

Seminarian Column for the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"'The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest". This is the mandate our Lord gives seventy-two of his disciples as He sends them out to the various towns He planned to visit. His point is clear, the number of people ripe for conversion, ready to receive the good news of Jesus, far outpaces the number of disciples available to preach the Gospel. This is clearly a challenge to the disciples in our Gospel story today, but I think it's a challenge to us as well.

Surely the situation is not much different today. Think of all the people who are waiting to receive the Gospel. Think of all the people who have no knowledge of Christ, who have never encountered Him, and whose lives are lived in opposition to Him, who desperately need to hear the Good News; the good news that God, the Lord and Creator of the universe, became man for each of us, died a painful death on the Cross for each of us, and rose from the dead and ascended into Heaven for each of us. Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection destroyed sin and death, and opened for us the way to eternal life with Him in His kingdom.

The spreading of this message is not reserved only to priests and religious. On the contrary, it is the duty of each and every baptized Christian. Speaking on this subject, the Second Vatican Council's decree on the role of the Laity in apostolic work, Apostolicam Actuositatem, says, "The apostolate in the social milieu, that is, the effort to infuse a Christian spirit into the mentality, customs, laws, and structures of the community in which one lives, is so much the duty and responsibility of the laity that it can never be performed properly by others" (Emphasis added). Put simply, it is largely impossible for priests to preach the Gospel in workplaces, schools, social clubs, and friend groups, because priests are not there. Rather, it falls to you, the laity, who are in these places to spread the Gospel of Christ. This will often be uncomfortable and difficult, just as it was for the seventy-two disciples. But if we truly live the Gospel in our lives and rely on God for courage and strength, we can proclaim Jesus Christ to those around us; we can become missionaries in our ordinary lives.

Who is OCIA for?

- Non-Catholics who want to find out more about the Catholic Faith.
- Those who want to join the Catholic Church through Baptism, or Profession of Faith.
- Those who were baptized Catholic as infants but never received religious education, Confirmation, or First Eucharist.

St. Joseph's OCIA program includes sessions of education, discussion, questions & answers, and fellowship. Our team includes mentors who recently went through the OCIA program, and can provide welcome and accompaniment to new seekers. You are invited to join our OCIA program. Sessions will begin in the Fall, and we will meet bi-weekly.
