**FROM THE PASTOR'S  
DESK...Lessons about  
Mercy**

I am not a person who repeats a homily two weeks in a row, but I received so many comments about last Sunday's Divine Mercy homily that I felt it should be shared for the benefit of those who attended a different Mass. Last week I shared the following story:

A true story is told of a Judge in New York City during the Great Depression. A poor, elderly woman stood before him, accused of stealing a loaf of bread. She explained that her daughter was sick, her husband had left, and her grandchildren were starving. The law was clear. Theft was theft.

The judge sighed and said, "The law makes no exception. I must fine you ten dollars or sentence you to ten days in jail." Then he did something unexpected. He took ten dollars out of his own pocket, paid the fine for her, and then turned to the courtroom and said, "Furthermore, I fine everyone in this courtroom fifty cents for living in a city where a grandmother has to steal bread to feed her grandchildren."

That day, the woman left not only forgiven but also embraced. Justice had been satisfied—but mercy had the final word.

Brothers and sisters, that is Divine Mercy: not the denial of justice, but love stepping in to pay the debt we could never afford.

Many of us know that feeling: mercy appearing quietly, unexpectedly, when we least expect it. That is the heart of today's Gospel.

On the road to Emmaus, two disciples walked away from Jerusalem, away from hope, away from everything they thought they understood. Jesus did not rebuke them. He did not confront them angrily. Instead, the risen Lord

walked with them, listened to their confusion, invited their questions, and gently opened the Scriptures until their hearts began to burn again. This is mercy in motion—mercy that meets people where they are, not where they "should" be.

It is no accident that this Gospel follows Divine Mercy Sunday. Mercy is not only something Jesus does once a year; it is the way He continually draws near to wounded hearts. Today's Gospel gives me the opportunity to provide a few lessons from what I call...The School of Mercy... lessons that help us to practice mercy in our daily lives.

First, Mercy Begins with Listening. Notice that Jesus asked a question: "What are you discussing as you walk along?" He already knew the answer, yet He invited them to speak. Mercy always begins by listening.

In our daily lives, we are often quick to fix, correct, or explain. But mercy asks us first to listen—to a spouse who is frustrated, a child who feels unseen, a friend who is struggling with faith. This week, practice mercy by letting someone finish their story without interrupting, offering advice, or changing the subject. Simply listen with presence and patience.

Second, Mercy Walks at Another's Pace. Jesus could have revealed Himself immediately. Instead, He chose the long road. He taught gradually, allowing understanding to unfold over time. That is profound mercy.

We live in a world addicted to immediacy—instant answers, fast solutions, and quick judgments. Yet mercy respects the pace of the heart. When we encounter someone who isn't "there yet"—spiritually, emotionally, morally—mercy walks with them rather than leaving them behind.

Ask yourself this week: Where might God be asking me to slow down and walk with someone rather than rush past them?

Third, Mercy Opens our Eyes through the Ordinary. The disciples finally recognized Jesus... not during the sermon, but in the breaking of the bread. An ordinary act became a sacred revelation. God's mercy often reveals itself not in

dramatic miracles, but in small, faithful moments: a family meal, a quiet prayer, an unexpected kindness, Sunday Eucharist. The Emmaus story reminds us that Christ is closest when we least expect Him.

A practical step for this week: pause before meals for slightly longer than usual. Say grace slowly. Be aware that Christ desires to be present at the table—not only the altar table, but your kitchen table as well.

Fourth, Mercy sends us Back Transformed. Did you notice that once the disciples recognized Jesus, they did not stay comfortably in Emmaus? They returned immediately to Jerusalem—to community, mission, and witness. Why? Because mercy never ends with the recipient, it always sends us outward.

Experiencing Christ's mercy is meant to change how we treat others: how we forgive, how we speak, and how we serve. Mercy makes us missionaries, not moral judges. This week, choose one intentional act of mercy:

- Reconcile with someone you've avoided.
- Offer patience instead of irritation.
- Pray for someone who has hurt you.
- Help quietly, without recognition.

Fifth, Keep your Heart Burning. At the end of the Gospel, the disciples asked, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He spoke to us on the way?" That burning heart is the sign that mercy was at work all along—even when they did not recognize it.

As we leave the School of Mercy this Third Sunday of Easter, the invitation before us is simple but demanding: do not let these lessons remain only words on a page or reflections heard at Mass. Choose one concrete way this week to walk the road of mercy—to listen more attentively, to slow your pace for another, to recognize Christ in the ordinary, or to return with renewed love to your family, parish, and community. Mercy grows when it is practiced. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, may we

allow our hearts to keep burning, our eyes to stay open, and our feet to move us outward, so that others may come to recognize the risen Lord through the mercy they experience in us.

### **Joseph's House Monthly Casserole Recipe**

Last month we collected 36 casseroles for Joseph's House! A big thank you to our volunteers! We appreciate your commitment to this ministry. In addition to casseroles, we will continue collecting individual snack bags for Joseph's House clients. The next drop off for casseroles will be **Thursday, April 30, 2026 from 10-11 AM**. Drive up to the parish hall and a volunteer will be there in the parking area. We will hand deliver to Joseph's House later in the day. Prepare one or more casseroles. All donations are deeply appreciated. We will continue to use the same recipe.

#### Hamburger Noodle Casserole

1 lb. hamburger	1 cup cottage cheese
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce	1 cup sour cream
1 medium chopped onion	12oz. egg noodles
1 cup of green pepper	2 cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated.

Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label "St. Andrew's- Hamburger Noodle Casserole."

Grief Hurts. When we've lost someone we love, it can feel as though we've lost a part of ourselves. Sometimes we wonder if we will ever feel whole again. The pain of grief can be emotional, spiritual and sometimes even physical. Some people cry a lot, others not at all, and many cry now and then. It is all normal, and it is all okay.

Feeling sad is a natural response to losing someone who was an important part of our life. Many people experience a lack of energy and sadness while grieving. Some describe being "in a fog" and finding it difficult to perform simple tasks. Some people want to be around their friends and family, and others prefer to be left alone. Grief looks different with each person who experiences it.

St. Andrew's offers a peer grief support group for persons who have experienced a loss. It can be very helpful to share your grief with others who understand and share your faith. Our faith is a great source of hope and comfort at a time of loss. We believe in Eternal Life and Christ's promise: "I am the Resurrection and the Life, he who believes in me, though he dies, yet he shall live." John 11:25
