**FROM THE PASTOR'S
DESK...The Gift of Divine
Mercy**

Several years ago, a man came to speak with me shortly before Mass. His shoulders were slumped, his eyes tired in a way that showed years of regret rather than lack of sleep. He said, almost apologetically, "Monsignor, I don't know if God still wants anything to do with me." He spoke of

failed relationships, broken promises, and choices he wished he could undo. What struck me most was not the gravity of his sins, but the heaviness of his belief that mercy had an expiration date—and that his had already passed.

That misunderstanding is precisely why the Church, in her wisdom, places Divine Mercy Sunday before us every year. It is God's emphatic answer to the fear that we can somehow out-sin His love. Divine Mercy Sunday proclaims what the Gospel has always taught: mercy is not a reward for the worthy, but a gift for the broken.

Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter, and the Gospel proclaimed is typically from St. John (20:19–31). The risen Jesus appears to the disciples locked in fear behind closed doors. These are the same disciples who abandoned Him in His hour of need. And yet, Jesus does not rebuke them. He does not shame them. His first words are: "*Peace be with you.*"

Then comes a moment that reveals the heart of Divine Mercy. Jesus breathes on them and says, "*Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them.*" In this act, Christ establishes the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Mercy is no longer an abstract idea—it becomes something concrete, sacramental, and ongoing within the life of the Church. We also encounter Thomas, who doubts. Even Thomas is met not with condemnation, but with an invitation: "*Put your finger here... do not be unbelieving but believe.*" Divine Mercy does not demand perfect faith;

it meets us precisely in our weakness.

The Feast of Divine Mercy is a relatively recent addition to the Church's universal calendar, officially instituted by St. John Paul II in the year 2000. However, its roots reach deeply into the heart of the Gospel and the life of the Church. Jesus Himself requested this feast through a humble Polish nun, St. Faustina Kowalska, during a series of private revelations in the 1930s. Jesus told her that He desired a special day set aside to celebrate the depth of His mercy, promising extraordinary graces to those who trust in Him.

St. John Paul II—long devoted to the message of Divine Mercy—canonized Sr. Faustina on April 30, 2000, and on that very day declared the Second Sunday of Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday for the whole Church. Providentially, John Paul II would die on the vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday in 2005, a final testimony to the mercy he preached so fervently.

St. Faustina was not a scholar or visionary in the usual sense. She was a simple nun who struggled with illness, self-doubt, and misunderstanding. Yet Jesus entrusted to her a message that the world desperately needed. In her diary, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*, she records Jesus' words calling humanity to trust in His mercy. Repeatedly, Jesus echoes a simple message: "*The greater the sinner, the greater the right he or she has to My mercy.*" Faustina's spirituality centers on trust—not in ourselves, but in Jesus.

One of the most recognizable aspects of this devotion is the Image of Divine Mercy. Jesus asked that an image be painted showing Him with two rays emanating from His heart—one pale, one red—symbolizing the water and blood that flowed from His pierced side on the Cross. Jesus is shown stepping toward the viewer, hand raised in blessing, as if walking out to meet us in our need. At the bottom are the words: "*Jesus, I trust in You.*" This image is not meant to be admired as art alone, but to be contemplated as a statement of faith. It invites a response: trust.

On Divine Mercy Sunday, the Church offers a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions. Indulgence is often

misunderstood. It does not forgive sins—that happens in Confession. Rather, an indulgence removes the **temporal punishment** due to sin, which remains even after sins are forgiven.

Think of it this way: forgiveness restores the relationship, but healing and repair still need to take place. An indulgence is a grace given by the Church, drawing from the treasury of Christ's merits, to help with that healing. To receive the plenary indulgence on Divine Mercy Sunday, the faithful are asked to:

1. Be in a state of grace (having gone to Confession, ideally close to the feast).
2. Receive Holy Communion.
3. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
4. Have complete detachment from sin.
5. Participate in prayers and devotions in honor of Divine Mercy—often the Chaplet of Divine Mercy—or at least make an act of trust before the Blessed Sacrament.

Extend an act of Mercy to another.

These requirements are not meant to be barriers, but invitations—ways of opening our hearts more fully to God's mercy.

Divine Mercy Sunday does not end at the church doors. Mercy received must become mercy given. The world does not need harsher judgment; it needs witnesses to compassion, patience, and forgiveness.

Trusting in Divine Mercy means forgiving when it is hard, showing patience when it is inconvenient, and refusing to believe that anyone—ourselves included—is beyond redemption. It means living by the simple but demanding prayer: *"Jesus, I trust in You."* The man who once doubted God's desire for him eventually returned to Confession, then to the Eucharist. His circumstances did not magically change—but his heart did. Mercy rarely erases the past, but it always redeems the future.

This Divine Mercy Sunday, may we encounter not a distant God, but a risen Savior who still bears His wounds—for us. And may we believe, deeply and truly, that mercy is not something we earn, but someone we meet.

Grief Hurts. When we've lost someone we love, it can feel as though we've lost a part of ourselves. Sometimes we wonder if we will ever feel whole again. The pain of grief can be emotional, spiritual and sometimes even physical. Some people cry a lot, others not at all, and many cry now and then. It is all normal, and it is all okay.

Feeling sad is a natural response to losing someone who was an important part of our life. Many people experience a lack of energy and sadness while grieving. Some describe being "in a fog" and finding it difficult to perform simple tasks. Some people want to be around their friends and family, and others prefer to be left alone. Grief looks different with each person who experiences it.

St. Andrew's offers a peer grief support group for persons who have experienced a loss. It can be very helpful to share your grief with others who understand and share your faith. Our faith is a great source of hope and comfort at a time of loss. We believe in Eternal Life and Christ's promise: "I am the Resurrection and the Life, he who believes in me, though he dies, yet he shall live." John 11:25




Diocesan Marian Pilgrimage
