PASTOR ELAN'S MESSAGE

This morning, I got up early and went over to the fellowship hall to watch the sunrise and admire the beautiful windows that Pastor Carroll Marohl and Cheryl Drew made with the help of their wonderful spouses, Cynthia and Warren. It was still dark when I got there, much as it was the other night when Pastor Carroll came to talk to the Confirmation classes about the windows. I shared how the windows weren't shining. We couldn't see what they were because the light wasn't shining through. The stained glass windows were in darkness, the world is in darkness, just like we are, until the light of God shines through.

Pastor Carroll gave a wonderful introduction to the Confirmation classes about the windows and the stories behind them. If you have not seen the windows, I encourage you to please come over and look at them. If you would like to watch the sunrise, let me know the night before, and I'll make sure the church is unlocked for you. The fellowship hall is a great place to walk, sit, read, or meditate. So much went into the windows: the countless hours, the thoughts, the prayers, the joy, and even the heartbreak. They are a gift of love, and you can feel God's blessing on these windows. I'm certain of it. There's something holy about being around them, looking at them, just seeing the sunlight shine through the glass, knowing they are telling the story of God's love for this world. The Holy Spirit is hovering over the chaos as God brings light into our world.

On this morning, my attention was drawn to window number three: the stone tablets, "*Broken Promises. Stolen Dreams.*" As I sat in the dark, the sun started slowly shining through. It began with a pink tinge. To elaborate a little, if you haven't seen them, the color in the actual glass is more of a burnt orange. The window depicts the devastation, the drought, and the barren landscape, reflecting the condition of the Israelites as they came out of Egypt. While I watched, the light shining through got brighter and brighter, turning to a deeper red, almost a dried-blood color.

My thoughts focused on those Ten Commandments and how they were given to the people as a way to live. The Ten Commandments were given to Moses, who brought them down the mountain to the people below. They had had enough of waiting for Moses. They were having an orgy, as Pastor Carroll points out, not just a party but an orgy, and made for themselves a false idol. Moses was upset. He threw the Commandments and broke them, but God gave him another set.

What people tend to forget about the Ten Commandments is God gave these laws to the people out of love. The commandments are a way to live. Don't do these things; do these things, but behind the law, the motivation was always love. I know we forget that in our day-to-day lives, even in our education and teaching, just as the Israelite people did in the time of Christ.

PASTOR ELAN'S MESSAGE

It wasn't until centuries later that Luther elaborated on what this means. What does it mean when we love God? What does it mean when we don't lie, that we don't steal, and that we don't kill? The motivation behind all this is to love God and love each other. It's not just about rules for better behavior; it's about treating everybody with decency and respect. The love behind the gift helped us understand, but I don't think we really understood it for a long time.

It wasn't until, as Pastor Carroll likes to say, God's Plan B: when Jesus Christ was made incarnate through the Virgin Mary by the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus Christ taught us about what love is. Jesus Christ, the image of God showed us God's heart and the love behind every single thing that God does to help make this world a better place. The laws weren't given just to make us behave. They were to offer us a better way of life, a blueprint of caring for each other. A way to live that lets the light of God shine through each one of our lives.

The way the sun shines through those beautiful windows. Even in the darkness, when you can't see anything but shadows and suggestions of what they could be like, they tell a story about what this world would be like, what we as individuals would be like without the love of God. The darkness we would be forever trapped in without the differences in this world that the coming of Jesus Christ made, and continues to make through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Let there be light!

The candidate ballot was reviewed, noting no candidates for President and Treasurer. Options such as dual roles or external hires were considered to fill the treasurer's position. A motion made by Pastor Carroll Marohl and seconded by Jean Smith to temporarily combine the Council Secretary and Treasurer positions; motion passed with one dissenting vote.

Chuck Oster was nominated for President by Pastor Carroll Marohl. Motion made by Brad Preheim, seconded by Lori Hecht, to add Chuck Oster to the ballot for President; motion carried.

Char Adamson made motion to add Daniel Knutson to the ballot for Personnel committee, seconded by Warren Drew; motion carried.

Elaine Ostrem moved to approve the slate of members for various positions; Warren Drew seconded, and the motion passed. Officers elected: Chuck Oster (President), Daniel Knutson (Vice President), Ruth Stevens (Secretary/Treasurer), Connie Peterson (Financial Secretary). Other elected positions include Shane Rist (Trustee); Kory Muller and Vonni Knutson (Deacons); Ashley Gerken (Christian Education); Pastor Carroll and Cynthia Marohl, and Vonni Knutson (Worship and Music); Kevin Hecht and Steven Knutson (Property); Kim Preheim, Cheryl Drew, and Daniel Knutson (Personnel); Andrea Anderson and Darrell Mark (Audit Committee). Christian Education and Ministry Team still need more team members.

Old Business: Daniel requested approval for a constitutional change proposed in January 2025 to merge three teams into the Ministry Team starting January 2026. Brad Preheim moved, Cheryl Drew seconded, and the motion passed to combine Christian Fellowship, Mission & Outreach, and Stewardship teams into the Ministry Team.

Council Vice President is currently head of the nominating committee and recruits individuals to help in the search for volunteers to serve in positions.

New Business:

Daniel suggested reducing the number of trustees and deacons on the council from four to three each because of declining membership. This constitutional change would be voted on at the annual meeting in January 2027. Kory Muller moved, and Char Adamson seconded, to approve consideration of this change; the motion passed.

Daniel updated members on several items that could be used in the church, including a wireless microphone for use in the fellowship hall since the current system no longer works. He also suggested considering a TV and speakers for the family room so parents can view services. Another future item would be equipment to bring the media system broadcast into the fellowship hall. Carpet for the fellowship hall is in fund raising stage. The decision will need to be made whether to go with carpet rolls or squares. Squares are more expensive but have a longer life span.

Chery Drew recommended that Scandia create a list of needs and projects for the church to help those asking where they can direct memorials or other donations.

Being no further business, Pastor Elan was asked to give the closing prayer and benediction.

Roxanne Evans made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Mark Christofferson; motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 1:15 pm.

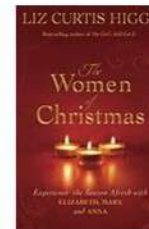

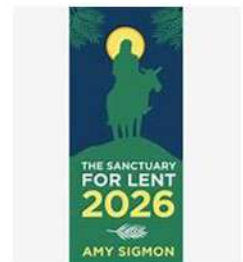

Two eras of US history are juxtaposed in this novel, two eras which demanded unfathomable bravery to survive. Somewhere in the middle of this novel comes the question, - How do you survive? What does it take? The answer comes as well, by living with grace and forgiveness."



I read The Women of Christmas by Liz Curtis Higgs during the Advent season. It explores the biblical stories of Elizabeth, Mary, and Anna in the book of Luke, chapters one and two. Ms. Higgs unwraps each verse with tender care. Angelic encounters, miraculous conceptions, unexpected visitors, and outbursts of praise: A fresh look at the nativity story! BRENT'S MESSAGE

Romans 12:1-2 Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your logical service. Do not conform to the pattern of this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to prove out what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.

Paul has laid out his presentation of the Gospel to the Romans. It has been full and comprehensive, cogent and convincing. But what does it mean for us in the here and now? Paul's use of the word therefore tells us he is about ready to come to exactly this point and with some urgency. Paul is convinced the Gospel he knows should be life changing. It is not merely an intellectual curiosity to be debated by philosophers and rhetoricians on some acropolis or in the halls of academia. Paul urges his readers to build on the sound spiritual logic of what God has done for us in Christ. This is no call to go along and get along with the world out there, but rather to be transformed and transforming. The verb here for urge is related to the word paraclete. Remember the Holy Spirit is called the Paraclete, the Counselor. Paul is giving us wise spiritual counsel here and spurring us on to act upon it.

Paul tells us the process of transformation begins with the mind, and the word he uses for mind points to the intellectual thinking rational mind. Many people come to religion for the feeling it gives – hope, peace, security. It is not wrong to come to God for these. He is indeed the source of all wellbeing. But the Christian who refuses to embrace the intellectual, logical, reasonable implications of the faith is not a serious Christian. Faith remains shallow without the mind being engaged – the mind leading to renewal and action. That is why the Scripture should be diligently studied and the Spirit of God be invited to renew our minds.

Two things Paul tells us will be needed. 1. We will need to present ourselves as living sacrifices. It is only reasonable. God has given us all, should we not now in grateful response present all of ourselves, body included, to the God who has freed us and made us alive in His Son? Of course! But also “of course” as someone has said, “The problem with a living sacrifice is that it wants to crawl off the altar.” There will indeed be these struggles on the disciple road, yet I am very glad that Paul speaks of a “living” sacrifice. Martyrdom is not something to be sought for, as in some other faiths. Endured in faith? Yes, if it is inevitable, but not sought after. Our Lord is a life giving Lord and that is his ultimate goal. 2. Our renewed mind will then allow us to prove out in the living of God's principles - what God's will is for us. Notice God's will is good, pleasing and perfect, not just to God but for us as well.

Do you want to know what God's will for you is – for the New Year, for life? Let the Holy Spirit renew your mind and then act on the true principles He reveals in Scripture. Every day then will be a new revelation of God's will in your life!

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

Scandia Church Council held its regular meeting on January 20, 2026. Those present included Daniel Knutson, Char Adamson, Cheryl Drew, Kevin Hecht, Philip Christofferson, Ruth Stevens, Vonni Knutson, Kim Preheim, Andrea Anderson, Kory Muller, Pastor Elan, and Pastor Carroll Marohl. Joyce Vasgaard was not able to attend.

The meeting began at 7:30 pm; Pastor Elan gave devotions.

Pastor Carroll Marohl updated the council on the stained-glass project and the dedication event held on January 18, 2026. Pastor Carroll was asked about providing an explanation of the meanings of other stained-glass windows similar to those provided for the new windows. The council expressed its thanks to Pastor Carroll and Cheryl Drew for all their work on the windows. Pastor Carroll then left the meeting.

Pastor's Report: Movie Nights (or Afternoons!) Light of the World and the Gift of Christmas were both watched and enjoyed. We will be making arrangements for more movie-watching, perhaps on Sunday afternoons. That is almost the only time without sports, and it is also the only day people can have family time, so we want to be sensitive about this. The kids want to watch an animated David and Goliath movie, recently released or soon to be released.

Sugar Cookie Kits. Some of the confirmation class helped Pastor Elan and Marsha Rist make sugar cookies. They were offered for sale on a Sunday following the church service, and by the afternoon, all were sold, raising over \$200.00 for the church.

Text study in Vermillion: weekly on Tuesdays except on the first Tuesday of the month, when we have our monthly conference gatherings.

Epiphany at the Parsonage for the SE Conference Pastors. On January 6, we hosted the gathering of Pastors and their spouses. Bishop Constanza also attended. John Shubeck was able to be a speaker. Good food and Fellowship, including Holy Communion.

Brent and I are doing a pulpit exchange on Sunday, January 25. I will be going to Brent's two churches; he will be walking across the alley to preach here. He will also be at the annual meeting here, and I will get here as fast (and carefully) as I can.

Weekly Wednesday services at CCRC with Holy Communion once a month. On January 28 at 2:00 pm, we will hold a Memorial Service for all those who passed away in 2025 at CCRC.

Baptisms and new members. Three children were baptized on January 11, and Brent and I hosted families, sharing meals and Fellowship, getting to know each other, and going over concerns and questions with individuals interested in joining the church.

Hospital and Hospice visits continue.

Freezer Meals are available and offered to anyone in need. If you would like to help, make meals or deliver them, or if you know of someone who could use them, please let Pastor Elan know.

Men's Bible Breakfast meets on Saturday mornings at eight, and the men are currently studying the book of Romans. Adult Bible Study will meet on the 1st and 3rd Sundays at 1:30 at the Parsonage. All are welcome. There is also a Bible study on 100 Prophecies about Jesus from the Old Testament on Saturday afternoons at 1:30 at the Parsonage.

Good Grief! (Grief Recovery Classes) are held weekly on Thursday afternoons at 3:00 PM at the Parsonage. If you need comfort and support as you mourn the loss of a loved one, please consider joining us. We have meals, Fellowship, Bible study, and group support. (We voted to change the name from Grief Recovery to Good Grief.)

Also on Thursdays: 2nd Thursday, Rural Café Zoom, 3rd Thursday, Dean's call, Support Ministry.

Pastor Elan and Brent hosted a New Year's Eve Party for the AA group and their families.

President's Report: Daniel gave each of those present his letter to the congregation for the annual report. On February 1st there will be no organist, and CDs will be used for music during the service. Daniel is training others to operate the media system when he is not available for services.

Secretary's Minutes: Secretary's minutes from the December meeting were reviewed. Motion by Vonni, second by Kim to approve minutes; motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's reports for December and for all of 2025 were reviewed. A motion was made by Vonni, seconded by Char, to approve the treasurer's report; the motion carried.

Financial Secretary's reports for December and 2025 were reviewed.

Committee Reports:

Education— Sunday School will sing in church on February 8th.

Mission and Outreach— New members to Scandia will be introduced on January 25, 2026.

Property— The rugs inside the south door need replacement as they are becoming a tripping hazard.

Worship and Music— Ash Wednesday service will be held on Wednesday, February 18th at 7 pm, in the Sanctuary. Lenten services will be held at 7 pm in Fellowship Hall. Easter Sunday Service (April 5) will be at 8:30 am. Installation of council members will be during services on February 15.

Stewardship— no report

Fellowship— no report.

Old Business: Updated Scandia Rental Agreement for use of facilities was reviewed and discussed. Some changes were suggested. Motion by Cheryl, seconded by Kevin, to approve agreement with noted changes; motion carried.

Council discussed the ballot for the election of council and team members at the annual meeting. There are still some open positions for the council and teams. The ballot will be finalized for the Annual Meeting. Council members will be installed during services on Sunday, February 15, 2026.

Council reviewed the proposed budget for 2026. Motion was made by Char, seconded by Philip, to approve proposed budget and submit it to the congregation for a vote at the Annual Meeting on January 25, 2026.

New Business: The office computer used by the secretary needs replacement/update as it is causing problems. Daniel will check with Quint Pease for a bid on a replacement.

The group discussed serving coffee after Lenten services and holding Easter brunch after the 8:30 am service. Ministry team members will be contacted about plans to serve coffee and cookies at Lenten services. Council discussed offering cinnamon rolls and fruit for Easter Brunch.

Members debated cleaning the carpet or spot-cleaning stains and agreed to possibly consider cleaning the carpet during the summer.

Council was updated on brochures for the new stained-glass windows. Brochures that were prepared for dedication were donated to the church. Photos will be taken of the installed windows, and a brochure will be put together using those photos. The cost to print that brochure will be about \$250.

Daniel suggested obtaining quotes for a TV in the family room so parents with young children can follow the service. The handheld microphones are no longer working. Another proposed project is to add equipment to share the media system feed in the fellowship hall.

It was noted that ceiling fans in the sanctuary could be left on during the winter months, as they help to circulate the heat in that area of the church building.
 It was suggested that a wish list of needs and projects for the church be created to help potential donors who are asking what they can designate donations for.
 Motion was made by Kory, seconded by Vonni, to go into Executive Session at 8:55 pm. Daniel declared the Council out of executive session at 9:25 pm.
 The next council meeting will be held on February 18, 2026, following Ash Wednesday Services.
 Motion to adjourn meeting by Kory, seconded by Cheryl; motion carried.
