

In January 2019, Ithaca School District was approached by Upper 90 for an opportunity to improve the district's energy efficiency and address capital needs that are challenging to fit into the annual operating budget. A project was approved by the Board of Education in April, and the work was completed in the summer/fall of 2019.

The majority of the work consisted of window replacement and converting all remaining pneumatic controls to digital Other work controls. involved upgrading to LED lighting throughout the district, eliminating air leakage by the buildina sealing envelope, eliminating stratified air by using destratification fans, and optimizing the HVAC system through strategies such as implemention of demand-controlled ventilation, adding variable frequency drives to mechanical equipment, and refining equipment sequences operation, schedules, and temperature set points.
