**From the Pastor's Desk:
Happy Father's Day**

A father once told his son, just before dropping him off for his first job, "Be honest, work hard, and remember whose you are." Years later, the son said that the advice stayed with him far more than any lecture. In a few simple words, his father had given him more than instruction; he had given him a way to live. That is part of the beauty of fatherhood. A good father does more than provide. He forms a conscience, steadies a heart, and helps a child learn how to walk through the world with courage and integrity.

On this 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Church gives us a Gospel that is more than instruction; it teaches us how to live. In Matthew 10:26-33, Jesus speaks plainly to His disciples about fear. He knows that belonging to Him will sometimes bring misunderstanding, resistance, or even rejection. Yet three times in this brief passage the Lord says, in one way or another, "Do not be afraid." He reminds His followers that nothing is hidden from God, that even the sparrows are under the Father's care, and that each of us is worth far more than many sparrows. It is fitting, then, that this same Sunday is also Father's Day, for it gives us a beautiful opportunity to reflect on the vocation of fatherhood through the lens of the Gospel.

Fatherhood is, in the most obvious sense, biological. We give thanks for fathers who welcome life, sacrifice for their children, work hard, protect their families, and hand on faith and virtue. But the Christian understanding of fatherhood is broader than biology alone. A father is not simply a man who helps bring a child into the world. In the fullest sense, he is a man who accepts responsibility for the life entrusted to him. He steadies, protects, forms, corrects, encourages, and remains present. For that reason, we also honor *adoptive fathers, stepfathers, grandfathers, godfathers, foster fathers, guardians, teachers, coaches, mentors, priests*, and all men who exercise genu-

ine fatherly care. **Whenever a man helps a child grow in wisdom, strength, responsibility, and faith, he shares in something of the fatherhood of God.**

That is why today's Gospel matters so much. Jesus tells His disciples not to live in fear, not to hide the truth, and not to forget their worth in the eyes of the Father. These words are not only for apostles; they also offer a pattern for fatherhood. Every true fatherly figure is called to resist the culture of fear. It is easy to be passive. It is easy to say nothing. It is easy to leave the serious work of moral formation to schools, screens, peers, or the surrounding culture. But **fatherhood requires courage**: to **speak** what is true, to **model** what is right, and to **stand firm** when doing so is inconvenient or unpopular. Children do not need perfection from the men who guide them. They need honesty, stability, discipline, affection, and the witness of a life seeking to belong to God.

Fatherhood is not measured only by success, achievement, or visible results. Some fathers carry heavy burdens: estranged relationships, financial pressure, long work hours, blended family struggles, grief, guilt over past mistakes, or the pain of feeling inadequate. Today's Gospel offers them consolation. Jesus does not say, "Do not be afraid because you will always get everything right." He says, in effect, "Do not be afraid because the Father knows you, sees you, and cares for you." That is a word of hope for every man who is trying, however imperfectly, to be faithful in a fatherly role. **The Lord does not ask for performance. He asks for fidelity**: to show up, to begin again, to ask for forgiveness when needed, and to keep loving with patience and courage.

Many of us can still hear the simple wisdom of our fathers or fatherly figures: "Tell the truth, even when it costs you." "Finish what you start." "Own your mistakes." "Take care of your family." "Say your prayers." "Do the right thing, even when no one is watching." Such advice may sound ordinary, but it carries lasting power. These are lessons that shape character, strengthen families, and quietly prepare a child to live with responsibility and faith. This Father's Day, rather than reducing the day to cards, cookouts, or neckties, we might use it to strengthen the bonds that matter most. **Families** can begin by praying for

Fathers and fatherly figures by name—living and deceased, present and absent, biological and spiritual. **Children** can express gratitude not only for what a father provides materially, but also for the habits of love he tries to teach: perseverance, honesty, reverence, responsibility, and trust in God. **Spouses** can affirm one another in the demanding work of parenting. **Adult children** might make a phone call, write a thoughtful note, or offer forgiveness where old wounds remain. **In some homes, Father's Day will be joyful; in others, it will be bittersweet.** Even there, grace can enter when those wounds are brought honestly to the Lord.

I offer a **special message to those for whom Father's Day brings deep sorrow.** Some are carrying the unbearable grief of a child who died too soon. Others are facing this day for the first time without their own father. If that is your burden, know that the Church does not overlook your pain, and the Lord does not stand far from it. The God who counts every sparrow that falls surely holds your tears as well. Grief can make a day like this feel especially heavy and lonely, but you do not have to carry that sorrow alone. Bring the name of your son, your daughter, or your father to the altar. Speak it in prayer. Entrust your loss to the tender mercy of God. **Love does not end with death, and those we have loved in faith remain held in the heart of the Father.** May the Lord give you strength for this day, gentle companions for the road, and the quiet assurance that your love, though wounded, is still holy and still alive.

In the end, **the vocation of fatherhood reflects something essential about God Himself.** A fatherly man is called to help another person feel safe enough to grow, loved enough to try again, and guided enough to walk in the truth. That is the reassurance Jesus gives in today's Gospel: you are known, you are loved, and you need not live in fear. On this Father's Day, may we thank God for all those men who have exercised true fatherly care. May every father and father-figure hear the Lord's encouragement anew: do not be afraid. Your hidden sacrifices are seen by the Father in heaven, and your faithful love has eternal value.

Hamburger Noodle Casserole

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack Cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label "St. Andrew's- Hamburger Noodle Casserole."
