**FROM THE PASTOR'S
DESK...Feast of Saints Peter
and Paul**

Imagine standing at the edge of a harbor just before sunrise. One boat is weathered from years of hard work on the water. Another vessel, built for long travel, is ready to cross great distances. Both are different in design, purpose, and movement, yet

both are needed if the mission is to be fulfilled. That image can help us enter the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul. Peter is the fisherman, steady and often tested, called to anchor the Church in faith. Paul is the traveler, brilliant and bold, sent far and wide to carry the Gospel to the nations. They were very different men, with different backgrounds, different temperaments, and different missions.

The readings for this feast on Sunday bring Peter into especially sharp focus. In Acts 12:1-11, Peter is in prison, bound with chains and guarded by soldiers. Herod intends to make an example of him, just as James had already been killed. Yet the Church is praying for Peter, and the Lord sends an angel to lead him out of captivity. The scene is dramatic but also deeply consoling. Peter is not saved by his own strength. He is delivered by God's power through the prayers of the Church. The reading reminds us that Peter's ministry was never about personal greatness. It was about the Lord sustaining the one He had chosen. Peter's leadership in the Church came not because he was flawless, but because Jesus called him, strengthened him, and remained faithful to him.

That calling is made explicit in the Gospel, Matthew 16:13-19. Jesus asks the disciples a question that every age must answer: "Who do you say that I am?" Peter responds with the confession that stands at the center of Christian faith: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus then gives Peter a unique role: "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church." The image of the keys speaks of authority, responsibility, and ser-

vice. Peter is entrusted with a ministry of strengthening the brethren and helping to hold the Church together in truth and communion. Even now, the Church benefits from that first-century gift in the ministry of the pope, the successor of Peter, who serves as a sign of unity and a guardian of apostolic faith.

Although this year's readings focus more directly on Peter, the feast also honors Paul, because the Church has always seen these two apostles together. Peter represents the pastoral, stabilizing office of the Church. Paul represents the missionary, outward-moving energy of the Gospel. Peter was a Galilean fisherman, impulsive, courageous, and at times fragile. Paul was educated, intellectually sharp, and relentless in evangelization after his conversion. Peter knew Jesus during his earthly ministry and learned discipleship slowly, sometimes painfully. Paul encountered the risen Christ in a life-changing way and became the great apostle to the Gentiles. Peter helped preserve unity. Paul helped extend the Church's reach. Peter stands for the Church gathered. Paul stands for the Church sent.

The Church still benefits from their ministry in countless ways. From Peter we receive the gift of visible unity, apostolic leadership, and the assurance that Christ does not abandon his Church. From Paul we receive the great missionary vision that the Gospel is meant for all people, in every land and culture. From both apostles, we receive the witness of lives transformed by grace. Neither man was naturally perfect material for sainthood. Peter denied the Lord. Paul persecuted the Church. How would you like to have those claims on your resume? Yet, both were remade by mercy. That is one of the most hopeful lessons of this feast: holiness begins not in human perfection, but in surrender to Jesus Christ.

Their example has a practical claim on our lives today. Peter and Paul invite us to ask two questions. First: Is my faith rooted in a personal confession of Jesus, like Peter's? It is not enough to inherit the faith culturally or admire it from a distance. Each of us must answer the Lord's question: "Who do you say that I am?" Second: Is my faith being shared, like Paul's? A mature Catholic life is never closed in on itself. It moves outward in witness, charity,

and evangelization. Some are called to be more like Peter in their vocation, strengthening family life, parish life, and the bonds of communion. Others are called to be more like Paul, bringing Christ into places where he is forgotten or unknown. Most of us, in some measure, are called to both. We must be rooted and missionary, faithful and courageous, steady and generous.

On this feast, the Church does not simply ask us to admire two heroes from long ago. She asks us to receive the same grace that formed them. In a time when faith can seem fragile and the world can feel uncertain, Peter and Paul remind us that Christ still calls, still strengthens, and still sends. The same Lord who opened Peter's prison door and who entrusted him with the keys is the same Lord who also changed Paul's heart and sent him to the ends of the earth. Their witness assures us that the Church is upheld not by human talent alone, but by the power of God working through ordinary people who say yes. May Saints Peter and Paul pray for us, that we may confess Christ with conviction, love the Church with fidelity, and carry the Gospel into the world with joy.
