# Bulletin Blurb for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Praised be Jesus Christ!

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that "The Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life'." We know this to be absolutely true because we profess, not only with our lips but with the entirety of our bodies in worship, that the Eucharist is the same Jesus Christ who died on the Cross and who rose from the dead. God is the source of all that is good, and the Eucharist is God Himself: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. This is a truth of the faith that is undeniable and absolute; to fail to profess that what looks, smells, and tastes like bread, is actually Jesus Christ, is to effectively renounce one's own Catholic Christian Faith.

This admittedly might come across as much too harsh, but the reality is that we profess Christ to be the "King of Kings" and the "King of Heaven and Earth". What king does not have a kingdom or boundaries? None of them do! If Christ is King (which He most certainly is), then He has a kingdom and that kingdom has boundaries. These boundaries are not physical borders, separating kingdom from kingdom or nation from nation. Rather, the boundaries of Jesus' kingdom are the boundaries of these truths of the faith, which firmer than any wall of brick or mortar, make up the parameters of what it means to be a Catholic Christian.

No one could be labeled as "harsh" or "bigoted" for telling someone that they are no longer in the boundaries of a particular region when they step outside of those boundaries, do we approach this same quandary. If we fail to profess the objective and immutable truths of the faith, such as the reality of the Eucharist, can we truly proclaim ourselves to be Catholic Christian? This proclamation is made not only on an intellectual level but that proclamation is made by how we approach and receive the Eucharist, how we conduct ourselves in the presence of the Eucharist, and in every interaction that we have near where our Lord is present in the Eucharist.
