From the Pastor's Desk



"Gratitude That Moves Us"

It was a cold October morning when a parishioner named Francine came to the parish office with a casserole dish wrapped in foil.

Franny was an office volunteer who chose to help the parish after retiring from the railroad industry. She wasn't scheduled to serve that day. But she over-

heard me talking that one of our bereaved families could not afford a repast and also had no one to cook for them after the funeral. "I just thought they might need something warm," she said, placing the dish down gently. That casserole wasn't just food—it was ministry. It was gratitude in motion.

This Sunday's readings invite us into a deeper understanding of gratitude—not as a polite response, but as a transformative encounter with God. In 2 Kings 5:14–17, we meet Naaman, a foreign military commander afflicted with leprosy. He comes to Israel seeking healing, and after some initial resistance, he humbles himself and bathes in the Jordan River as instructed by the prophet Elisha.

His skin is restored, but more importantly, his heart is changed. He returns to Elisha not just healed, but converted. "Now I know," he says, "that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel." Naaman's gratitude leads him to worship.

In the Gospel of Luke 17:11–19, Jesus heals ten lepers, but only one—a Samaritan—returns to give thanks. The others are healed physically, but only the grateful one receives the deeper gift: salvation. "Your faith has made you well," Jesus tells him. The Greek word used here, *sozo*, means more than physical healing—it means wholeness, restoration, redemption. Gratitude doesn't just acknowledge the gift—it opens the heart to the Giver.

Both Naaman and the Samaritan leper are outsiders. Both are healed. But only when they return in thanksgiving do they truly encounter God. Their stories remind us that gratitude is not a passive feeling—it's an active response. It moves us. It sends us back. It draws us deeper.

October is our parish's Time and Talent month—a season when we ask every parishioner to consider how they might serve in one ministry for one year. It's not about filling

slots or checking boxes. It's about responding to grace. Like Naaman, we've all been healed in ways we didn't deserve. Like the Samaritan, we've all received mercy we didn't earn. Stewardship is our chance to return—to say thank you not just with words, but with action.

This week, you'll receive the Ministry Directory. It's more than a list—it's a map of grace. Each ministry is a doorway into deeper discipleship. Whether it's visiting the sick, teaching children, preparing meals, or singing in the choir, every act of service is a way to say, "Thank you, Lord, for all You've done."

And here's the beauty: you don't have to get it perfect. We ask you to commit for one year. If it's life-giving, stay. If it's not, try something else next year. The goal isn't perfection—it's participation. It's movement. It's gratitude that grows.

So as you read the Ministry Directory this week, don't ask, "What do I have time for?" Ask, "Where is God calling me to return?" Don't ask, "What am I good at?" Ask, "What am I grateful for?" Because gratitude isn't just a feeling—it's a calling.

Let's be a parish of casseroles and choir notes, of hospital visits and hospitality. Let's be a people who return—not just once, but again and again—to the One who heals us, restores us, and sends us out.

Gratitude is not what we say—it's how we live. So let's return to the Lord this October, not empty-handed, but with hearts full and hands ready.

There are over 50 active volunteer ministries at St. Andrews. Our Church has different departments, all with volunteer ministry needs. Our pastoral departments encompass Liturgy, Sacraments, Faith Formation, and Christian Life. We also have Administration roles in office support, development, buildings and grounds, and with our parish governance committees. Please discern how God is calling you to use your gifts, talents and skills to serve Him.

How Your Prayers Can Serve Those in the Priesthood

Seven Sister Apostolate

That Our Prayers May Find The Heart Of Every Priest And Bishop- that is the motto for the Seven Sisters Apostolate. There are some women who have a particular desire to pray for their priests and in this beautiful apostolate, seven women come together to commit to offering a holy hour in adoration or before the Blessed Sacrament in the priest's church or in another local church each on a chosen day of the week. Thus, the priest is guaranteed one holy hour every day.

Two requirements for the holy hour are:

1. It should be offered solely for the intentions of that particular priest
2. The woman offering the holy hour should ask for the deepening of the priest's devotion to Mary.

Magdala Grove Apostolate

The Magdala Grove Apostolate of women who pray for the vocation of their parish priests. Having similarities to the Seven Sisters Apostolate, this apostolate allows working women and working mothers to fulfill a prayerful desire to pray for their priests without having to offer a holy hour on a chosen day for their priest(s).

Magdala Grove is a group of seven women choosing a specific day of the week to offer their everyday activities from work and/or home for their parish priest(s).

As the founder of the group Jacqueline Van Hemert explains, "There's no detailed to-do list or prayer rubric. Instead, we trust that the Holy Spirit will guide you in how to pray the day. The Spirit might invite you to fast and pray. Or He might invite you to another day of chronic pain, another day home with the kids, or another day of that unfulfilled longing.

The simple yet difficult secret of Magdala Grove is your yes to Christ's invitation, whatever it may be. It doesn't matter if you're a stay-at-home mom or empty-nester, single, married, or widowed, struggling with infertility or overwhelmed with more kids than you can handle, traveling the world or homebound, living your best life or stuck in a job you hate.

When you are buried deeply in the soil where only God can see, consider your life a seed, bearing fruit and providing welcome shade to those laboring unprotected under the blazing sun of ministry.
