FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK
– 21st Sunday of Ordinary
Time: **"WHO DO YOU SAY
THAT I AM?"**

Few periods in life are more painful than those in which we feel forced to keep our plans or actions secret from those we love. This is especially true when we know they strongly desire us to do something else—something that, deep down, we know we cannot

agree to.

We see this, for example, when a young man does not want to become a doctor, lawyer, or enter some other profession that he knows his father or mother very much wants for him. He may pass through an intense period of suffering, knowing that he will disappoint them. For a time, he may even feel the need to keep his real interests and plans hidden.

The same thing can happen when a young woman does not wish to marry the person her parents think appropriate. She may have to carry on a quiet, even secret, courtship with the person she has truly chosen. This can be painful and difficult, particularly because she realizes how firmly her parents have set their hearts on another plan for her.

What we see in these ordinary human experiences is that any situation in which others strongly desire something we cannot, in conscience accept, can be painful. That pain increases when, for a time, we must carry our real plans and actions quietly within ourselves.

This seems to have been one of the special sufferings and difficulties of Christ. During much of his public life, and until after the Resurrection, he was constantly aware that even his followers—and certainly many of the Jewish leaders—**expected the Messiah to lead a military and political movement against the Romans, their present conquerors.** Any hint from him in that direction could

have stirred up an uprising, with people expecting him to assume political leadership. **Since God's plan for the Messiah was very different, Christ knew this would lead only to tragic disappointment and bitterness.** So, as we hear in today's Gospel, he often cautioned his disciples to **keep things quiet**: "Then he strictly ordered his disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah." This was more than simple secrecy. It reveals Christ's concern that people might misunderstand what kind of Messiah he came to be. He knew that the true meaning of his mission would not come easily. As some later said of his teaching on the Eucharist, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" **And they turned away from him.**

In Matthew 16:13-20, Jesus brings his disciples to a decisive question: **"Who do you say that I am?"** Peter answers not with a political slogan or popular opinion, but with faith: **"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."** Jesus then blesses Peter, not because Peter has figured this out by himself, but because the Father has revealed it to him. **Jesus names him Peter, the rock, and entrusts to him the keys of the kingdom.** The keys are a sign of responsibility and authority in the household of God. Peter is called to strengthen the Church, not to replace Christ, but to serve the mission Christ gives him.

This Gospel is therefore very practical for us. Each of us must answer Christ's question personally: **Who is Jesus for me**—not merely in theory, not merely because others have told me, but in the way I pray, forgive, worship, serve, and make decisions? If Jesus is truly the Christ, then he must be more than a comfort in difficult moments. He must be the Lord of our priorities, our family life, our use of time, our moral choices, and our parish commitments. We may also need to examine whether we sometimes try to make Christ fit our expectations rather than allowing him to form ours. A parish grows in holiness when its members stop asking only, "What do I want the Church to be for me?" and begin asking, **"How is Christ calling me to serve his Church?"**

We have a tendency to project onto others our own plans for them. We are apt to think that we know best what they should do. Each person must do what, in the light of conscience and God's guidance, he or she sees to be right.

This is also true of *our* relationship to Christ. **In the end, it is not our plans and ideas of religion that matter most, but what Christ has established and determined for us that truly matters.** We must submit to and accept his plan—not simply our own. This was the difficult choice for the early Christians, many of whom were Jewish and deeply resentful of Roman control. They had hoped for a Messiah who would free them from Rome. That was their projection. But they had to humbly accept a very different and ultimately far more glorious plan. For many then, as for many today, this remains a difficult choice. The miracle of the Church is also the miracle of God's grace, which helps so many people choose Christ as he truly is, not merely as we might prefer him to be.

A simple way to live this Gospel this week would be to pray over Peter's words each morning: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Ask for the grace to let that profession shape one concrete action: reconcile with someone, return to regular prayer, come to Mass with greater attention, serve someone in need, or trust the Church's teaching even when it challenges us. Faith becomes real when it moves from words on our lips to choices in our lives.

In founding the congregation, Bishop Perlo believed that anyone who would come to be a part of the new congregation must follow in the footsteps of our Lord Jesus Christ . . . in caring for the poor, the needy, and those who were suffering.

Today, with more than 500 Sisters actively serving in Tanzania, Zambia, Uganda, Italy, Kenya, and the United States -- the Missionary Sisters continue to hold closely to the belief that all Christians must reach out on behalf of those who cannot care for themselves.

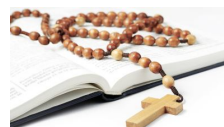

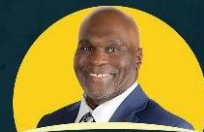

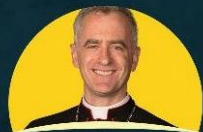

Hamburger Noodle Casserole

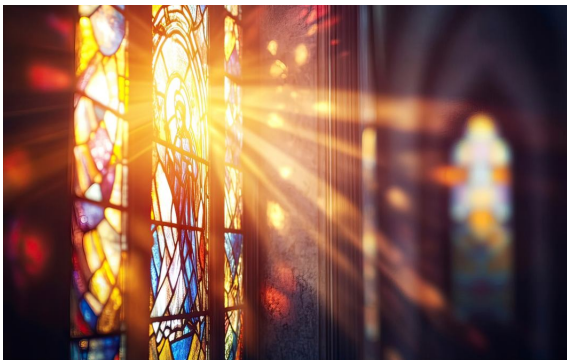
Combine the hamburger, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked. Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes. Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese. Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles. Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label "St. Andrew's- Hamburger Noodle Casserole."

1 lb. hamburger meat
15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce
1 medium chopped onion
1 cup of green pepper

1 cup cottage cheese
1 cup sour cream
12 oz. egg noodles
2 cups shredded Monterey Jack cheese
