From the Pastor's Desk



One time, while traveling in the Holy Land, I watched a young woman tending to a small flock of sheep. She kept a watchful eye on the flock, turning her head from side to side, studying each one and looking for possible predators. The sheep were thriving because they were well-fed, healthy, and protected. Perhaps the young

woman's attention to her flock was no more than anyone should expect of a shepherdess, but I think the qualities she showed in her day-to-day work were much like Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

A good shepherd always keeps a watchful eye on the needs of others. As disciples of Christ, we are called to imitate the qualities of the Good Shepherd in our everyday lives. I firmly believe that God puts us in the path of others to be conduits of his grace. Further, I think these things happen regularly, but too often, we are too busy to notice. Failing to notice the needs of others is a definite violation of being a disciple of Christ.

As I said, God always puts us in the path to make a difference in the lives of others. In most cases, God does not expect us to do great things; instead, God expects us to the cost." do small acts of kindness with great love. Perhaps the following story will help you understand the vital role you might play in providing such witness to others.

A man placed his carry-on bag in the overhead luggage compartment of an aircraft and took his assigned seat. As he began to settle himself, he noticed that a line of soldiers came down the aisle and filled several vacant seats in the rows ahead of him. He decided to start a conversation and asked, "Where are you headed?" "Petawawa. We'll be there for two weeks for special training and then be deployed to Afghanistan."

After flying for about an hour, an announcement was made The man gathered his belongings and deplaned the airthat sack lunches were available for five dollars. Since it would be several hours before arriving at the flight destination, the man thought he would buy a lunch to help pass the time. As he reached for his wallet, he overheard a soldier ask his buddy if he planned to buy lunch. "No, that seems like a lot of money for just a sack lunch. It probably wouldn't be worth five bucks. I'll wait till we get to the base." His friend agreed.

The man looked around at the other soldiers and noticed none were buying lunch. He gestured to the flight attendant and handed her a fifty-dollar bill, saying: "Would you please do me a favor and bring all these soldiers a lunch." The attendant grabbed his arm and squeezed tightly. Her eyes were wet with tears, and she thanked him saying. "My son was a soldier in Iraq; it's almost like you are doing this for him."

She picked up ten sacks and headed up the aisle to where the soldiers were seated. A short while later, she returned to the man who purchased the lunches and asked, "Which do you like best- beef or chicken?" "Chicken," the man replied and wondered why she asked. She returned a minute later with a dinner plate from a first-class passenger. She said, "Sir, I was so moved by what you did for our soldiers, so I told my colleague working in the plane's first-class section. A passenger in that section overheard our conversation and asked me to bring you her lunch in gratitude for what you just did. This is your thanks." The man accepted the lunch with gratitude.

Another passenger overheard what occurred, and he gestured for the attendant and said, "I saw what just happened with the man who purchased lunches for our soldiers, and I want to be part of this." He handed the airline attendant twenty-five dollars, saying, "Please give this to the man who purchased the lunches for the soldiers and tell him a fellow passenger would like to help defray

Soon after, the Flight Captain came down the aisle and stopped at the first man's seat. Smiling and extending his hand, he said, "Sir, I want to shake your hand." With a booming voice, he said, "I was a soldier and a military pilot. Once, someone bought me a lunch. It was an act of kindness I never forgot." Suddenly, everyone around them broke out into applause. As the man stood to depart the aircraft, a woman seated two rows in front of him reached out to shake his hand. Simultaneously, she placed another twenty-five dollars in his palm. She also said I want to be part of what you did for our soldiers.

craft. Waiting just inside the airplane door, another man stopped him, put something in his shirt pocket, turned, and walked away without saying a word. Another twenty-five dollars!

Upon entering the terminal, the man saw the soldiers once again, gathered together, waiting for their next flight. He walked over to them and handed them seventy-five dollars, saying, "It will take you some time to reach the base. By then, you might need another sandwich or something to drink. God Bless You, and thank you for your service."

Ten young soldiers left that flight feeling the love and respect of their fellow travelers. Walking briskly to his car, the man whispered a prayer for their safe return. These soldiers were giving their all for our country. Their fellow passengers could only provide them with a couple of meals. It seemed so little...

A veteran is someone who, at one point in their life, wrote a blank check made payable to America for an amount of 'up to and including my life. That is Honor, and there are way too many people in this country who no longer understand it.

The beauty of this story is that the man noticed. He did a small act of kindness with great love...and look what God accomplished. It all began with the fact that the man noticed. Let us take the time each day to slow down to notice who God puts in our path and then perform a small act of kindness with great love. Remember, a little bit in God's hand is much.



RIC—Reverence in Church "Let us kneel before the LORD who made us." (Ps. 95:6b)

I remember playing sports and the coach would tell us after running at the end of practice, "Take a knee." I welcomed taking a knee after running more than I care to admit. As I went through the seminary and was unable to continue playing sports, I learned there was a difference between taking a knee on my left knee versus my right knee.

Growing up, my parents taught me that a genuflection was a regular act of reverence to Our Lord present in the Eucharist reserved in the tabernacle before we enter the pew in church. The Church teaches that before and after entering a pew and whenever we pass before the tabernacle, it is proper to genuflect before Our Lord's presence in the tabernacle as a gesture of reverence of His presence in the tabernacle. Yet, this action has become lost, and its return is important.

As Catholics, we genuflect on our **right knee only before Our Lord**. The right knee is reserved for God. Those who are royalty may receive a reverent bow or a genuflection as well, **yet only the left knee is for genuflecting to royalty**. If someone is unable to genuflect, it is perfectly acceptable to give a reverent bow to the tabernacle. It has also been a tradition to bow slightly at the mention of the name of Jesus. Both the genuflection and the bow are symbolic of one's humility and reverence in the presence of the Lord.



Prepare one or more casseroles. All donations are greatly appreciated. We will continue to use the same recipe. Hamburger Noodle Casserole

1 lb. hamburger meat

15 oz. can or jar tomato sauce

1 medium chopped onion

1 cup of green pepper

1 cup cottage cheese

1 cup sour cream

12 oz. egg noodles

2 cups Shredded Monterey Jack Cheese

Combine the hamburger meat, green pepper and onion and sauté until meat is cooked.

Salt and pepper to taste. Add tomato sauce and simmer for 20 minutes.

Cook noodles according to package directions.

In another bowl combine sour cream and cottage cheese.

Blend cottage cheese and sour cream mixture with the cooked noodles.

Salt and pepper to taste.

In a lightly greased aluminum pan spread the hamburger mixture. Next, layer the noodle mixture. Top casserole with shredded Monterey Jack Cheese.

Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until thoroughly heated.

NOTE: Please freeze the casserole, cover with aluminum foil, date and label St. Andrew's- "Hamburger Noodle Casserole."


