**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:**  
*Pentecost*

During my last visit to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, the pilgrims and I arrived just as the morning doors opened. The scent of incense lingered in the air, the stones were worn smoothly by centuries of prayer, and the silence was almost heavy. Yet this was not the silence

of a tomb. It was the silence of expectation. Something had happened here—and, in a profound way, it was still happening. That is the mystery the Church celebrates at Pentecost.

That same sense of expectation surfaced closer to home only a few weeks ago, following the recent Chrism Mass in our diocese and the Good Friday Passion Service in our parish. After the final hymn and procession, as priests, deacons, and liturgical ministers exited the church, a woman approached me and asked, quietly and sincerely: “Monsignor, may I ask you a question? My husband and I saw the men and women dressed in long black-and-white capes, wearing black veils, and berets during the service. They were sitting together, they processed in and out of the church together, and we were wondering, “Who are they? What do they do? Why are they here?”

It was a simple question, but an important one. The people she noticed were members of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem—Knights and Dames of the Church—whose visible presence so often prompts curiosity at diocesan and parish celebrations. Their distinctive capes, berets, and mantillas (veils) are not meant to draw attention to themselves, yet they inevitably do. That moment after those celebrations also, in my opinion, provided its own quiet Pentecost: an opportunity to explain not only who these men and women are, but also why their mission matters to the whole Church.

For Knights and Dames of the Holy Sepulchre, Pentecost is not simply a feast marking the close of the Easter season. It is the fulfillment of everything that began on Calvary and burst forth from the Empty Tomb. When Jesus took His final breath on the Cross, He surrendered His Spirit to the Father. On Pentecost, that same Spirit is poured out upon the Church, returning life, courage, and purpose to Christ’s followers—and sending them forth into the world.

Pentecost teaches us that the Cross and Resurrection were never meant to remain events trapped in the past. Through the Holy Spirit, Christ’s saving work becomes present, active, and life giving in every age. The Spirit makes reconciliation possible—not only between heaven and earth, but within our own divided hearts, our families, and our communities. This is the heart of the Christian vocation, and, in a particular way, the vocation embraced by the Knights and Dames of the Holy Sepulchre.

The Order is often associated with a place—the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem, but its mission is far more than guarding a sacred site. The Holy Sepulchre is not a monument to death; it is the birthplace of new life. What happened in Jerusalem is entrusted to the Church and carried to the ends of the earth by the power of the Spirit. The Knights and Dames are charged with keeping that mystery alive through prayerful witness and concrete service.

Their service is directed especially toward the Church of Jerusalem and the Christian communities of the Holy Land, many of whom struggle to survive amid political instability, economic hardship, and emigration. Supporting peace, charity, education, and coexistence is not merely a philanthropic effort; it is cooperation with the work of the Holy Spirit, who alone can turn sacrifice into communion and charity into hope.

Very often, this work does not attract attention—much like the quiet transformation of Pentecost itself. It begins with **prayer** offered faithfully, **charity** given generously, and **perseverance** shown when progress appears slowly. These small acts, entrusted to the Spirit, gradually shape hearts and open paths that only God can see.

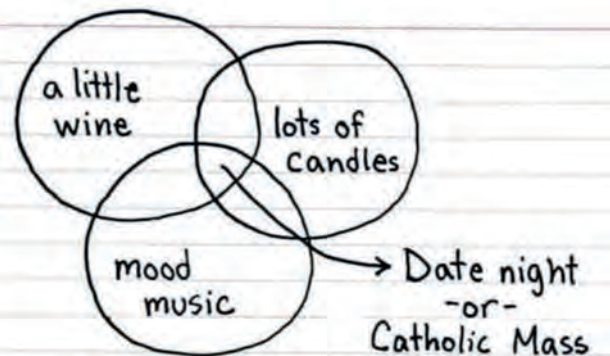
Yet there is also a deep personal challenge here. Pentecost calls every Knight and Dame—and indeed every baptized Christian—to ongoing conversion. The Spirit invites us to live reconciliation daily: in our speech, our decisions, and our willingness to forgive. To *sentire cum Ecclesia*—to **think and live with the Church**—is to allow the Spirit to shape our hearts after the heart of the Risen Christ.

So, when the fragrance of incense mingles with the sight of black and white capes at a diocesan or parish celebration, it is worth remembering what they signify. They point not to themselves, but to the Empty Tomb. And if the Spirit truly lives within us, then the quiet fragrance of that Empty Tomb should follow us wherever we go—into our parishes, our families, and our world.

If a parishioner is interested in being considered for nomination for this Papal Order in the church, please contact me at the parish office. The Knights and Dames are appointed directly by Pope Leo, and installed at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. Investiture in the Order is one of the highest honors bestowed upon the laity and clergy in the church today. But please always remember that the attire of the Knights and Dames is never worn to point to themselves, but to support the Christian movement in the Holy Land and the charitable works directed by the Holy Spirit in support of the Pastoral needs of the Latin Patriarch. | 1 lb. hamburger                | 1 cup cottage cheese                 |
| 15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce | 1 cup sour cream                     |
| 1 medium chopped onion         | 12oz. egg noodles                    |
| 1 cup of green pepper          | 2 cups shredded Monterey Jack Cheese |

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack Cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label “St. Andrew’s- Hamburger Noodle Casserole.”
