FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
17TH Sunday of OT
(World Day of Prayer for
Grandparents and older
persons)

Not long ago, I heard a story about a young man who visited his grandmother every Sunday afternoon. At first, he went out of duty. She was frail, moved slowly, and repeated the same

stories again and again. But one afternoon, as she held an old rosary in her hands, she began telling him how she had prayed through war, illness, family disappointments, and the death of people she loved. She did not speak with bitterness. She spoke with peace. Then she looked at him and said, "I have not always had much, but I have always had God." That young man later said, "I thought I was visiting someone who needed me. I discovered I was sitting beside a treasure."

This Sunday, the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle A, Jesus gives us three brief but powerful images of the Kingdom of Heaven. The Kingdom is like a treasure buried in a field. It is like a pearl of great price. It is like a net cast into the sea, gathering fish of every kind. In each image, Jesus invites us to recognize what is truly valuable, to choose wisely, and to give our hearts to what lasts. How fitting that this Gospel falls on the World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly. The Church asks us to look again at the older persons among us, not as burdens, interruptions, or reminders of weakness, but as living treasures. Their lives are often fields in which hidden grace has been buried by years of sacrifice, perseverance, prayer, and love. Their memories are pearls formed slowly, sometimes through suffering, sometimes through joy, always through time. Their presence reminds us that the Kingdom of Heaven is not measured by speed, productivity, beauty, or usefulness, but by faithfulness, wisdom, mercy, and love.

In Matthew's Gospel, the person who finds the treasure

sells everything with joy. The merchant who discovers the pearl of great price does the same. Jesus is not describing reluctant sacrifice. He is describing joyful recognition. When we know what something is worth, we do not resent rearranging our lives around it. That is a challenge for our families, our parish, and our society. Do we recognize the worth of our grandparents and elderly neighbors? Do we make room for them? Do we listen to them? Do we protect them from loneliness? Do we allow them to continue giving the gifts only they can give?

The theme for the 2026 World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly is "I will never forget you," taken from Isaiah. It is a word of consolation for those who feel unseen and a word of examination for the rest of us. God does not forget the elderly. Therefore, neither can the Church. Neither can families. Neither can communities that call themselves Christian.

Many older persons carry quiet crosses. Some live alone. Some have lost spouses, siblings, friends, mobility, hearing, independence, or confidence. Some sit in pews with deep faith but heavy hearts. Others can no longer come to church and wonder whether anyone remembers them. Some grandparents ache because their children or grandchildren have drifted from the faith. Yet many continue to pray, bless, encourage, forgive, and hope. They are often the hidden intercessors of the parish, the ones whose prayers hold families together in ways we may never see. So what can we do? First, we can visit. A short visit, a cup of coffee, or a few minutes at a kitchen table can become a powerful act of love. Second, we can call. Do not underestimate the grace of a phone call that says, "I was thinking of you." Third, we can listen. Ask older persons about their lives, their faith, their joys, their regrets, their hopes, and their memories. Let children and teenagers hear these stories. A family that forgets its elders forgets part of its own soul.

Fourth, we can include. Invite grandparents and elderly parishioners to meals, celebrations, school events, parish gatherings, and prayer. If transportation is difficult, offer a ride. If technology is confusing, help them connect with livestreamed Mass, family photos, or video calls. Fifth, we can serve in practical ways: bring groceries, help with

small household tasks, write a note, shovel a walkway, sit with someone at Mass, or accompany them to an appointment. Sixth, we can pray with and for them. A decade of the rosary prayed together may do more than we realize.

Perhaps most importantly, we can ask for their blessing. In a world obsessed with the new, Jesus praises the scribe who brings from the storeroom both the new and the old. The old is not useless because it is old. The new is not holy simply because it is new. The Kingdom gathers both. Grandparents and elderly persons help us receive the old treasures of faith: patience, endurance, reverence, gratitude, forgiveness, and prayer. Young people help bring new energy, questions, creativity, and hope. When the generations are separated, both become poorer. When they are joined, the Church becomes more fully herself.

The net in today's Gospel gathers fish of every kind. That image can also remind us that the Church is a family of every age and condition: children, parents, singles, the strong, the frail, the young, and the old. No one is disposable. No one is forgotten by God. The elderly are not on the edge of the Church's mission; they are at the heart of it, because they witness that life remains precious in every season.

This week, let us not merely honor grandparents and the elderly with kind words. Let us discover them again as hidden treasure and pearls of great price. Let us make one concrete act of love: visit, call, listen, include, serve, or pray. And let us remember that one day, if God grants us the gift of long life, we too will hope that someone sees in us not a burden, but a blessing. **Who is the hidden treasure God is asking you to remember, honor, and love this week?**

Hamburger Noodle Casserole

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack Cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label "St. Andrew's- Hamburger Noodle Casserole."

1 lb. hamburger
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce
1 medium chopped onion
1 cup of green pepper

1 cup cottage cheese
1 cup sour cream
12 oz. egg noodles
2 cups shredded Monterey Jack Cheese
