

Bulletin Blurb for the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Praised be Jesus Christ!

You may have noticed a number of changes, renovations, and updates to our parish facilities so I would like to take this week's bulletin to direct your attention to those updates as well as to thank those who made them possible. Firstly, in the main street vestibule, because of your generosity in last year's October special collection, we have replaced the floor as well as painted. Additionally, we replaced the bulbs to make that vestibule much brighter. The placards honoring those who made the 1970's renovations of the church possible have been removed so that we can restore them in conjunction with the new placards that will go up in the church hall, honoring those who generously donated to our stained-glass restoration campaign. Soon we will be getting custom floor mats as well as framed images of both the holy father, Pope Leo and Bishop Caggiano.

While the painting company was here to restore the plaster in the vestibule and paint, we had them paint the sanctuary as well in order to highlight our newly restored stained-glass windows above the high altar. We moved the sanctuary lamps to a higher location in the sanctuary to prevent any of our altar servers from hitting their heads as well as to open up new space for things such as seating or additional credence tables.

We have a lot more renovation, restoration. and preservation projects coming for the near future and because of Father Scott's leadership and, again, your incredible generosity, the parish is in a wonderful financial position to complete these projects without incurring any debt or financial burden whatsoever. I wanted to thank, in particular, Brian Walsh, our facilities manager for bearing a significant amount of the burden of labor, saving us great costs on hiring outside companies. He had help from too many volunteers to name them all, but I wanted to thank Margie Heron as well as the Zilliox family. The entire staff here has been working tirelessly to complete all these projects in a relatively short amount of time, and I am incredibly grateful. Stay tuned for so much more and thank you again for all your generosity!
