Bulletin Blurb for the Feast of the Holy Family

Praised be Jesus Christ!

A very Merry and Blessed Christmas to you all! I sincerely hope that you all had a joyous Christmas celebration surrounded by family and friends, giving all praise and glory to the newborn King. Additionally, I hope that this celebration of our Lord's birth into this world has not yet concluded. There is much debate in our society as to when the proper time to take down decorations and remove the Christmas tree is to be completed by; rather than ask what best practices and what the social norm is, let us turn towards the proper celebrations as given to us by our faith and the incarnational way in which we celebrate it. We celebrate for eight days (or the Octave) the celebration of Christmas as is evidenced by the prayers of our Mass, namely, the Gloria, which has been omitted for the entirety of the Advent season. That being said, properly speaking, the Christmas season extends from the Christmas Vigil through the Baptism of the Lord, which is celebrated on Sunday, January 11th. Prior to the Second Vatican Council and the changing of the liturgical calendar, Christmas (or Christmastide) would have lasted 40 days and concluded with Candlemas, or the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd. You may be thinking, “Father, who cares?” and you are free to ask that valid question, but my response would be, “Let’s leave our decorations up for 40 days! “ Christmas, unlike any other Christian holiday, seems to be a celebration that even secular culture is excited about (albeit, at times, for the wrong or imperfect reasons). Decorating according to the proper celebrations themselves, such as not putting the Magi into your Nativity scenes until the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6 (because they have not yet arrived!) or leaving your Christmas decorations up until we celebrate Candlemas on February 2nd both point towards the reality that we do not simply celebrate some vague truth. What we celebrate, with joyful and heartfelt praise, is something that truly occurred in history.

God really did become Incarnate at the “fiat” of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Jesus really was born into the world, and the newborn King was truly greeted by three kings from the east. While the timing of when we put up and when we take down our decorations may not be the most important act of evangelization the world has ever known, I would argue that every act of evangelization has the power to spark one more conversation with an eternal soul that may be reaching out for that which you and I share and hold most dear: a love of Jesus Christ and His Church. May this (entire) Christmas season be filled with blessings and an ever greater chance to encounter the Lord in a more profound way for whom we meet!
