FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
15TH Sunday of OT

A family once found itself slowly coming apart, not because of one terrible event, but because of a hundred small choices that had gone unnoticed. Dinner had become something each person grabbed alone. The children carried the weight of school, sports, and screens into every

room. The parents were exhausted, speaking mostly about schedules, bills, and problems. Sunday Mass was still on the calendar, but faith had become another item to fit in rather than the center that held them together. Arguments grew sharper. Silence grew longer. Everyone lived under the same roof, but the home no longer felt like a place of peace.

Then, after one particularly painful evening, the parents made a conscious decision. Recognizing there was no longer Joy in their marriage or home, they reached out for help. I asked them one simple question...Why do you leave God out of the marriage? I reminded them that on their wedding day they made a Vow to keep God at the center of their new family. I asked why they stopped going to church, praying before meals, eating together as a family, and keeping the Lord's Day holy.

They could not change everything at once, but they agreed to begin tending the soil of their family life. They protected one meal a week, phone-free. They prayed together, even awkwardly at first. They apologized more quickly. They returned to Sunday Mass with intention. Little by little, the atmosphere changed. The family was not perfect, but grace began to breathe again in their home, and the love and joy they feared were lost, found room to take root once more.

On this 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle A, Jesus gives us the Parable of the Sower in Matthew 13:1-23. He sits in a boat while the crowd stands along the shore, and He

speaks of a farmer who scatters seed with great generosity. Some seeds fall on the path and are eaten by birds. Some fall on rocky ground, spring up quickly, but wither because they have no roots. Some fall among thorns and are choked. Some fall on rich soil and produce fruit—thirty, sixty, or a hundredfold. Jesus later explains **that the seed is the word of the Kingdom, and the soils represent the different conditions of the human heart.**

The first surprise in this Gospel is **the generosity of the Sower**. He does not carefully place seed only where success seems guaranteed. He scatters broadly, even wastefully. This reveals the heart of God. God's word is offered not only to the prepared, the holy, or the attentive, but to everyone. Grace is never stingy. God continues to speak in Scripture, in the Mass, in prayer, in the quiet movements of conscience, in the needs of the poor, and in the love and struggles of family life. The question is not whether God is sowing. **The question is what kind of soil we are becoming.**

The path represents a heart that has become hardened. Perhaps disappointment, routine, distraction, or sin has packed the soil down so tightly that the word cannot sink in. We may hear the Gospel at Mass, but never let it question our priorities. We may listen but not truly receive. **Families can experience this when faith becomes only a Sunday obligation and not a living conversation at home.** The remedy is humility: asking God to break open the hard places in us and help us listen again.

The rocky ground is the heart that receives the word **with enthusiasm but has no depth**. Faith begins joyfully, but when hardship comes—illness, conflict, grief, disappointment, or pressure from others—it fades. Jesus is honest: discipleship needs roots. A family builds roots through regular prayer, forgiveness, participation in the sacraments, and small acts of sacrifice. Children especially learn that faith is real, not when everything is easy, but when parents and grandparents turn to God in difficulty, speak with trust, and keep loving when life is demanding.

The thorns are especially familiar. Jesus names them as **worldly anxiety and the lure of riches. The word is not rejected; it is crowded out.** Many families know this

struggle. Schedules are full, phones are always nearby, bills create worry, activities multiply, and the desire to provide can slowly turn into a desire to possess more. Thorns are not always bad things; often, they are good things that have grown out of proportion. To clear the thorns, a family may need to protect Sunday Mass, eat together without devices, pray before decisions, practice generosity, and ask regularly: **"Is this helping our family grow closer to God and to one another?"**

Finally, the **rich soil** is the person who hears the word and understands it. In the biblical sense, understanding is more than knowing facts; it means allowing the word to take root and **change how we live**. Rich soil is cultivated. No garden becomes fruitful by accident, and no Christian family becomes holy by accident. **Families become good soil through simple, repeated choices:** reading the Sunday Gospel before Mass, asking each person what word or phrase touched them, blessing children before bedtime, praying a decade of the Rosary in the car, apologizing quickly, forgiving sincerely, serving someone in need, and speaking about God as naturally as we speak about school, work, sports, and plans.

Parents do not need to be theologians to sow the seed of faith. They need to be faithful witnesses. A child who sees a parent pray, learns that God is real. A teenager who sees forgiveness after an argument, learns that mercy is stronger than pride. A spouse who chooses patience, plants seeds of peace. Grandparents who tell stories of answered prayers and persevering faith pass on deep roots. Even single people, widows, widowers, and extended family members help cultivate the parish family by encouraging younger generations, welcoming neighbors, and bearing fruit through steady love.

This week, the Gospel invites each of us to examine the soil of our hearts and the soil of our homes. Where have we become hardened? Where are our roots too shallow? What thorns need to be pulled? And where is God already producing fruit? The good news is that the divine Sower has not given up on any of us. He is still scattering His Word with patience and hope. If we welcome that Word, tend it daily, and allow it to reshape our families, then our homes can become gardens of grace—places

where faith takes root, love grows strong, and the harvest of God's Kingdom begins to appear in ordinary life.

If you are reading this article and sense that it describes your family home in some way, do not dismiss that as a coincidence. **Perhaps it is the Lord gently placing a seed in your heart today, inviting you not to give up, but to begin again.** Ask Him what needs to be softened, what needs to be uprooted, what needs to be forgiven, and what needs to be restored. **What is one small, faithful step you can take this week to begin tending the soil of your family life?** With God's grace, even a weary home can become rich soil again—a place where faith is renewed, love is healed, joy returns, and the Kingdom of God begins to grow.

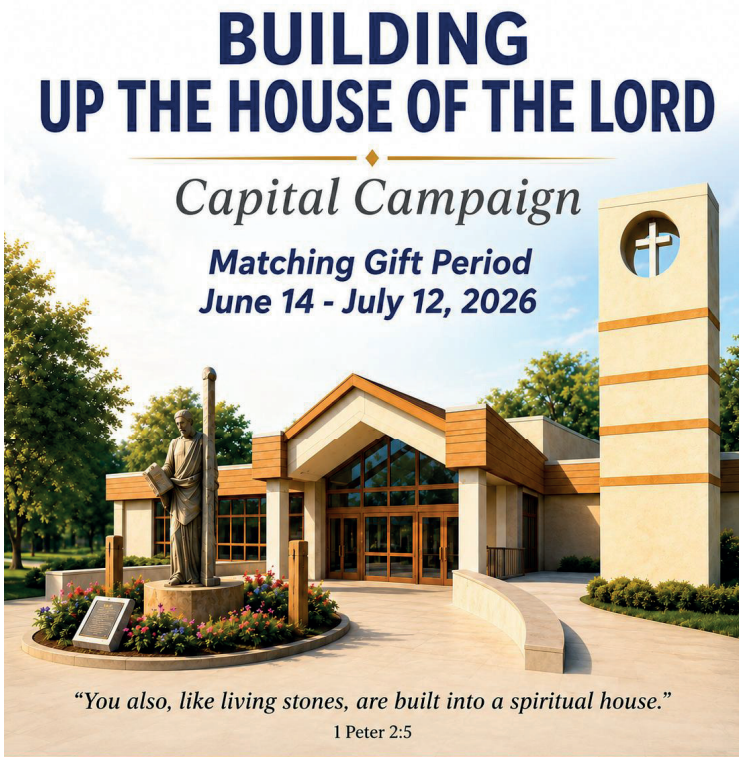

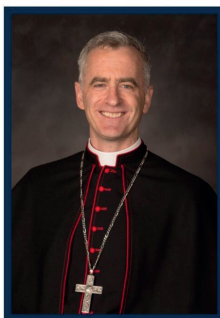

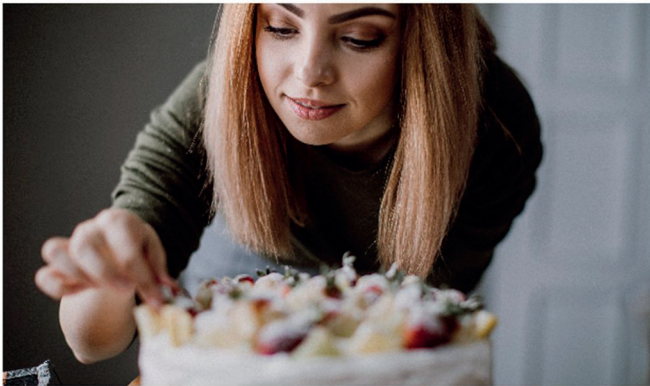


7 Summer Ideas for Catholic Families
