**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:
22nd Sunday of OT - Taking
Up the Cross, Caring for
Creation**

A man once brought an old wooden crucifix to a restorer. It had hung for generations in his family home, but years of smoke, dust, and careless handling had darkened it. The restorer studied it carefully and said, "I can clean it, but I cannot make it new without removing the marks

that tell its story." The man paused and replied, "Then restore it, but do not erase the wounds." That is the mystery at the heart of this Sunday's Gospel. **We often want a faith that shines without scars, a Messiah without a cross, a life of discipleship without sacrifice.** Jesus offers something deeper: **not a life without wounds, but a life in which wounds can become part of redemption.**

Matthew tells us that "from that time on" **Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem, suffer, be killed, and be raised on the third day.** That phrase signals a turning point. Until now, the disciples have seen healings, feedings, authority over storms, and Peter has just confessed that Jesus is "the Christ, the Son of the living God." But now **Jesus redefines what Messiah means.** He is not the conquering political liberator many expected. **He is the suffering servant who saves not by avoiding pain, but by entering it in obedient love.**

Peter's reaction is understandable. "God forbid, Lord! No such thing shall ever happen to you." Peter loves Jesus, but his love is still trying to control the mission of God. Commentators often note the shock of the reversal: Peter, named "rock" in the previous passage, now becomes a "stumbling block." Jesus' words, "Get behind me, Satan," are severe because **Peter is tempting Jesus toward a Messiahship without the cross.** The word "**behind**" matters. Peter's place is not in front of Jesus, directing the path, but behind him, **following.** **Discipleship begins when we stop asking Jesus to follow our plans and begin placing our steps behind his.**

Then Jesus speaks not only of his cross, but of ours: **"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself,**

take up his cross, and follow me." This is not an invitation to seek suffering for its own sake, nor to passively accept injustice. The cross is the cost of faithful love. To deny oneself is not to hate oneself; it is to dethrone the false self that insists on comfort, control, image, and self-preservation above all else. To take up the cross is to choose the difficult good, to love when love is costly, to forgive when pride resists, to serve when no one applauds, to stand with Christ when the world offers easier roads.

When Jesus tells us to take up our cross, he is asking us to deny ourselves—not in a harsh or gloomy way, but in a loving and practical way. To deny ourselves means learning to live less selfishly. It means becoming **more attentive to the needs of others**, more willing to put someone else first, and more conscious that our choices affect people beyond ourselves. That kind of discipleship reaches into every part of life: how we speak, how we spend our time, how we use what we have, and how we treat the world God has placed in our care. If following Jesus means choosing love over convenience and responsibility over self-interest, then care for creation belongs very naturally to the Christian life. That is why this **Tuesday's World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation** is such a fitting moment for us to ask how we can better love God by caring for the earth and for one another.

This week's observance of the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation helps us hear the Gospel with fresh urgency. Pope Francis established this day as an opportunity for believers and communities to reaffirm our vocation as **stewards of creation**, to thank God for the handiwork entrusted to us, and to ask both God's help in protecting creation and pardon for sins committed against the world in which we live. Care for the environment is not a political accessory to faith; it is part of discipleship. If the cross means costly love, then **caring for our common home will also require sacrifice:** consuming less, wasting less, noticing more, and recognizing that the earth is not a possession to exploit but a gift to receive and protect.

For our parish, the practical question is simple: **where is Jesus asking us to get behind Him this week?** Perhaps it is in a strained relationship where forgiveness feels like losing. Perhaps it is in prayer, where we must surrender our timetable to God's. Perhaps it is in generosity, where we are invited to give not merely from surplus but from trust. **Perhaps, this Tuesday, it is in one concrete act of care for creation.** Faith becomes real when it becomes visible in choices.

On Tuesday, consider making one commitment: spend **ten minutes in prayer** outdoors, thanking God for creation; **pick up litter** in your neighborhood or parish grounds; **go without single-use plastics** for the day; **reduce electricity** use by turning off unnecessary lights and devices; combine errands or **walk** when possible; **avoid food waste** by planning meals carefully; **plant something** native or care for a garden; write to a local leader in support of **clean water, clean air, and responsible stewardship**; or make a family **examination of conscience** about how your home uses resources.

The cross Jesus asks us to carry is not always dramatic. Sometimes it looks like patience, restraint, repentance, simplicity, or quiet fidelity. But **every true cross, carried with Christ, becomes a place where death gives way to life.** Peter had to learn that the way of salvation was not around the cross, but through it. So do we. This week, may we have the courage to stand behind Jesus rather than in his way, to lose the life that is ruled by fear, and to find the life that is poured out in love—for God, for one another, and for the beautiful wounded world entrusted to our care.

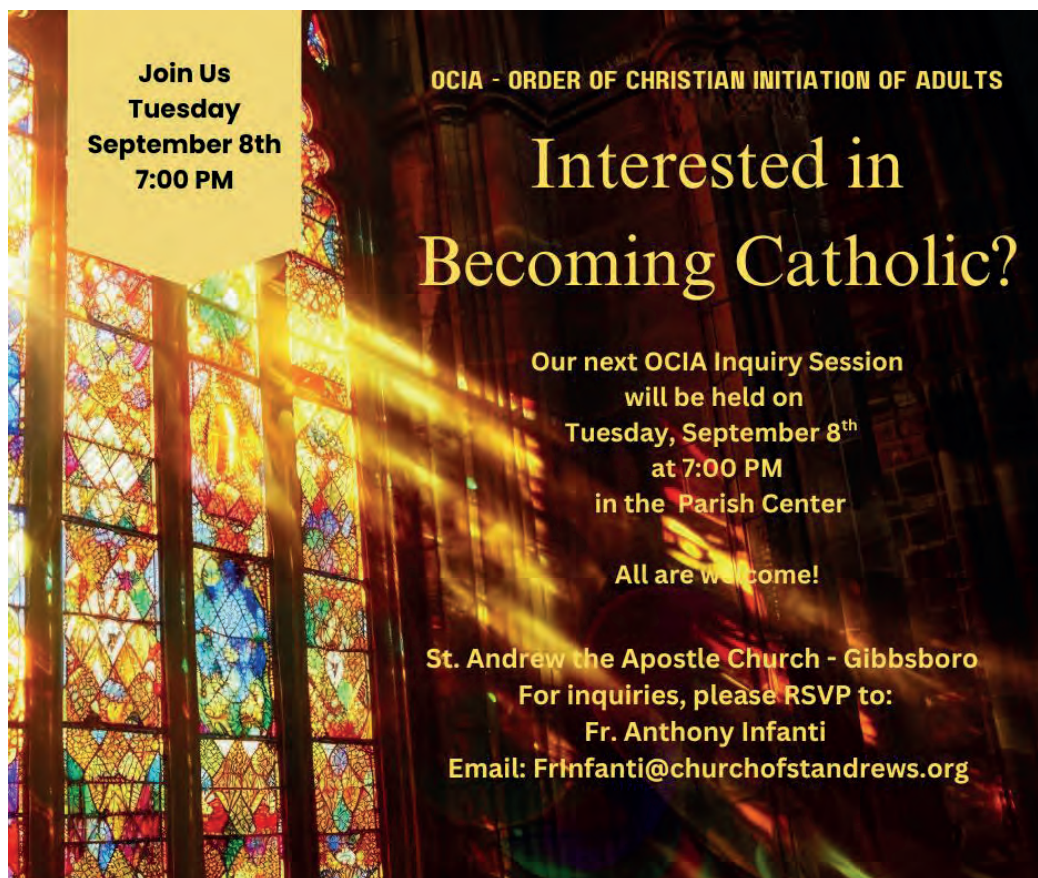

Grief Hurts. When we've lost someone we love, it can feel as though we've lost a part of ourselves. Sometimes we wonder if we will ever feel whole again. The pain of grief can be emotional, spiritual and sometimes even physical. Some people cry a lot, others not at all, and many cry now and then. It is all normal, and it is all okay.

Feeling sad is a natural response to losing someone who was an important part of our life. Many people experience a lack of energy and sadness while grieving. Some describe being "in a fog" and finding it difficult to perform simple tasks. Some people want to be around their friends and family, and others prefer to be left alone. Grief looks different with each person who experiences it.

St. Andrew's offers a peer grief support group for persons who have experienced a loss. It can be very helpful to share your grief with others who understand and share your faith. Our faith is a great source of hope and comfort at a time of loss. We believe in Eternal Life and Christ's promise: "I am the Resurrection and the Life, he who believes in me, though he dies, yet he shall live." John 11:25
