FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
**Good Shepherd Sunday
and the Call of Vocation**

Several years ago, a teacher brought a group of students on a tour of a sheep farm. At one point, two different shepherds stood at opposite ends of the field and called out. The sheep did not hesitate or wander toward both voices. They lifted their heads, listened carefully—and then moved together toward the voice they knew. The teacher asked what made the difference. The farmer replied simply, “The sheep know the voice of the one who cares for them.”

That image helps us understand today's Gospel. On the Fourth Sunday of Easter, often called **Good Shepherd Sunday**, Jesus says: “I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly” (John 10:10). He speaks of Himself as the shepherd whose voice the sheep recognize and trust, in contrast to strangers who lead only toward confusion and harm.

This Sunday is also designated as the **World Day of Prayer for Vocations**, when the universal Church prays especially for vocations to the **priesthood and consecrated life**. The pairing is not accidental. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, continues His work in the world by calling people to follow Him in specific ways of life—not for their own fulfillment alone, but for the life of the world.

The word *vocation* comes from the Latin *vocare*, meaning “to call.” A vocation is not simply something we choose. It is something to which we are invited. Every baptized person has a vocation because every believer is called into a relationship with Christ and given a mission within the Church.

This is what distinguishes a vocation from a lifestyle or role. A vocation is **received, not invented**. It is shaped by prayer, discernment, and a growing attentiveness to the

Shepherd's voice.

The Church recognizes several primary vocations:

- **Priesthood**
- **Marriage**
- **Consecrated life**
- **Single life lived intentionally for God**

Each of these can exist merely as a human arrangement—or they can be lived as a response to God's call. The difference is profound.

When Life Is Lived as a Vocation it is lived in harmony with God. Marriage, lived simply as an arrangement for companionship or convenience, can easily become self-centered. But when we live it as a vocation, marriage becomes a **path of sanctification**, marked by sacrifice, fidelity, openness to life, and service to others.

Priesthood, reduced to a career or function, risks burnout or discouragement. But lived as a vocation, it becomes a life **poured out for the flock**, shaped by prayer, preaching, and the sacraments.

Consecrated life is not an escape from the world, but a visible sign that **Christ alone is enough**. When lived as a vocation, it points the entire Church toward heaven and reminds us of our ultimate destiny.

Even the single life, when lived without purpose, can drift into isolation. But when embraced as a vocation, it becomes a **mission of availability**, generosity, and service within the Body of Christ.

In every case, vocation is about **belonging before doing**—belonging to Christ, listening to His voice, and allowing Him to lead.

Jesus tells us that the shepherd “calls his own sheep by name and leads them out” (John 10:3). God's call is always personal. It is not loud or forceful. It does not override our freedom. Instead, it invites trust. To follow a vocation is not to have every detail of life mapped out, but to believe that the Good Shepherd leads toward life—sometimes through sacrifice, always toward love.

Today, the Church asks us to pray in a particular way—for those whom God is calling to the priesthood and consecrated life, and for the courage to respond. These vocations do not exist in isolation. When one person says “yes,” the entire Church is strengthened. Praying for vocations is also an opportunity to ask ourselves: *Am I listening for the Shepherd's voice in my own life? Am I encouraging others—especially young people (youth and young adults), to trust God's call?*

As we reflect on the Good Shepherd this Sunday, may we ask for hearts that listen, eyes that recognize Christ's leading, and a willingness to follow wherever He calls. Because when a life is lived as a vocation—whatever that vocation may be—it becomes exactly what Jesus promised: Not just a life that gets by, but a life lived abundantly.

Prayer for vocations, however, is never meant to remain abstract. The Church also invites us to foster a climate where questions can be asked, possibilities explored, and God's call taken seriously without pressure or fear. **Vocational discernment is not about having everything figured out, but about allowing space for the Good Shepherd's voice to be heard more clearly**—often through conversation, prayer, and accompaniment within the Church.

For anyone who has ever wondered whether their life might be offered in a particular way—as a **priest, deacon, consecrated religious, or consecrated virgin**—we offer you an open and respectful invitation to talk. If you would like to explore these questions, even informally, please feel free to contact **Msgr. Marucci** or **Father Infanti** at the parish office (856-784-3878). **Such conversations are not commitments, but opportunities to listen, reflect, and discern where the Lord may be leading.** Sometimes the first step in hearing the Shepherd's voice is simply having the courage to ask the right questions.

Remember, a vocation is a life lived in harmony with God, which leads to fulfillment in this world and the world to come.

Drive up to the parish hall and a volunteer will be there in the parking area. We will hand deliver to Joseph's House later in the day. Prepare one or more casseroles. All donations are deeply appreciated. We will continue to use the same recipe.

1 lb. hamburger	1 cup cottage cheese
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce	1 cup sour cream
1 medium chopped onion	12oz. egg noodles
1 cup of green pepper	2 cups shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

Hamburger Noodle Casserole

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack Cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated.
