

Magdalena Hermann won first prize and \$100, she was accompanied by Tess Shaw. Ella Gove won second prize and \$50 and she was accompanied by Becky Baker, and Ethan Chang won third prize and \$25 and he was accompanied by Soo Yeon Park.

In addition to the competition, we had 25 students play in the festival, as well. It was a full schedule and was held at Reagan Elementary in the Panama Buena Vista Union School District. Due to Covid and other factors we were lucky to have Reagan Elementary as our backup location and our two judges were April Merritt, violin teacher, and subbing for a late cancellation, Amy McGuire.

We have already chosen our music for the workshop and are scheduling our events for the upcoming school year. Our string workshop has been so successful we are continuing with the same format. The Fall String Workshop will have five levels including beginners. The beginner session last year was such a hit, there were 85 students for that level. So we are offering beginners again.

<u>Fresno Section</u>

Last year the FresnoASTA board has been hard at work to bringing back our annual events which included our chamber music workshop, the student recital, and the solo competition.

The Chamber Music Workshop was our first in-person event since the beginning of the pandemic and was held on Saturday, March 19, 2022, at the Westminster Presbyterian Church in Fresno. The workshop took place from 9:00 AM till 12:00 PM and concluded with an informal recital at 12:00 PM. Due to space limitations, we had only four groups participate with a total of 13 students. Our coaches were Julia Copeland, Lianna Elmore, MaPhew Smoke and Thomas Loewenheim, and the groups included students of Kelvin Diaz Inoa, Lianna Elmore, Thomas Loewenheim, Cynthia Stuart and Limor Toren-Immerman. Our second event was the FresnoASTA student recital that was held on Saturday, May 14, 2022 also at the Westminster Presbyterian Church. We had 20 students perform in the recital and had representation of the studios of Thomas Loewenheim, Laura Porter, K.C. Simba-Torres, Cynthia Stuart and Limor Toren-Immerman

Our second event was the FresnoASTA student recital that was held on Saturday, May 14, 2022 also at the Westminster Presbyterian Church. We had 20 students perform in the recital and had representation of the studios of Thomas Loewenheim, Laura Porter, K.C. Simba-Torres, Cynthia Stuart and Limor Toren-Immerman.

Our annual student solo competition was held on Saturday, June 4, 2022 at the California State University, Fresno, Department of Music. The competition was open to string players (Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Classical Guitar and Harp) who are students of active FresnoASTA members. We had 18 students compete and modelled our competition to align with the State competition and have three age divisions: the Novice division, age 12 and under, the Junior division, age 13-18, and the Senior division, age 19-25. Represented studios were those of Kelvin Diaz-Inoa, Yuliya Hess, Thomas Loewenheim, Thi Nguyen, and Limor Toren-Immerman.

In the Novice Division (age 12 and under), the first place and the award of \$50.00 went to cellist Daniel Lien, a student of Dr. Thomas Loewenheim. The second place went to violist Myla Demsey, a student of Ms. Yuliya Hess. Two honorable mentions were given to violinist Emmanuel Loewenheim, a student of Dr. Limor Toren-Immerman, and cellist Natalie Han, a student of Dr. Loewenheim. The four were recommended for the State Competition in October.

In the Junior Division (13-18), the first place and the award of \$100.00 went to violinist Alexander Han, a student of Dr. Toren-Immerman. A honorable mention was also given to cellist Renard Wu, a student of Dr. Loewenheim. Both were recommended for the State Competition.

In the Senior Division, the first place and the award of \$150.00 was given to cellist Kelvin Diaz Inoa, a student of Dr. Loewenheim.

The competition also awarded a special award. the Fresno Musical Club - Hildred Minich Scholarship of \$1,000 to an outstanding string player who has placed in the 2022 Solo Competition. The winner of the special award, which goes to cover tuition fees for college education, was awarded to violinist Alexander Han.

The esteemed judges, violist Gina Coled, chair of the Ed and Mari Edelman Chamber Music Institute at the Colburn Community School of Performing Arts, and viola teacher at Colburn's Community School of Performing Arts and Music Academy, and cellist Bongshin Ko, Professor of Cello and Vice Director at California State University Fullerton School of Music, were very impressed with the high level and great work all the students presented.

This week the board met to plan this year's events which will include the chamber music workshop, the annual FresnoASTA recital, the FresnoASTA Solo Competition, and the Jazz/Folk/Improvisation for Strings workshop. Other events that promote string teaching and performing that the FresnoASTA chapter co-sponsors are the Cello|Fresno international cello festival, and the Fresno State Violin and Viola Festival.

We are excited to welcome Trina Hodgson as a Co-Chair to the bowed strings competition next year. Many thanks to board member, Fung Ho, for his help in securing a generous grant of \$5,000 from the Hennings- Fischer Foundation which helps our finalists with the additional costs of performing in the Final round.

Our solo guitar competition ran into complications due to COVID restrictions with our venue so was not held this year.

Grant Program: We were able to award 2 grants and present 1 "webinar" with our funds.

Funds were awarded to Suzuki Music Program LA's Bach in the Subway Program in March to help with rental and pianist fees. We presented an online webinar "From Bach to Bebop" in April. It was presented by Jason Anick who helped us explore classical string players can benefit from exploring the harmonic progressions in Bach's music and use the progressions as an introduction to jazz improvising Funds were awarded to Education Through Music LA for a teacher training session in August. The session was open to all string teachers and was presented by Richard Meyers. Topics included: beginning-intermediate string technique, proper set-up & foundation, building & developing your program from day 1, and building effective sectional/rehearsal routines.

ASTACAP: Our in person ASTACAP program held quarterly (March/June/September/ December) continues to expand under the leadership of co-chairs, Kay Pech and Nick Alvarez. In March of 2022 ASTACAP exams were held in Pasadena, Woodland Hills, Azusa Pacific University, Santa Ana AFM Local 7 Performance Hall, CSUN, and Viewpoint School...As of Spring 2022 we have had 21 violin teachers enroll 80 violin students, 5 viola teachers enrolled 6 viola students, 7 cello teachers enrolled 25 cello students, 1 double bass teacher enrolled 4 double bass students, and 1 harp teacher has enrolled 4 harp students.

Stephanie Railsback is now retired from the Board after thirteen years of service. She wrote us a snippet about her term on the board of CalASTA San Francisco as the ASTACAP Coordinator:



I started the SF section ASTACAP program in 2009. The program was started in the East Coast ASTA states, and when I read about it I was very excited to try it with my students. I was the ASTACAP chair for 10 years, and I also met with the Stockton section to introduce the program to them so they could start their own ASTACAP program. In 2018 I served on a national task force to revise the ASTACAP Handbook. I was an active member of the board and also helped with other programs in the CalASTA SF section.
