FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
*Feast of the Ascension of
our Lord*

**“Why Are You Still Staring
at the Sky?”**

A few summers ago, I watched a group of children release balloons after a funeral. They stood quietly as the balloons lifted higher and higher, their heads tilted back, eyes fixed upward. At first, there was wonder.

Then there was silence. And after a while, something interesting happened: one child tugged at another's sleeve and said, “What do we do now?”

That simple question—*What do we do now?*—captures the tension of today's Feast of the Ascension. The disciples knew that feeling well. They had spent years walking with Jesus: listening to His voice, watching Him heal, relying on His presence. And then, suddenly, He was gone from their sight. Their instinct was to stare upward, holding onto the moment, as if looking long enough might bring Him back. But heaven interrupts them with a gentle challenge: *Why are you standing here looking at the sky?*

The Ascension is not about Jesus leaving us behind. It is about Jesus entrusting us with His mission. In the First Reading from Acts, Jesus is taken up, and the disciples are left standing in between—between what has been and what is yet to come. They are promised the Spirit, but not yet. They are assured of hope but are not given a timeline. This in between space is deeply human. We live there often—between grief and healing, between prayer and answer, between Easter joy and everyday responsibility.

Matthew's Gospel picks up that tension beautifully. The risen Jesus gathers His disciples on a mountain. Some worship. Some doubt. Both are present. And it is *there*—in the mix of faith and uncertainty—that Jesus gives them their marching orders: **go, make disciples, baptize, teach, live what you have received.** He assures them that although He will no longer be seen, **He will always be pre-**

sent.

This is one of the most misunderstood moments in Christian life. The Ascension is often imagined as Jesus going “up” so that we're left “down.” In truth, **Jesus ascends so that He can be present everywhere.** His physical departure opens the way for a deeper spiritual closeness. He is no longer limited to one place, one time, one group—but available to all who call upon His name. **That realization changes everything.**

Faith is not about standing still and staring heavenward. **Faith is about moving forward with heaven in our hearts.** The disciples were not called to build tents on that mountain. **They were called to bring the Gospel off the mountain and into the streets, homes, workplaces, and communities of the world.** And so are we.

The Ascension asks us uncomfortable questions: Have we mistaken faith for comfort? Have we confused waiting with doing nothing? **Are we gazing upward when Christ is calling us outward?**

The Good News today is both a **commission** and a **promise.** **Jesus commissions us to go**—into our families, our neighborhoods, our parish ministries, our conversations. And He **promises** that we will never go alone. His presence is not diminished; it is multiplied through us.

So, what does that look like practically? First, it means **living intentionally as witnesses.** Evangelization does not begin with arguments or pamphlets; it begins with kindness, patience, integrity, and mercy. The way we speak, forgive, listen, and love tells the world whether we believe Christ is truly alive.

Second, it means **trusting the Spirit in our uncertainty.** The disciples did not have all the answers when they left that mountain. Neither do we. But faith is not knowing every step—it is trusting the One who walks with us. Moments of doubt are not failures; they are invitations to deeper dependence on God.

Third, it means **bringing heaven into everyday life.** When we pray before difficult conversations, when we serve

Finally, it means **refusing to stand still**. Christianity is not a spectator sport. The Risen Lord sends us into action—not frantic busyness, but purposeful love. The question for us today is not, *Is Jesus with me?* The Ascension assures us that He is. The real question is, *where is Jesus sending me next?*

The disciples eventually stopped looking at the sky—and the world was changed because they did. **So, as we celebrate the Ascension, may we lift our eyes long enough to remember who Christ is—and then lower them just enough to see where He is asking us to go.** Because heaven was never meant to keep our heads in the clouds; it was meant to set our feet firmly on the path of love.

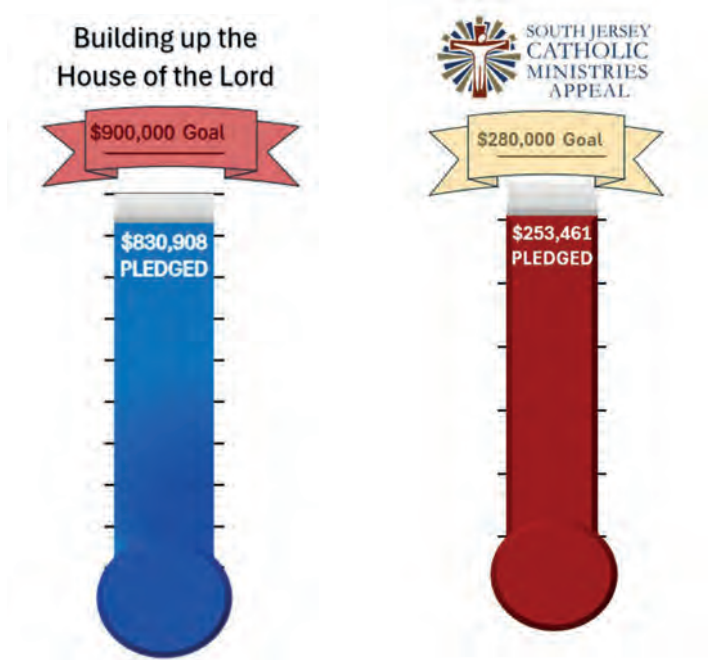


Capital Campaign / SJCMA Update

Men's Prayer Group

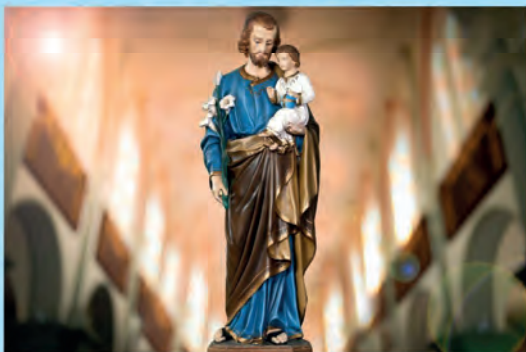

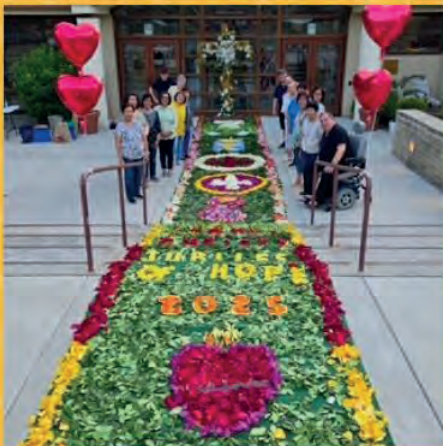
