not align with human expectations. It reminds us to trust in God's greater plan, even when we don't understand the delays in our own lives.

We have all experienced moments when God seemed slow to answer, seemed absent during crisis, or quiet when we longed for intervention. Mary and Martha's pain reflect our own: "Lord, if you had been here..." But Jesus' delay was not neglect; it was part of a deeper plan that no one could yet see. Jesus would use this moment not only to raise Lazarus but to reveal the fullness of His identity: **"I am the resurrection and the life."**

Before Jesus performed a miracle, He gave a promise. Before He restored life, He deepened faith. And, before He called Lazarus out, He invited Martha to trust. This is the first lesson for this week: **God's timing is not always immediate, but it is always purposeful.**

When Jesus arrived at Bethany and saw Mary's heart-break, something extraordinary happened: **Jesus wept.** He who would raise the dead allowed Himself to feel the sting of grief. This moment teaches us something profound: **God does not avoid our sorrow; He enters it.**

From this story, we learn that we are never alone in our grief, our disappointments, or the painful pauses of life. Jesus stands with us, cries with us, and loves us through the moments when we cannot see beyond the tomb in front of us.

At the tomb, Jesus said something astonishing: **"Take away the stone."** Martha objected. "Lord, surely there will be a stench (it will smell)." In other words: "That area is too painful to open." However Jesus insisted. Notice that Jesus did not force His way in; He invited their cooperation. Only then did He call out with authority: **"Lazarus, come out!"**

And Lazarus came forth—still wrapped in burial cloths, still needing others to unbind him, but alive. Fully and unmistakably alive. This is the second lesson: **New life is possible—but we must allow Jesus to open what we have sealed.**

Everyone of us has a "tomb":

- a wound we've buried
- a relationship we've given up on
- a habit we feel powerless to change
- a disappointment that hardened into bitterness
- a dream we've convinced ourselves is done
- a sin that feels too heavy to confess

Jesus stands before each of these and says, "Roll away the stone. Let Me in."

For our "Stay-at-Home" Lenten Pilgrimage this week, imagine yourself standing outside a tomb in your heart—perhaps a fear, a grief, a sin, or a memory. You feel the weight of the stone, the heaviness of what lies within. Then imagine Jesus approaching with tenderness and authority.

He places His hand on the stone and says, **"Let's open this**

together."

As light pours in, hear Him call your name: **"Come out."** Not with judgment. Not with disappointment. But with love strong enough to call you into freedom. Next reflect on the three following themes we learn from this week's Gospel:

First, God's delays are not denials. Jesus waited before going to Bethany, not out of indifference but to reveal something greater. Trust that God is working even when He seems slow. **Second, Jesus feels your sorrow.** He wept with Mary. He weeps with you. You do not carry your burdens alone. **Third, Resurrection begins today.** Lazarus was raised before Easter. Your renewal can begin before Holy Week even arrives. Next, try to implement the following Spiritual Practices during the week:

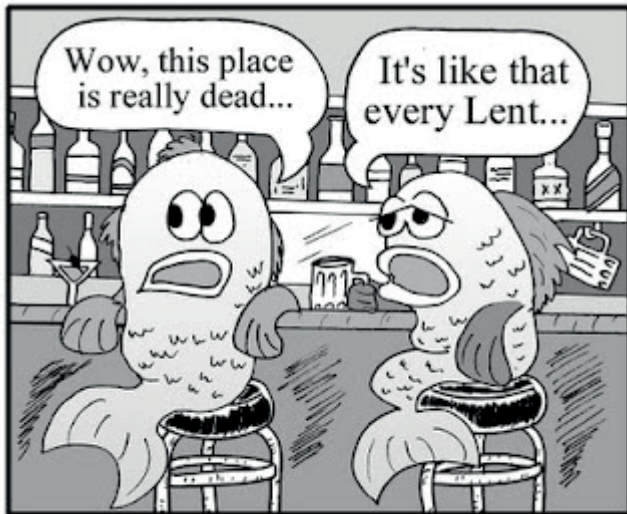
- 1. Name your tomb.** Write down one part of your life that feels stuck, dead, or sealed off. Bring it to prayer. Ask: **"Jesus, call me into new life here."**
- 2. Roll away one stone.** Make one practical step toward healing: a phone call, an apology, a confession, a difficult conversation, a moment of honesty with yourself or God.
- 3. Help unbind someone.** Lazarus needed help removing his burial cloths. Who in your life needs encouragement, forgiveness, or support to walk in freedom?
- 4. Pray the following prayer during the week: Lord Jesus, stand before the sealed places in my life and speak Your word of life. Call me out of fear, sin, grief, and discouragement. Make me alive again in Your grace. And help me to unbind others with mercy and love. Amen.**

I pray that our "Stay-at-Home" Lenten Pilgrimage has helped you to grow closer to Jesus this Lent.

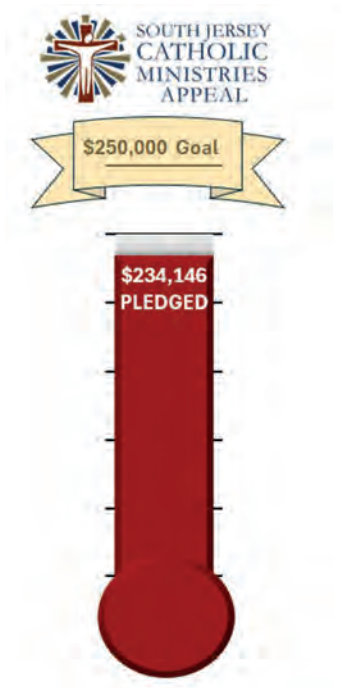
