

Bulletin Blurb for the 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Praised be Jesus Christ!

You may have noticed that the church looks a little brighter and a little more colorful this weekend than it has for the past several months and it is not because the sun is shining all the brighter outside. The first series of stained-glass windows that we sent away to be restored are now back inside, showing the full glory and splendor of what they must have looked like when they were first installed for the church's opening in the spring of 1905. The rose window above the organ, the windows in the sanctuary, and the annunciation window immediately next to the Blessed Virgin Mary's altar give us a glimpse of what your generosity has both brought back to our parish as well as ensure that it, please God, lasts until Jesus' second coming.

Many opponents of the Church (and some from within) will make the argument that we have too many things in the Catholic churches throughout the world: gold and silver, ornate chalices and monstrances, priceless artwork and sculptures. Those in opposition to the Church being in possession of these items would be correct, if the Church were, in fact, in possession of them. We are not. The Church is merely stewards of that which is most beautiful because they firstly belong to God, and then they belong to us all. Each and every visitor of our parish who steps foot into our beautiful church has the privilege of gazing upon our magnificent stained-glass windows and feeling what we are so blessed to feel each and every day.

Saint Paul writes in the second reading, "Put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly..." but notice that this list of that which is "earthly" does not mention the beauty that adorns so many Catholic churches throughout the world. The world is in desperate need of more beauty and we reject the idea that simplicity is the most beautiful thing in the world, which is often the argument of those who seek to strip that which is beautiful from these places of worship.

Bishop Robert Barron once said that "Beauty is the spearhead of evangelization." Beauty is not the entirety of what is necessary for evangelization, but for so many, it is the hook that draws them in. I have no doubt that our stained-glass windows glorify God and for all who venture to step foot into our church to see them, they will find the beauty of those who call this place home and He who is our Father, even more glorious.


