**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:  
The Feast of the Holy Trinity**

A hospital chaplain once told of visiting a man who was nearing the end of his life. The man had little strength left and could no longer manage long prayers. He simply held a small crucifix in one hand and, every so often, whispered, "Father... Son... Holy Spirit." When the chaplain asked why those words meant so much to him, the man said, "At this point, I do not need to understand everything. I just need to know whose hands I am in." That simple confession says more than many complicated explanations. The mystery of the Holy Trinity is far beyond our ability to fully explain, yet it is also closer to us than our own breath. We may never define God completely, but we can know that we live each day held in the love of the Father, saved by the Son, and strengthened by the Holy Spirit.

On this Feast of the Holy Trinity, the Church invites us not to solve a puzzle, but to enter a relationship. The Trinity is not a riddle meant to frustrate us; it is the deepest truth about who God is. God is not solitary or distant. God is communion: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16-18). In those familiar words, we hear the movement of divine love. The Father gives. The Son is sent. The Spirit, though not named explicitly in that verse, is the One poured into our hearts so that we may believe, receive, and live that love. Salvation begins not with our effort, but with God's overflowing love.

Saint Paul's closing blessing in 2 Corinthians 13:11-13 makes this mystery beautifully practical: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." Notice how personal and immediate that is. Paul does not present the Trinity

as an abstract doctrine reserved for scholars. He shows us how the Trinity touches daily Christian life. We live by the grace of Jesus Christ, who redeems and strengthens us. We rest in the love of God the Father, who created us and never stops seeking us. We are sustained by the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, who unites, consoles, and guides the Church. The Trinity is not far away in heaven; the Trinity is the pattern and source of Christian life here and now.

Throughout the centuries, saints have tried to help us glimpse this mystery. Saint Patrick is often remembered for using the shamrock: three leaves, yet one plant. It is a simple image, and while every comparison falls short, it helps us see how distinction can occur without division. Saint Cyril used the image of the sun: the blazing sun itself, its light, and its warmth. They are distinct, yet they belong together and cannot be separated. Saint Ignatius of Loyola described the Trinity as something like three musical notes forming one harmonious chord. Each note has its own sound, yet together they make one beautiful harmony. These saints did not claim to capture the Trinity in its entirety. Rather, they offered windows into a *mystery* too bright for any one image to contain.

There is a famous story about Saint Augustine walking along the seashore while trying to understand the Trinity. He saw a child attempting to pour the ocean into a small hole in the sand. Augustine said it could not be done, and the child replied that neither could the human mind contain the vast mystery of God. Whether told as legend or lesson, the point is clear: the Trinity is not small enough to fit inside our explanations. Yet that does not mean we know nothing. We know what has been revealed. We know the Father has sent the Son. We know the Son has saved the world, not condemned it. We know the Holy Spirit draws us into communion with God and with one another. Mystery, in the Christian sense, does not mean darkness; it means a reality so rich that we can spend our whole lives entering it.

So how do we incorporate the Trinity into our own lives? Perhaps these three suggestions might be helpful. First, we begin in the simplest and most Catholic way: by **making the Sign of the Cross slowly and reverently**. Too

**making the Sign of the Cross slowly and reverently.** Too often, we do it quickly, almost without thinking. But every time we say, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," we are placing our whole life inside the life of God. Second, we can also **pray to the Trinity in a very personal way:** thanking the Father for His providence, speaking to Jesus about our burdens and our hopes, and asking the Holy Spirit each day for wisdom, courage, and peace. Even a few quiet moments in the morning can become a Trinitarian prayer: "**Father, guide me; Jesus, stay with me; Holy Spirit, strengthen me.**" Third, we can also live the Trinity by **putting our prayer into action.** Make a commitment to **love** as the Father loves, by **giving ourselves** as Christ gave Himself, and by **fostering unity** through the Holy Spirit. In the home, this means practicing patience, forgiveness, and prayer together. In the parish, it means resisting division, encouraging one another, and building real communion. In the world, it means seeing every person as someone loved by the Father, someone for whom Christ died, and someone whom the Holy Spirit desires to sanctify.

If we want to grow as disciples, then we must let that Trinitarian love shape our prayer, our families, our parish, and our daily decisions. Let us believe in the Son who was given for us, trust the Father who never ceases to love us, and welcome the Holy Spirit who makes us one. Then our lives will become more than busy routines; they will become living reflections of the God we worship. And **may this be our prayer and our mission: to live so deeply in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, that the world may see in us the radiant love of the Blessed Trinity.**




**Men’s Prayer Group**
