



Bulletin Blurb for the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Praised be Jesus Christ!

We have celebrated the Birth of Our Lord and all of the feasts that follow that most joyous occasion, such as the Baptism of Our Lord and the Feast of the Epiphany, marking the coming of those three mysterious kings. Now that we have entered into the season of "Ordinary Time", the question remains: after the Incarnation, could anything at all ever be "ordinary" ever again? It is important to know that our liturgical calendar has deep biblical roots stemming from the days when the Israelites would celebrate feasts and holy days to better enter into the presence of God. Following an agricultural theme, the seven major feasts captured the acts of God in the life of Israel. Now, the five major liturgical seasons (Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time) of our Catholic Church are meant to do much of the same for us: help us better enter in the presence of God by especially recalling the works of our Lord and how it continues to unfold throughout time. The season of Ordinary Time may seem to be tedious, marking 33 weeks of the year, being the longest liturgical season in our calendar, but I believe that is very much the point. Ordinary Time is called as such, not because this season is less significant than the others (although it certainly feels that way at times!) but because it stems from the Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, and the prefix stemming from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word "order". Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time represent the ordered life of the Church. It is in these 33 ordered and numbered weeks that we too, the Body of the Church, are called to better order our own lives. The vast majority of Jesus' own life was lived in total obscurity, without any mention of His life between the ages of 12 and 30 years of age; Jesus' own life was lived out primarily in daily labors with His Virginal Father, Joseph, in their humble carpenter's shop. Our lives are primarily lived out in total obscurity, which at times may feel lonely or unnoteworthy, but it is in these moments where the call to holiness and the ordering of the entirety of our lives is primarily tested. Are we willing to follow the Lord when big moments are presented to us? I think a better and much more frequented question that may or may not linger on our hearts is: Am I willing to follow the Lord in the "ordinariness" of my day-to-day life? This Second Sunday of Ordinary Time is the perfect opportunity for all of us to prayerfully reflect on all of those daily ways in which we can more heroically order our lives towards a greater call to holiness.

FAITH FORMATION

In today's Gospel, we hear about the first sign that Jesus performs at the wedding feast at Cana. This sign tells us about God's kingdom. We believe that the Kingdom of God will be like an extraordinary feast generously prepared for us by God. We are invited to participate in this kingdom. Mary serves as our model. At the wedding feast at Cana, Mary observed a human need and presented it to Jesus, confident that Jesus would respond. We follow Mary's example when we bring our needs and the needs of our world to God in prayer, confident that God will answer our prayers in extraordinary ways. Not every day is a wedding celebration, but we can anticipate the Kingdom of God each day in our attentiveness to one another's needs.

During the month of January, our classes will meet on Tuesdays, January 20 and 27, and on Wednesdays, January 21 and 28.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATE GUIDELINES

Our Parish receives many requests for Sponsor Certificates from people who have been asked to be a Godparent at a Baptism or a Sponsor at a Confirmation. This Certificate verifies that you are an active Catholic, a member of this parish and eligible for this honor. Being a Godparent or a Sponsor is not just a family or social relationship, as important as these may be. It is a profound spiritual responsibility which entails witness and commitment.

There are several requirements:

1. *The Godparent/Sponsor is to be more than sixteen years of age.*
2. *(S)He is to have received the Sacraments of Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation and live a life of faith which befits the role to be undertaken.*
3. *If married, the Sponsor/Godparent must have been married according to the laws of the Church.*
4. *Is neither the father nor the mother of the person.*

For the Pastor to issue a Sponsor Certificate:

1. You need to be a currently registered member of our parish.
2. You worship here regularly.
3. Please request your Sponsor Certificate yourself.
4. Please **allow 3 weeks** to process your request.
