Bulletin Blurb for the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Growing up, I remember that going to Mass was never less than an hour long. There might have been a few minutes shaved off if we managed to get up early enough to get to the earliest Sunday Mass with no music, but even then, the difference was barely noticeable. For whatever reason, and it may be my own narrow perception, it seems as though the duration of our current Masses, not just here at St. Joseph but everywhere, are much shorter, usually getting out with ten or so minutes to spare. While it perplexes me, I think that there is a goodness here that may not have been afforded to all 30 or so years ago.

Staying until the end of Mass is of supreme importance. The current Code of Canon Law (No. 1247) says simply, "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass." Note that it doesn't say "part" or "certain parts" of the Mass, but "obliged to participate in the Mass", which means the entirety of Mass. The Mass begins with the sign of the cross and ends with the dismissal and response, "thanks be to God". It is certainly a moral imperative to stay until at least the dismissal. I would like to encourage all of us to stay after the hymn has concluded in its entirety and possibly beyond that. Since the duration of Masses has seemed to shorten over the years, it affords all of us an opportunity to stay after, even if it is just for a short prayer of thanksgiving, after the hymn has concluded. After all, for everyone who has received the Blessed Sacrament in Communion, the infinite, incarnate God now literally dwells inside of you!

Please do not mistake this encouragement to stay longer at Mass as a chastisement of all who leave, especially for those who have something important to run to and have made it a priority to make it to Mass; there are certainly occasions for situations such as those. I would say that for those who wish to be perfect in their prayer or to elevate what the Sunday Mass can be, singing the final hymn to its conclusion and staying after to make a prayer of thanksgiving will most certainly have a profound and lasting effect on your spiritual life and will elevate your Sunday's as something far more than simply "the Sunday obligation". One of my favorite moments of the week is greeting you all after Mass but, rest assured, I am more than happy to wait for a little while if it means that you are spending a little more time communing with the Lord!

Please note that while the 4pm Saturday Mass is celebrated for All Saints Day, it does still count for one's Sunday obligation.


