FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
20th Sunday of Ordinary
Time: Understanding the
Assumption of the Blessed
Virgin Mary

Every year on August 15, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This year, as we move from that great Marian feast into the Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, it

is worth pausing to ask not only what the Church teaches, but why this teaching matters. The Assumption is not a decorative belief added to Catholic life. It is a proclamation of the power of Christ's Resurrection, the dignity of the human person, and the destiny God desires for all his children.

In 1950, Pope Pius XII solemnly defined that Mary, "having completed the course of her earthly life," was **assumed body and soul** into heavenly glory. The Catechism explains this as a "singular participation" in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection promised to all Christians. In other words, Mary did not take herself into heaven by her own power. **Jesus ascended; Mary was assumed.** Her Assumption is God's work, God's gift, and God's sign.

Why Mary? The answer begins not with Mary alone, but with Jesus. Everything the Church teaches about Mary protects and magnifies something true about Christ. Mary is the Mother of God because the child she bore is truly God and truly man. Mary is the Immaculate Conception because, from the first moment of her existence, God prepared her by grace to be the mother of the Redeemer. The Assumption flows from this same mystery: **the woman who was uniquely united to Christ in his birth, life, suffering, and death is also uniquely united to him in glory.**

That is why the Assumption is such a hopeful doctrine. Mary is not an exception that makes the rest of us feel

distant from God. She is a promise. **She shows us, ahead of time, what Christ intends for his Church.** We profess every Sunday, "I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come." Mary's Assumption tells us that this line of the Creed is not poetry. It is our future. The body that works, suffers, ages, serves, kneels, embraces, and weeps is not meaningless. God made us body and soul, and he intends to redeem us body and soul.

It is important to understand how the Church developed this teaching. The Assumption is not narrated in the Gospels the way the Crucifixion or Resurrection of Jesus is narrated. But Catholic faith is not based on Scripture isolated from the living Tradition of the Church. From early centuries, Christians celebrated **Mary's "Dormition" or "falling asleep," and the Church's prayer, liturgy, preaching, and reflection steadily recognized that the Mother of the Lord was not abandoned to corruption. Pope Pius XII did not invent the doctrine in 1950; he formally defined what the Church had long believed and celebrated.**

The Church does not define every historical detail. The dogma carefully says that **Mary was assumed after "the course of her earthly life" was completed**, leaving open the precise circumstances of her passing from this world. Christian tradition has associated the end of Mary's earthly life with Jerusalem and also, in some accounts, with Ephesus. The important point is not a map coordinate, but the theological reality: **at the end of her earthly pilgrimage, God brought Mary, body and soul, into heavenly glory.**

So how do we live this mystery? **First, the Assumption teaches us reverence for the body.** Our bodies are not obstacles to holiness; they are places where holiness is lived. We glorify God by how we use our eyes, hands, voices, strength, time, and presence. Caring for the sick, feeding a child, visiting the lonely, genuflecting before the Eucharist, and carrying our daily crosses all matter because the body matters.

Second, the Assumption teaches us hope. Many parishioners carry grief, illness, anxiety, family burdens, and fear of death. **Mary's Assumption does not erase suffering, but it tells us suffering is not the final word.** The final

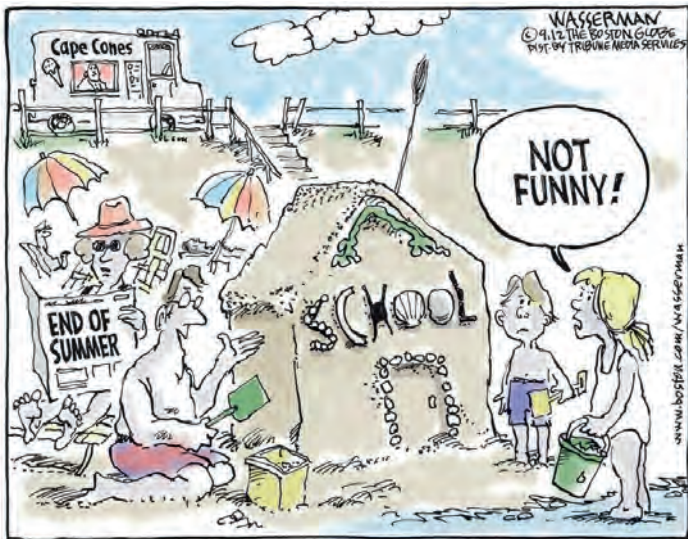
word belongs to Christ, who raises up the lowly and fills the hungry with good things.

Finally, the Assumption invites us to live like people whose destiny is heaven. Mary's greatness was not self-promotion, but surrender: "Let it be done to me according to your word." **If we want to share her glory, we begin by sharing her faith. We say yes to God in ordinary duties. We receive the sacraments. We forgive. We serve. We keep our eyes fixed on Christ.**

Mary assumed into heaven is not far away from us. She is the mother who shows us the road home. In her, the Church sees what grace can do. In her, we see what Christ promises. And with her, we learn to trust that the God who began this good work in us desires to bring the whole of us—body and soul—into his glory. Mary, Mother of God, be a Mother to us today.

Protecting Yourself from Fraud and Scams

Financial fraud and scams target older adults more frequently than any other age group, and the tactics keep evolving. Americans 60 and older reported around \$5 billion in losses to scams in 2024 alone – and that number continues to rise. In 2026, some of the most common threats include:

AI Voice Cloning (“GRANDPARENTS SCAMS”) – Criminals use artificial intelligence to mimic a loved one’s voice, claiming to be in distress and urgently needing money. If you receive a call like this, hang up and call your family member directly before doing anything else.

Government Impersonation – Fraudsters pose as IRS, Social Security, or Medicare officials, threatening benefit cuts or arrest. Locally, the Gloucester County Sheriff’s Office has warned residents about scammers impersonating Sheriff’s Officers. Legitimate government agencies will never call demanding immediate payment.

Tech Support Scams – Scammers call claiming to fix your computer or clear it of viruses, then ask for remote access or payment. Never give anyone remote access to your devices unless you initiated the contact.

Bank Imposter Scams – Urgent messages about suspicious account activity lead seniors to fake verification sites where their information is stolen. Always call the number on the back of your bank card to verify.

Remember: If something feels off, trust your instincts and take your time. Scammers rely on urgency and pressure – a legitimate caller will never rush you. Last month we collected 37 casseroles for Joseph's House! A big thank you to our volunteers! We appreciate your commitment to this ministry. In addition to casseroles, we will continue collecting individual snack bags for Joseph's House clients. The next drop off for casseroles will be **Thursday, August 27 from 10-11 AM**. Drive up to the parish hall and a volunteer will be there in the parking area. We will hand deliver to Joseph's House later in the day. Prepare one or more casseroles. All donations are deeply appreciated. We will continue to use the same recipe.

Hamburger Noodle Casserole

Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label "St. Andrew's- Hamburger Noodle Casserole."

1 lb. hamburger meat
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce
1 medium chopped onion
1 cup of green pepper

1 cup cottage cheese
1 cup sour cream
12oz. egg noodles
2 cups shredded Monterey Jack cheese
