FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
**19th Sunday of OT—When
the Wind Is Against Us**

Years ago, I heard the story of a man who found himself caught in a sudden storm while fishing on a lake. The sky had been clear when he set out, but within minutes the wind shifted, the waves rose, and the boat that had felt

safe a moment earlier began to feel very small. He later said that what frightened him most was not simply the storm around him, but the realization that he could not control it. He had all the equipment he thought he needed, all the experience he trusted, and all the confidence he had carried onto the water. But when the storm came, none of it was enough. In that moment, all he could do was call out for help.

That is often where real faith begins—not when everything is calm, predictable, and under control, but when the wind is against us and we discover how much we need the Lord. This Sunday, the Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle A, the Gospel from Matthew 14:22-33 gives us one of the most memorable scenes in all of Scripture: **Jesus walking on the water, Peter stepping out of the boat, and the frightened disciples coming to recognize, “Truly, you are the Son of God.”**

But this Gospel is not simply a dramatic miracle story. It is an interpretation of discipleship. It shows us what happens when Jesus sends His disciples forward, when prayer sustains His mission, when fear distorts our vision, and when faith must become more than an idea. Jesus has just fed the crowds. **Then He sends the disciples ahead in the boat while He goes up the mountain to pray. The disciples are not disobedient when they find themselves in trouble. They are exactly where Jesus told them to be. That detail matters.** Sometimes we assume that difficulty means we are outside God's will. Yet the Gospel teaches the opposite: **the disciples are in the storm precisely**

while following the Lord's command.

Matthew tells us that the boat was being tossed by the waves because the wind was against it. That image is deeply human. How many families know what it feels like to row hard and make little progress? How many parents, caregivers, widows, widowers, young adults, and parishioners know the exhaustion of doing the right thing while still feeling resisted by illness, grief, finances, conflict, anxiety, or uncertainty? **The wind against the disciples is not only weather; it is the spiritual experience of resistance. It is the feeling that life is pushing back harder than we can push forward.**

Then Jesus comes to them in the fourth watch of the night, (Note: That detail is included because it is the darkest and most exhausting hour before dawn). **He does not first remove the storm. He first reveals His presence. “Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid.”** The heart of the Gospel is not that storms never come to people of faith. **The heart of the Gospel is that Christ comes to His people in the storm. His presence is stronger than the wind, deeper than the sea, and nearer than our fear.**

Peter's response is bold: “Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.” Peter is not testing Jesus as much as he is asking to participate in His power. He knows that if Jesus commands it, even the impossible can become a path. **For a moment, Peter does walk. His eyes are fixed on Christ, and the water beneath him becomes firm enough for faith. But then he notices the wind. Fear takes over. He begins to sink.**

This is not only Peter's story; it is ours. We begin with trust, but then we notice the wind. We notice the diagnosis, the bill, the argument, the empty chair, the uncertain future, the weakness in ourselves. **We look away from Christ and toward the storm, and suddenly what seemed possible becomes overwhelming.** Yet Peter teaches us the shortest and perhaps most powerful prayer in Scripture: **“Lord, save me.”** No polished words. No perfect theology. **Just need, trust, and surrender. And immediately, Jesus stretches out His hand.**

That word “**immediately**” is a word of mercy. Jesus does not wait for Peter to sink farther. He does not lecture him

from a distance. He reaches for him. Even the rebuke, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" is not rejection; it is invitation. **Jesus is teaching Peter that faith is not the absence of fear. Faith is the decision to keep reaching for Christ when fear is real.**

This Gospel speaks beautifully to us as we continue our Novena to Our Lady of the Assumption, which began on August 7 and concludes on August 15. Mary knew what it meant to trust when she could not see the whole road ahead. At the Annunciation, at Bethlehem, in Egypt, at Calvary, and in the waiting of Holy Saturday, Mary kept her eyes fixed on the faithfulness of God. **The Assumption is the great sign that a life surrendered to God does not end in sinking, but in glory. Mary does not replace Christ; she points us to Him.** Like a mother in the storm, she teaches us to say again, "Do whatever He tells you," and to trust that her Son's hand is never beyond our reach.

So what does this mean for us this week? First, name the wind. Do not pretend there is no storm. Bring one real fear honestly to prayer. **Second**, listen for the voice of Christ: "Take courage, it is I." Let that sentence become a daily prayer. **Third**, step out in one concrete act of faith. Make the phone call. Return to Confession. Come to Mass with renewed attention. Pray the Novena with your family. Ask forgiveness. Offer help. Trust again. **Finally**, when you begin to sink, do not hide from the Lord. **Cry out, "Lord, save me," and let Him take your hand.**

The storm is not the final word. The wind is not stronger than Christ. The waves cannot swallow the one who reaches for the Savior. This week, let us pray with courage, walk with faith, and place our fears into the hands of Jesus through the intercession of Our Lady of the Assumption.

When the wind is against us, the hand of Christ is already reaching for us. The question is...Will you grasp his hand?

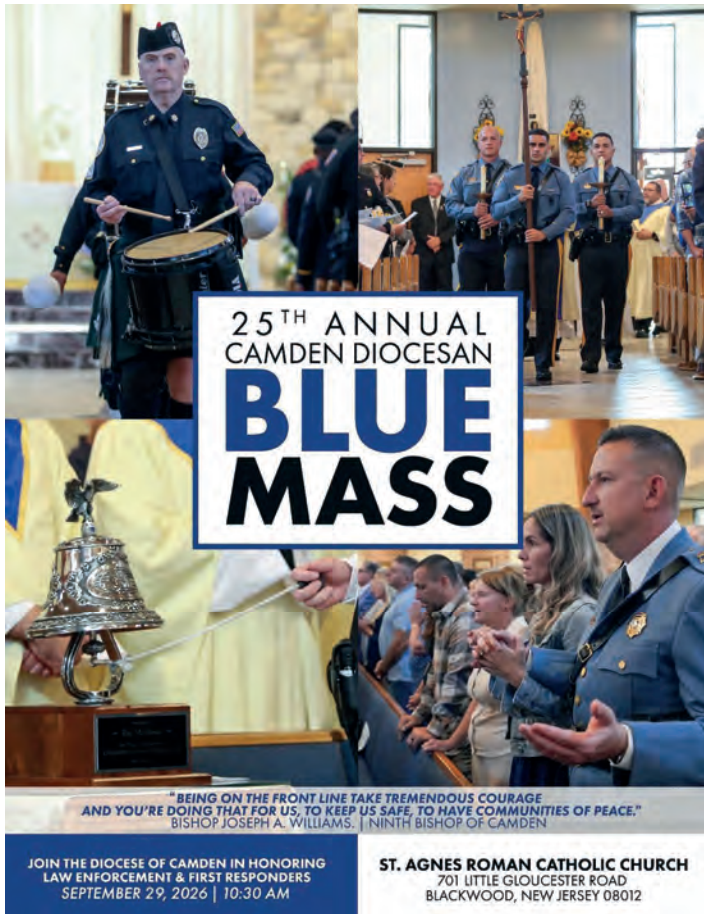
