

Dear Parishioners

Several years ago (2019), the Pew Research Forum released a study about the level of Catholic belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The study was astounding, disturbing, and a profound wake-up call to church leaders because it revealed that a majority of Catholics do not believe that the bread and wine used at Mass become the body and blood of Jesus Christ. The report drew a strong reaction from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The response was not so much directed toward those who did not understand Eucharistic Theology but more so directed inward to themselves – Church leaders who are fundamentally responsible for transmitting the faith.

My Grandparents, who had limited educations, clearly understood that they were receiving the actual Body and Blood of Jesus Christ whenever they received Holy Communion. The question to be asked is, “What happened with subsequent generations who no longer understand the meaning of the Eucharist, and what needs to be done to help people understand this essential reality of our faith?”

The Pew study, issued on August 5, 2019, revealed that 69% of self-identified Catholics believed the bread and wine used at Mass are not Jesus but “**symbols** of the body and blood of Jesus Christ.” The other 31% believed in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, known as *transubstantiation*. Among the 37% of study participants who did not believe that the Communion bread and wine actually become the body and blood of Christ are 23% who do not know what the Church’s teaching is, and 14% who know the Church’s teaching but do not believe it. Again, these opinions are staggering.

The problem, as I see it, is that the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist is a basic tenet of Catholicism, and many parishioners need to be catechized. Why? Because the Eucharist is a source of strength in our lives that gives us the grace to endure many circumstances in life. Otherwise, why would Jesus have given it to us? Many people believe they are faithful Catholics if they are concerned for the poor or speak for principles of social justice. However, we develop these commitments *because* when we receive the Eucharist (the Real presence of Christ within ourselves), we become what we eat. If Jesus is within us, we become his arms, hands, feet, and voice in this world. Bishop Robert Barron said, “If you take away the central teachings of our Church at the doctrinal level, trust me, you will take away our commitment to the poor. It belongs together as a whole.” So, let me now revisit the question, “What needs to be done to help people understand this essential reality of our faith?”

Two years ago, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted to launch a three-year Eucharistic revival initiative, culminating with a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in 2024. The First year of the Revival (2022-2023) concentrated on creating awareness of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist at the **Diocesan Level**.

Accordingly, several things occurred in our Diocese, such as the Corpus Christi Procession along the Atlantic City Boardwalk, Eucharistic talks throughout the Diocese, and a Diocesan Eucharistic Congress held at the Camden Waterfront Pavilion.

The second year of the Revival occurs now and focuses on the **Parish Level**. Therefore, through this initiative, I am announcing the St. Andrew the Apostle Parish Eucharistic Revival Year, which began on Corpus Christi Sunday, 2023, and will conclude on Corpus Christi Sunday, 2024. Throughout this time, our parish will host many activities to help our people better understand the Eucharist and, most importantly, that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist. These activities will lead to the Jubilee celebration of the **65th Anniversary of our Parish** (as an Independent Parish). As your Pastor, my role, with the support of the Pastoral Staff, is to teach clearly and authentically what the Church teaches, including how the sacrament of the Eucharist is administered, prayed, understood, and revered, and to enlighten how this sacrament transforms the faithful. We must also teach in a way that not only informs but also changes hearts and minds.

In this booklet, you will find a calendar of activities that will help us broaden our understanding of Christ’s true presence in the Eucharist. This booklet is distributed in the Fall so you can plan ahead and mark your calendars for many of the upcoming events. Also, at the end of the booklet is a parish registration form for anyone who wishes to register at St. Andrew the Apostle Parish. I cannot think of a better way to celebrate our 65th Jubilee Year than to commit to forming our lives to become the Eucharistic community that Jesus calls us and needs us to be.

Miraculous Medal Novena

Saturday, October 7 at 8:30am

Join us in praying our Miraculous Medal Novena amid Eucharistic Adoration. Experience the love and comfort of our Blessed Mother and her Son, Jesus. Mary has promised us graces if we come to the Altar and ask for them. So come, ask, and know you are being heard.



Front side: depicts Mary Immaculate, hands open, full of light. Mary stands upon the globe as the Queen of Heaven and Earth. Her feet crush the serpent to proclaim that Satan and all his followers are helpless before her. St. Catherine Labouré saw Our Lady appear saying, “Have a medal made according to this model. Everyone who wears it around their neck will receive great graces.”

Back Side: the Cross and the letter M symbolize the close relationship of Mary to the suffering, passion, and death of her Son. The cross symbolizes Christ and our redemption, with the bar under the cross a sign of the earth and the Altar, where the Sacrifice of Calvary continues to be present in the world today. The M signifies “Mary” and “Mother.” The interweaving of Mary’s initial and the cross shows Mary’s close involvement with Jesus and our world. In this, we see Mary’s part in our salvation and her role as Mother of the Church. The two hearts represent the love of Jesus and Mary for us: the Sacred Heart of Jesus crowned with thorns and the Immaculate Heart of Mary pierced by a sword. The 12 stars: the 12 tribes of Israel and the 12 apostles, representing the Church around Mary. It also reflects the vision in the Revelation 12:1, in which “a great sign appeared in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of 12 stars.”

Shroud Encounter is a 90-minute big screen event using over 200 animated images that captivates the audience from beginning to end.

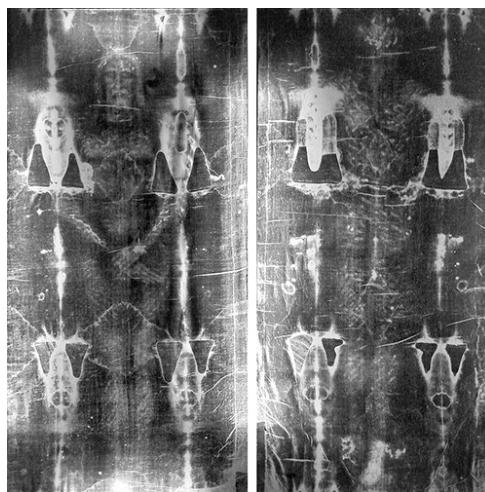
The Presenter will highlight the following:

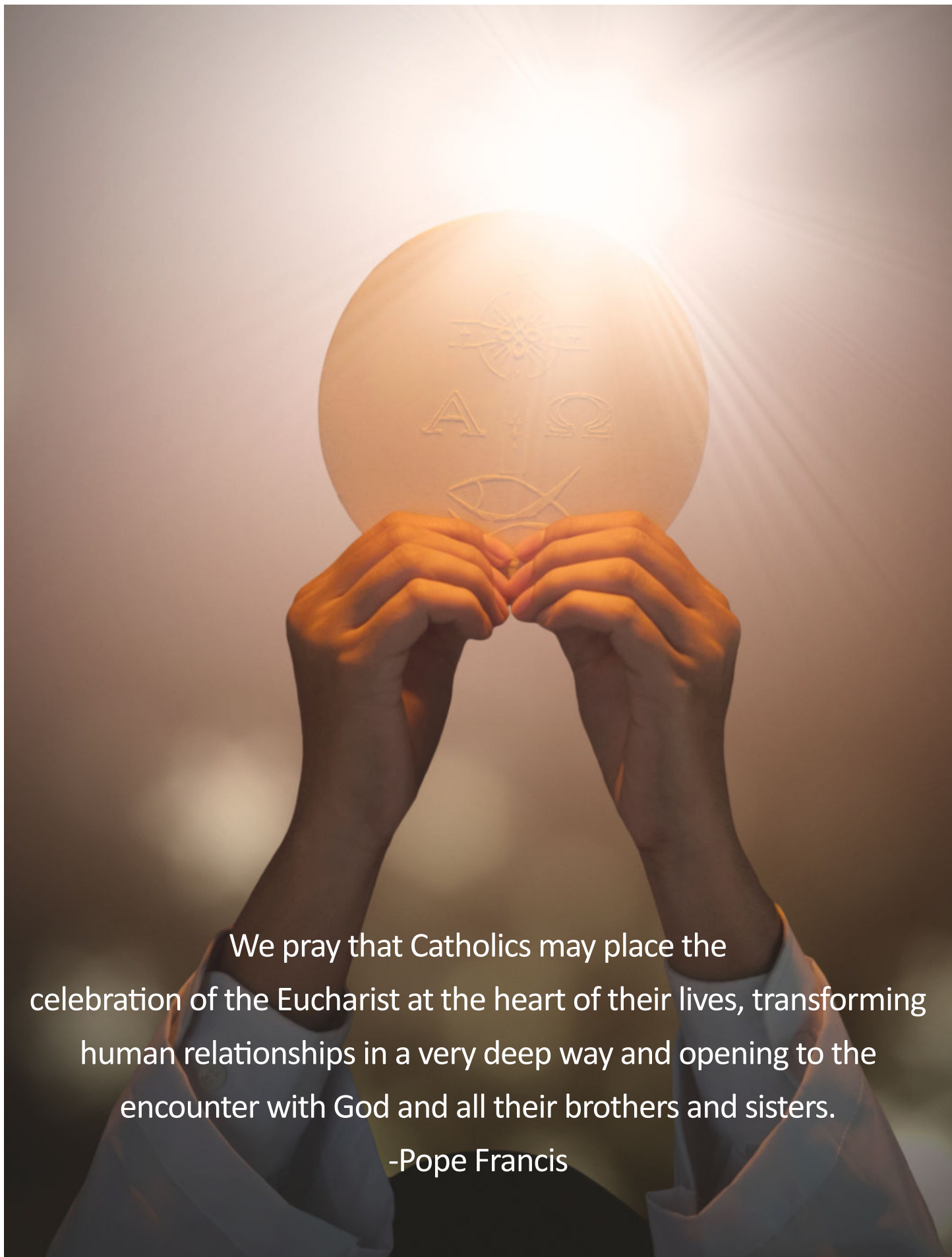
