FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
Declarations of Dependence & Independence.

On the night of Paul Revere's famous ride, church bells, hoofbeats, and urgent voices cut through the darkness of a frightened land. Homes were quiet, but hearts were awake. Farmers, merchants, and fathers rose from their beds because

liberty was being threatened, and they believed some truths were worth sacrificing for. In those uncertain hours, ordinary people risked comfort, safety, and even their lives for the hope that they might one day govern themselves in freedom. Independence did not arrive wrapped in ease. It was born in courage, sharpened by conviction, and sustained by responsibility. That is why every Independence Day weekend is more than fireworks and flags. It is a reminder that freedom is never merely enjoyed; it must be honored, guarded, and rightly ordered.

For Christians, this holiday gives us an opportunity to reflect on a deeper truth: **we live as citizens of two kingdoms.** We belong to the **kingdom of man**—our earthly nation, community, and civil society. But even more fundamentally, we belong to the **Kingdom of God.** Jesus told us to “render to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God.” In that one sentence, our Lord acknowledged both dimensions of our lives. We are people with earthly duties and heavenly identity. We salute the flag, obey just laws, contribute to the common good, and pray for our nation. Yet above every national anthem, every constitution, and every political allegiance stands the voice of Christ the King, who claims not merely our vote or our opinion, but our whole heart.

In civil society, we might say that Americans cherish the **Declaration of Independence.** As a people, we give thanks for the bold conviction that human beings should not live under tyranny, and that governments are meant

to serve justice, protect dignity, and defend liberty. Therefore, our responsibilities in the kingdom of man are serious. We are called to be honest citizens, to obey just laws, to pay what we owe, to serve our neighbors, to defend the vulnerable, to work for peace, and to participate responsibly in public life. Patriotism at its best is not blind nationalism; it is grateful stewardship. It means loving one's country enough to seek its moral health, not merely its comfort or success.

There are also consequences when we violate our duties in the earthly kingdom. When citizens become selfish, dishonest, lawless, indifferent, or cruel, society begins to erode. Freedom weakens when virtue weakens. A nation cannot remain stable if truth is mocked, justice is not bought, families are neglected, and the weak are forgotten. Civil penalties may follow wrongdoings, punishment, public disorder, and social distrust. But the deeper consequence is cultural decay. People may keep their symbols of liberty while slowly losing the character needed to sustain liberty itself. History teaches us that nations rarely collapse all at once; they unravel when citizens forget that rights are joined to responsibilities.

And yet, as important as these duties are, our discipleship leads us to something even greater: what we might call a **Declaration of Dependence.** The Christian does not stand before God boasting self-rule. We kneel before Him, confessing that every breath, every blessing, and every hope comes from His hand. In the Kingdom of God, our responsibilities are clear. We are to worship the Lord faithfully, repent of sin, love our enemies, forgive as we have been forgiven, protect the sanctity of life, serve the poor, seek holiness, proclaim the Gospel, and build up the Body of Christ. We are called not just to admire Jesus, but to **obey** Him. The Kingdom of God is not maintained by force, slogans, or campaigns, but by grace, truth, sacrifice, and holiness.

There are consequences when we neglect our duties in God's Kingdom as well. Sin wounds the soul. It harms families, weakens the Church's witness, and darkens the conscience. When we ignore God's commands, we may still appear outwardly successful, but inwardly we become divided, restless, and spiritually poor. Communities

disappears, when justice is ignored, and when faith is reduced to a private sentiment instead of a living commitment. The consequence of unfaithfulness in God's Kingdom is not merely the breaking of a rule; it is the damaging of a relationship with the One who made us for Himself. To refuse His reign is to wander from the source of truth, mercy, and life.

Something that contradicts the law of God? The Church's answer has always been clear: **we must choose the Kingdom of God first.** Why? **Because every earthly nation is temporary, but the Kingdom of God is eternal.** Every government is limited, but Christ's authority is absolute. Every constitution, however noble, is written by human hands; the law of God is written in truth everlasting. Earthly rulers deserve respect, but only God deserves worship. The state can regulate conduct, but only Christ can save the human person. If ever we must choose between popularity and faithfulness, between legal permission and moral truth, between national pressure and divine command, the disciple must stand with God. The apostles said it simply: **"We must obey God rather than men."**

This does not make Christians bad citizens. On the contrary, it makes us the best kind. Those who honor God first are better equipped to serve their country with integrity, humility, and courage. We do not love our nation less by loving God more; we love our nation rightly when we place it beneath the judgment and mercy of God. **Independence Day reminds us to be grateful for liberty. The Gospel reminds us what liberty is for:** not self-indulgence, but the freedom to choose the good, to serve the truth, and to belong wholly to the Lord.

May the Eucharist we receive give us the strength and grace to live as responsible citizens of both Kingdoms. Thy Kingdom come, Thy Will be done, on earth, as it is in heaven.
