Bulletin Blurb for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Praised be Jesus Christ!

This past weekend we said goodbye to Father Harry as he heads down to Virginia for graduate studies in philosophy. While his absence will certainly be felt by all, we are grateful that he will be with us when he comes home for breaks and celebrates those essential holidays such as Christmas and Easter with our parish community. Many parishioners have shown great support and even expressed some concern, asking, "Father Silva, are you going to be OK by yourself?" or "Are you going to be able to manage everything without Father Harry?". The honest answer is, "By God's grace alone!".

Father Scott labored for many years as the solo priest in the parish and even though it is a blessing to have another priest working in a single parish, it is the reality of the times that we live in, where more and more parishes across the world are "single priest parishes". We are blessed to not have the same struggle that many brother priests have to navigate: a single priest for more than one parish.

The Gospel for this weekend shows Jesus' tender care for His disciples, calling them His, "little flock", and that is what we are indeed. He exhorts all of his disciples (not just His apostles...not just His priests) to be vigilant and to labor in His vineyard. While I may have been entrusted to you all as the shepherd of this parish, the parish belongs to each of us and as such, we are called to labor together. Whether we have one priest or eight, much of what this parish will accomplish and how it will grow will be a collaborative effort, requiring great prayer, volunteering, and work of each of its members. We are not all called to labor in the same exact way, but Mother Theresa provided us with the beautiful analogy of cups being filled; whether a cup be bigger or smaller than another, it is not about the size of the cup, but whether or not it is filled. To labor for God and to serve this parish belongs to all of us, so my prayer is that we fill up our cups, whatever size they may be, with this great and joyful responsibility together!
