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Letter from the Head of School



With my eighth year as Head in the rear view mirror, I can safely say that no two years have been the same since I took on this role. The 2024-2025 school year brought delights and triumphs—important ballast for the turbulence we have experienced culturally in that time. Here, the year was marked by a tremendous retention rate from the previous year; major campus improvements to our playground and Community Room; Anne Marie Richard's final year as Board Chair; and exciting additions, returns, and shifts among our talented and experienced faculty.

Our administrative team was fortunate to attend a two-day workshop on small school leadership with

other Bay Area private school leaders. The concrete ideas and strategies we exchanged were the often-rare, true professional development gems that we seek to reinvigorate ourselves in the name of better serving our community. It continues to be both a joy and an honor to do this work.

Letter from the Treasurer

EBM generated slightly higher income during fiscal year 2024–2025, driven primarily by a modest rise in the average enrollment. While costs increased at a higher rate, this was partially offset by stronger interest income. As a result, the school recorded an operating loss similar to the prior year. Despite this, EBM's overall financial position remains robust, and the school is well-positioned for continued growth and reinvestment.

Revenues

Tuition revenues increased modestly, supported by a slight rise in average enrollment. Financial aid remained at an elevated level, reflecting our ongoing commitment to accessibility. Other contributions continued at a steady, modest pace.



Expenses

Overall expenses rose, largely due to higher employment costs. EBM remains dedicated to providing appropriate salary adjustments and maintaining staffing levels that support current and future enrollment. Non-operating results turned positive, helped by a significant increase in interest income. Even with this support, ordinary income remained negative, roughly in line with the prior year.

Financial Position

EBM's financial footing remains strong. As the school owns its real estate, maintains prudent leverage, and holds a healthy cash balance, the school is well positioned for continued growth and long-term sustainability as it intentionally reinvests in program quality.

Trip highlights:

- 6th Year students represented Brazil.
- 7th and 8th Year students represented a combination of Malta, Sierra Leone, and the United Arab Emirates.
- Annual frigid nighttime gelato run.
- Two EBM 6th Year students were selected to present at the Closing Bureau, the celebratory final day of the conference that takes place on the floor of the actual United Nations General Assembly in New York City. During this ceremony, these students (selected by a vote of committee peers) present the consensus reached by their committee on the humanitarian topic they spent the week addressing.
- An EBM alumna, who attended as a Bureau Member (high school student leading the younger students), had the honor of presenting at the Closing Bureau as well.
