Reylynn Imai

"When I was ten, I was introduced to my first little violin by an amazing teacher, Mr. Maloney, in my Folsom Cordova school district orchestra class. What was special about Mr. Maloney was his passion not just about the violin, but about music in general. He would tell us inspiring stories of composers and introduce us to the hidden stories folded within symphonies. I developed a great affection for the violin, and a deep passion for music. Today, I hope to inspire my own students to not just play violin, but develop a love for music, and I absolutely love being able to play my fiddle in such a wide array of places. I find myself playing Annie one night, Shostakovich's 6th another, and finishing the week with playing with the band at a Sacramento Cafe."

Graduating from California State University Sacramento with a Bachelor of Music in Performance, and a Bachelor of Arts in Humanities in 2001, Reylynn later returned to university to receive her Master of Arts in Humanities from San Francisco

State University, with a focus on Music and its representations in the act of mourning and memorial. She has performed with the Camellia Symphony as assistant concert mistress, and currently plays as principal second, and in various chamber ensembles including the Woodland Opera House Orchestra, The Afternoon Teacups, and Vox Musica. Reylynn has also recorded for various local Sacramento bands including An Angle, Christopher Fairman, Adrian Bourgeois, Doombird, Exquisite Corps, David Houston, and Sal Valentino. She currently performs with David Houston and String Theory, and Delta Strings Quartet.

After twenty amazing years of teaching at the local Sacramento store, Kline Music, Reylynn began a new chapter with a home studio in 2018. She finds great joy when her students join her alma mater, the Sacramento Youth Symphony or pursue a degree in music. Her goal for her students is to not only teach them strong performance technique and musical theory, but a love of music in all styles and genres. She spends her time outside of the studio and performing, chasing her preschooler, and running half marathons (not much more running than that of chasing her son).

# **Annual Section Solo Competition Guidelines**

#### Rm. 115 Music Building UC Davis, Davis, CA 95616 Sunday June 4, 2023, 9:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

This competition is open to students of violin, viola, cello, bass, classical guitar, and harp whose teachers are ASTA members.

- 1. Student must live within the area of the Sacramento ASTA section. (18 counties)
- 2. There are three age divisions: 1) *Novice*, 12 & under 2) *Junior*, 13 18 3) *Senior*, 19 25. The age cutoff date is 5/12/2023.
- 3. The judges may declare a winner on each instrument in each age group.
- 4. Winners in the Novice, Junior and Senior divisions and other participants deemed qualified by the judges, will be eligible to participate in California ASTA's State Competition which will be held in Southern California in the Fall of 2024. State Competitions are held in even numbered years.
- 5. Each first-place winner will receive a certificate and a cash award of \$100.00.
- 6. All entrants will receive written comments from two judges.

### **Repertoire and Performance**

- Two works, played from memory, are required: one movement by J.S. Bach from the solo literature (novices may play any Baroque piece not limited to solo Bach) and one from a contrasting period (Classical, Romantic, 20th century, etc.)
- Each performance may not exceed 10 minutes for Novices and Juniors, and 15 minutes for Seniors. Piano accompaniment is required where appropriate. There are many rooms (with piano) for warm-up at the site.

### **Application and Fee Information**

The application and appropriate fees made payable to *ASTA Sacramento Section* must be postmarked no later than May 19, 2023.
