

General Guidelines

- 1. Open to string players (Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Classical Guitar or Harp) who are students of active California ASTA members.
- 2. Entrants must have participated in their ASTA Section Competition in either 2021 or 2022, and have been declared eligible by the judges to advance to the State Competition.
- 3. Sections may submit as many entrants as the judges in their section competitions deem qualified.
- 4. There are three age divisions: Novice, age 12 and under, Junior, age 13-18, and Senior, age 19-25. The cutoff date for the age divisions is the date of the competition, which is October 22, 2022.
- 5. The judges will declare one winner for each instrument, in each age division: Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Classical Guitar and Harp.
- 6. Any state winner may not compete again in the same age category, but must wait until they reach the correct age for the next age category.
- 7. Competition will be presented as a formal recital. All contestants will receive a certificate of participation the day of the event. Winners will be announced within two days and prize money will be mailed to the individual winners. The prize awards are as follows: \$150 for Novice, \$200 for Junior and \$300 for Senior.
- 8. All confirmations will be sent to students via email.

Repertoire and Performance

- 1. Two works are required. One piece from the Classical or Baroque period, and another one from a contrasting period. All works must be memorized. Performances may not exceed 10 minutes for Novice Division or 15 minutes for Junior and Senior Division entrants (both pieces combined). Pieces may be pre-cut in order to fit the time limit, or the judges may stop a performance once the time limit has been reached. Judges may also ask candidates to play any part of a piece.
- 2. Piano accompaniment is required where appropriate.

Application Deadline and Fees

- Applications and appropriate fees made payable to CalASTA must be postmarked by July 1, 2022. An entrance fee of \$50.00 must accompany each application.
- 2. A professional accompanist can be provided by ASTA for a fee of \$50.00, which must be requested and paid for at the time of application. The accompanist will provide a brief pre-performance run-through. If more time for run-through is desired, the competitor will be charged according to his/her assigned accompanist's personal rate. Competitors must request the additional time with their applications, so that arrangements may be made.

CalASTA Bakersfield Section State Report January 23, 2022, we have had a wonderful few months in the Bakersfield strings world, we had our Annual String Workshop in person! We had five groups this year. The beginning strings played Blue Jeans Blues all on open strings, the clinician was violinist Amy McGuire. Level I played Perpetual Motion, the clinician was Julia Haney, Concertmaster of the Bakersfield Symphony Orchestra (BSO). Level II played Rigaudon, the clinician was bassist Sheldon Schelsinger. Level III played The Theme from Witches Dance, the clinician was cellist Paul Young, Asst. Principal in the BSO. Level IV played La Cinquantain, the clinician was violist Dr. Tom Tatton. Each group got one hour with a professional on their instrument and one hour with the appropriate song for their choice. The last 30 minutes each group played for one another in the Seibert Cafetorium. The attendance for this October 23, 2021, workshop was magnificent. Due to Covid no beginners were started last year, which meant that all 5th and 6th

graders started together in September. Although our enrollment was limited last year and class sizes are down this year, the beginners turned out strong and we had over 80 beginners in attendance, all playing open strings to Blue Jeans Blues. It was a fun and exciting experience, especially for the 80 beginners who had their first ever performance! It was quite an event at Seibert Elementary. There were 11 local ASTA members in attendance, as well. We especially want to thank Rebekah Stambook, principal at Seibert Elementary School and our host music teacher, Ambra Williams, who is also treasurer for our Bakersfield Section. February 16 will be a special event in collaboration with CalASTA at Cal State University Bakersfield. A two-hour seminar on "The Joy of Practice" presented by Dr. Tom Tatton. We are fortunate to have him as he prepares for the National Viola Congress in March 2022. We get to have a sneak preview of his tricks and talents as we experience "The Joy of Practice." The event will be on the eve of the CASMEC Conference. Come to Bakersfield as a half-way point to Fresno, CA. and attend this joyful event! Call and RSVP with Amy McGuire 661-858-9332, if you plan to attend the seminar at CSUB on February 16, 2022, we also anticipate that our Spring Solo Festival and Competition will be live and tentatively on Saturday April 30, 2022. Last year it was online and this year we hope to have it live at the Valley Baptist Church on Fruitvale Avenue. We will be booking our judges as soon as the date is finalized. Having over 100 students attend our Fall Workshop was very helpful, so we can afford to hire adjudicators for our solo festival and competition in the spring. Also, this spring, we will have a nominating committee for our CalASTA Bakersfield Section Officers. I think everybody's settling into their jobs on the board however, we would like to invite new members to join the board, as well. We will establish a nominating committee at our next meeting. We are still encouraging new membership for our Bakersfield section.

Fresno Section

The Fresno ASTA board has been hard at work to bring back our annual events which will include our chamber music workshop, the student recital, and the solo competition.

We are planning to hold a modified version of our yearly Chamber Music Workshop for the first time in two years on Saturday, March 19, 2022, at the Westminster Presbyterian Church in Fresno. The workshop will take place from 9:00 AM till 12:00 PM and will conclude with an informal recital at 12:00 PM. Unlike previous years, there will be no lunch time and we will follow strict Covid rules to protect our faculty and students. Students must show proof of full vaccination and must always wear a mask while indoors. Family members and guests who come to the informal recital in the

Sanctuary must wear masks and sit at least 6 feet apart from other families.

Due to limited space available to us at this venue, we can't accommodate beginning students as we have in the past. We will be screening applications to form compatible groups with similar technical levels and music reading abilities. Students who are accepted into this modified workshop will receive an email with the main piece of music each group will be working on during the workshop so coaches can concentrate on going beyond the basics of playing together.

The annual student recital will take place on Saturday, May 14, 2022, at the Westminster Presbyterian Church. Fresno ASTA teachers are asked to send 2-3 students representing each studio in town. This is a great opportunity for our students and colleagues to see the work that is done in other studios.

Our annual student solo competition is planned for Saturday, June 4, 2022, at the California State University, Fresno, Department of Music. The competition will be open to string players (Violin, Viola, Cello, Double Bass, Classical Guitar and Harp) who are students of active Fresno ASTA members. We modelled our competition to align with the State competition and have three age divisions: the Novice division, age 12 and under, the Junior division, age 13-18, and the Senior division, age 19-25. Students will be asked to perform two works, one from the Classical or Baroque period, and another one from a contrasting period. The competition this year is planned to be in person as in the past.

The Housewright Awards were created in order to give recognition, performance experience, and professional evaluations to musicians that are enrolled in their **school music programs**, both public and private, and to help **stimulate student participation** in those programs. In addition to special recognition awards and cash prizes up to \$100 which can be exchanged for private lessons with a specialist from our SF section roster.
