FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
**"From Palms to the Chal-
lice: Staying with Jesus All
the Way"**

Palm Sunday is a paradox. We begin with joy—branches waving, hosannas ringing, cloaks spread like a makeshift red carpet for a humble King on a borrowed colt. Yet within minutes the liturgy takes us from triumphant procession to the

heavy silence of the Passion. We cry "Hosanna!" and then hear "Crucify Him!" The Church does not do this to confuse us; she does it to tell the truth about the human heart and the divine heart at once. Our love can be fickle, our courage fragile. His love is steadfast, faithful to the end.

Historically, that first Palm Sunday was a prophetic act: Jesus enters Jerusalem as the true Son of David, but not on a war horse. He rides a beast of burden to show us that the victory He brings will not be won by force, but by self-emptying love. The crowds welcome a Messiah they hope will solve their problems on their terms; Jesus comes to save them on God's terms—through the cross. The week that begins with branches will end with a tree—the wood of the cross—upon which the King will reign in love.

But Palm Sunday is not only a memory; it is a mirror. It asks each of us: which voice will I join this week? Will I remain close to Jesus when His path leads toward surrender, sacrifice, and the seeming scandal of the cross? Or will I keep Him at a safe distance, cheering when it's easy, fading when it's costly?

This year, our parish is walking into Holy Week with a special grace: a season of Eucharistic Revival. A few years ago we launched an effort to ensure that all Parishioners understand that Jesus Christ is truly physically present in the Eucharist. During our recent parish Mission, a few parishioners were asked to give their own testimony of what

the Eucharist means to them. It is fitting as approach Holy Week to share the testimony shared by Teresa Valencia of the Legion of Mary. Teresa offered this sincere account of how the Lord brought her from longing to living communion:

"All my life I had been searching and longing for a way to touch Jesus, to have his physical presence to cling to. I started collecting relics of saints believing the more relics I touched the closer I could get to him... I even wrongfully felt jealous of his disciples and the Apostles... Then came my awakening... the Eucharistic Revival... I asked myself... Do I sincerely and truly believe I am receiving the body and blood of Christ? ... As a CCD teacher, preparing the lesson on the Last Supper, do I truly believe what Jesus said...'This is my body. This is my blood. Do this in remembrance of me'. I realized Jesus never intended that this celebration would end. He wanted to remain with us to the end of time.

So what is the Eucharist to me now? I am no longer looking for relics to touch to get close to Him. I am no longer envious of the Apostles who walked with Him. Why? Because I truly know and believe that I receive Jesus each week—the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—in the Eucharist I receive... Every time I receive the Eucharist I am receiving Jesus Himself."

Teresa's testimony is more than a personal story; it is an echo of Palm Sunday's invitation. The same Jesus who entered Jerusalem then enters our church now—hidden, humble, and wholly present in the Eucharist. On Palm Sunday we meet Him in the Gospel; at Mass we meet Him in the Host. The procession with palms teaches us to make a procession of the heart: to go out to meet the Lord who comes to us under the appearance of bread and wine. The crowd's cry, "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord," becomes our acclamation before Holy Communion—"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest." The liturgy is intentional: the Hosanna of the streets becomes the Hosanna at the altar, because the King we welcomed rides on—straight to the upper room, straight to the cross, and straight to the altar, and into our hearts.

If you have ever felt what Teresa felt—wishing you could have walked with Jesus 2,000 years ago—Palm Sunday gently corrects and consoles us. We do walk with Him now. We see His self-giving love made present in every Mass. The same Christ who was hailed by crowds and then handed over by friends now offers Himself to us, not as a memory but as a sacrament: “This is my Body... This is my Blood.” Teresa realized what the Church has proclaimed from the beginning: Jesus did not intend that the gift of Holy Thursday remain in the upper room. He placed that gift into the hands of the Apostles and their successors so that every generation could receive Him—our generation, our parish, our families.

Palm Sunday also names a temptation we all face: to prefer a Jesus who meets our expectations to the Jesus who meets us in our need. The crowds wanted a liberator; Jesus came as a Lamb. We often want quick answers; He offers abiding presence. We want a path that avoids suffering; He gives us Himself in the very place we feel most powerless. That’s why the Eucharist is not a footnote to Holy Week; it is its heartbeat. Jesus gives us the cross as the measure of love and the Eucharist as its medicine—strength for the journey through this life to the next.

So let me ask you, how do you live Palm Sunday now?

1. **Welcome Him publicly, adore Him personally.** Let this week be a procession from the church door to the tabernacle of your heart. Come to the liturgies of the Triduum—Holy Thursday’s Mass of the Lord’s Supper especially—and spend a few minutes in quiet adoration. The same Lord who entered Jerusalem awaits you in the monstrance and the Mass.
2. **Stay with Him when it’s inconvenient.** The Passion narrative reminds us that discipleship includes late nights, unanswered questions, and a willingness to stand at the foot of the cross. Choose one concrete act of fidelity this week: reconcile with someone, or keep a Holy Hour you’ve been postponing.
3. **Let the Eucharist interpret your suffering.** Whatever cross you carry, bring it to the altar. In the Eucharist, Jesus doesn’t remove every burden; He shares it. As Teresa discovered, we do not have to reach across centuries to touch Him. He reaches across the altar to

touch us.

4. **Receive the Eucharist as if it were for the first time.** Before Communion next Sunday, take Teresa’s words into your prayer: “Every time I receive the Eucharist, I am receiving Jesus Himself.” Make an act of faith—simple, sincere, and specific: “Lord, I believe You are here for me.”

Teresa’s journey—from collecting relics to recognizing the Real Presence—parallels the Church’s journey through Holy Week. On Palm Sunday we wave branches; on Holy Thursday we receive the Bread of Life; on Good Friday we behold the Wood of the Cross; on the Easter Vigil we receive the Light that no darkness can overcome. Each movement draws us deeper into the same mystery: Jesus does not merely pass through our city; He abides in our midst. He does not merely teach us from a distance; He feeds us with His very life.

So, as we lift our palms today, let us also lift our eyes to the altar. The King we praise along the road is the Priest and Victim we receive in Holy Communion. The Hosanna we sing in procession becomes the Amen we whisper when we receive Him. And the courage we lack is given to us by the One who rides humbly into our hearts, again, until love finishes its work in us.

May we enter this week with Teresa’s clarity and the Church’s confidence: **I am not far from Jesus. He is as near as the Eucharist I receive. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.**
