**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:  
18<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary  
Time**

When I was a little boy, I once watched my mother prepare dinner for two unexpected guests. She opened the refrigerator, looked at the pantry, and sighed. "There is not enough," she whispered. But then she began to work. She whipped up

some pasta, made a large salad, cut the chicken cutlets smaller, and sliced the bread thinner. While preparing the meal, she added two more chairs to the table, and after feeding everyone first, she finally fed herself with what was left over. I never forgot that scene, because there were numerous lessons taught that day, without ever saying a word.

That simple scene opens a window into this Sunday's Gospel. Jesus has withdrawn to a deserted place after hearing of the death of John the Baptist. He might have wanted silence, rest, and prayer. Yet when He sees the crowd, He does not turn away. Saint Matthew tells us that His heart was moved with pity for them, and He cured their sick. As evening comes, the disciples see only the problem: the hour is late, the place is deserted, the crowd is hungry, and the food is scarce. Their solution is reasonable: send them away. But Jesus says something unreasonable by human standards and deeply revealing by divine standards: **"There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves."**

The disciples answer honestly: "Five loaves and two fish are all we have here." In other words, Lord, this is not enough. We know that feeling. We look at our families, our worries, our griefs, our bills, our illnesses, our parish needs, our personal weaknesses, and we say, "Lord, this is all I have." However Jesus does not shame the disciples for having too little. He simply says, "Bring them here to me." That is the turning point of the miracle. **The little**

**they possess becomes abundant when placed in the hands of Christ.**

In the Gospel, Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. These words point us toward the Eucharist, where Christ continues to take the ordinary gifts of bread and wine and give us His very self. The crowd is not merely given a snack; they are given a sign. They are shown that God's compassion is not distant, vague, or theoretical. The Lord sees His people. He knows their hunger. He answers their needs. As the Psalm reminds us, **the hand of the Lord feeds us; He answers all our needs.** As the First Reading proclaims, **God renews His covenant of love, inviting His people to come, receive, listen, and live.**

This is why our **upcoming Novena in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary** is such a beautiful parish response to this Sunday's readings. Beginning August 7 and continuing for nine days, culminating on August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we will come together each morning at 8:00 AM for Novena Mass and prayers. Like the disciples, we will bring to the Lord what we have: our hopes, burdens, illnesses, family concerns, thanksgiving, repentance, and petitions. And we will bring them with Mary, the Mother who always leads us to her Son.

**A novena is not magic.** It is not a spiritual vending machine. Rather, it is a disciplined act of faith: **nine days of prayer in which we place ourselves before God with perseverance, humility, and trust. A parish novena is even more powerful because it gathers individual intentions into the prayer of the whole Church.** No one prays alone. A person grieving a loss stands beside someone praying for healing. A parent, worried about a child, prays beside a couple, asking for strength. A parishioner giving thanks prays beside someone who can barely find the words. Together, we become the crowd in the Gospel, gathered around Jesus, trusting that His compassion is greater than our need.

**There are many graces that can come from participating in a parish novena.** It renews our habit of prayer. It lifts our eyes beyond the immediate pressures of life. It teach-

es patience when answers do not come quickly. **It draws us closer to the Blessed Mother**, who never keeps attention for herself but always says, "Do whatever He tells you." And especially as we approach the Assumption, it reminds us of our destiny: we are made not merely to survive this life, but to share eternal life with God.

**During the Novena, particular intentions will be offered each day. Those who wish to submit intentions may do so by reserving a Novena Candle, available in the vestibule of the Church or in the parish office.** This candle is a visible sign of prayer: a small flame entrusted to God, a reminder that even when we leave the church, our petitions remain before the Lord. It is another way of saying, "Jesus, I bring this to You."

Perhaps some will say, "I am too busy." Others may think, "My intention is too small," or "My problem is too large," or "I have prayed before, and nothing changed." But the Gospel gives us a different way to see. The disciples did not bring enough. They brought what they had. And that was enough for Jesus to begin. The Blessed Mother teaches the same trust. At the Annunciation, at Cana, at the foot of the Cross, and in the Upper Room, Mary shows us how to stand before God with open hands and a faithful heart.

So, this week, let us not send our needs away. Let us not carry them alone. **Let us bring them to Christ through the intercession of Mary. Come to the Novena Mass and prayers at 8:00 AM. Reserve a Novena Candle. Offer your intentions.** Pray for your family, our parish, the sick, the grieving, the lonely, the Church, and the world. **Bring your five loaves and two fish. Place them in the hands of Jesus.** And when we do, who knows what abundance the Lord may provide?

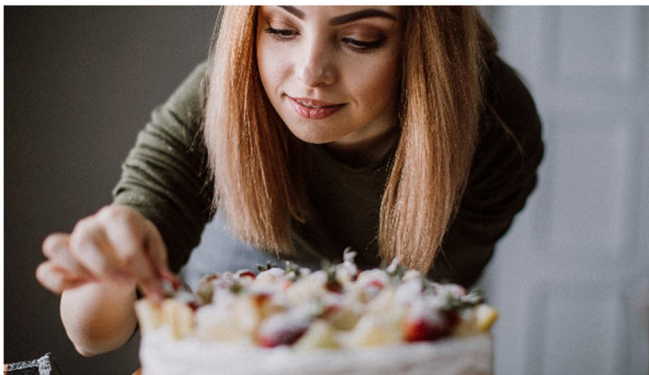

### Religious Education Update

#### **Mystagogy: Fostering a Sense of Wonder and Awe Through Our *Educating in Christ* Curriculum**

In *Evangelii Gaudium*, Pope Francis describes **mystagogy** as the preferred way of teaching the Catholic faith. Rather than simply learning facts, mystagogy invites people into a lifelong journey of growing closer to Christ through Scripture, the liturgy, prayer, and the life of the Church.

Our faith formation program at St. Andrew is built on **Sacred Scripture and the Sacred Liturgy**. Every lesson is rooted in God's Word, the Church's worship, or both. As children move through each grade, they are gradually led to discover who Jesus is and, through Him, come to know the Father and the Holy Spirit.

In the early years, our first goal is to help children develop a personal relationship with Jesus. Sophia Cavalletti, founder of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, believed that every child is born with a natural desire to know God. Instead of giving children all the answers, catechists encourage them to listen carefully to Scripture, especially passages about Jesus the Good Shepherd. Through thoughtful "wondering" questions, children are invited to reflect, ask questions, and discover for themselves who Jesus is and what it means to belong to Him.

Another important theme throughout the program is **God's Plan**. Beginning in the first years and continuing throughout the curriculum, children learn that God has lovingly guided His people from the creation of the world to the promise of eternal life. The Bible tells this one great story of salvation, helping children understand that they are also part of God's plan. Each child has a unique purpose and is called to share in God's work of bringing His love to the world. The program also teaches children to recognize **connections between the Old and New Testaments**. They discover how people, events, and promises in the Old Testament prepared the way for Jesus and were fulfilled in His life, death, and resurrection. These connections show God's loving plan unfolding step by step throughout history and point us toward Christ's return at the end of time. By seeing how the whole Bible fits together, children come to appreciate the beauty, unity, and faithfulness of God's plan for His people.

One of the most meaningful fruits of our **Educating in Christ** curriculum is that children not only grow closer to Jesus, they also begin to understand what is taking place during the Mass. As they come to recognize the connection between Scripture, the liturgy, and God's plan of salvation, the Mass becomes more than something they attend—it becomes an encounter with Jesus. Many children begin looking forward to Sunday Mass because they recognize Jesus there.

Parents, you may be pleasantly surprised by the changes you see in your children as a result of our *Educating in Christ* curriculum. As they grow in faith, your children are drawn into a much deeper relationship with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. You will also notice in them a growing sense of wonder and awe as they listen to Sacred Scripture, participate in the Mass, and discover the beauty of God's presence in their daily lives. We are very pleased to offer this outstanding model of faith formation for our children.
