TCAA 2009 Cesery Recipient



Donald W. Schwartz

onald W. Schwartz, retired owner of Selectile of California has been selected as the 2009 recipient of the prestigious Carl V. Cesery Award. The award will be presented at the TCAA 2009 Convention scheduled for September 26-28 in Chicago, Illinois.

Don's involvement in the tile industry of Southern California has been extensive. He served on the board of the Ceramic Tile Institute, was one of the first graduates of its Ceramic Tile Consultants (CTC) course and later became a member of its Planning and Steering Committee. He was president of the Associated Tile Contractors of Southern California and served for many years on various committees such as the Arbitration Board, the local Trust Fund and Joint Apprentice Committee.

From the age of 17, when Don was hired by the founder of Selectile, James Kay, to work summers and vacations in the warehouse, he began learning the various aspects of the business from the ground up. In 1986 Don became the sole owner of Selectile of California and remained

there until his retirement in 2001. Under Don's leadership, Selectile won numerous awards from both the Ceramic Tile Institute and the Tile Contractors Association of America for its workmanship and beauty of tile installations throughout Southern California in both residential and commercial installations. In 1986 the Ceramic Tile Institute awarded five craftsmanship awards to Selectile - the most ever presented in a single year to a single contractor. The Ceramic Tile Institute also presented its highest personal honor, The Golden Tile Award, to Don. A year later, the Western States Ceramic Tile Association presented Don its highest honor, naming him "Contractor of the Year."

Don became a member of TCAA in the 1980's. He served many years on the TCAA Board and was honored to serve as its president in 1996 and 1997. Please join us in offering congratulations to Don.
