Solemnity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ,
King of the Universe

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Advent is just a week away and the importance of preparing for the season is upon us! Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight. Advent is a time to recall the cry of the early Christians: "Come, Lord Jesus!" (*Maranatha!*), so we call upon Him in our hearts by preparing for His birth as best we possibly can.

How do we do this? Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving. We are giving out Magnificat Advent companions which highlight the readings as well as provide beautiful daily meditations to raise your eyes towards heaven in joyful anticipation of Our Lord's birth. Implementing some form of mortification such as a fast from foods, forms of media, technology, or music, align our whole person towards the celebration that has yet to come on December 25th. In this season, much is spent on decorations, gifts, celebration, and feasts, so why not make a generous gift towards the Church or another institution or charitable work, if for nothing else, to be reminded of the truth of why this celebratory season exists in the first place: Jesus Christ's birth! Each year it is typical to fall into a routine of some sort but let this year be different than the rest. Enter into Advent if it were your first Advent, as if it were your last Advent, as if it were your only Advent.

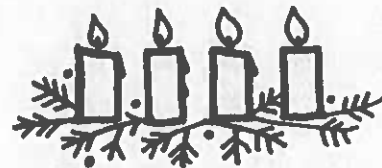

Three Simple Advent Tips

Advent makes us grateful to be Catholic:

It is full of beautiful, ancient traditions unique to our faith — an ideal time to instill a yearning for Christ in our kids, and in all of us.



During Advent, we can experience with our children what it was like to be an Old Testament people, longing for a Savior. *We can teach our children lessons about patience and learning to wait.* Seeing our children's excitement and joy about Christmas can renew our own love for Jesus. How can we not take the time to celebrate this Church season? Here are five easy things we've done over the years in our home:

1. *Put an Advent wreath on your dinner table and light it each night for dinner.*

Don't let this age-old tradition only be seen in Church on Sunday! The wreath symbolizes more than just the four weeks of Advent; the four candles can also represent the 4,000 years man was on earth before the Savior was born. The kids can take turns lighting and blowing out the candles. We usually say a short prayer like, "Come, Lord Jesus, be born in our hearts."

2. *Do active works of mercy to prepare for the Savior.*

Advent is a time of preparation, and we all need tangible ways to prepare spiritually for the birth of Jesus. Put up a small manger somewhere in your home or outside, and each time any member of the family does something for the love of Jesus, he or she can put a strand of hay in the crib. It's a blessing to see the manger get fuller and fuller for Jesus as Christmas nears. Don't put Jesus in until Christmas Eve! We've also seen some families do a similar version of this with paper chains that they then use to decorate the Christmas tree.

3. *Do something spiritual for yourself.*

Can you add in a short prayer time or Bible reading each morning during Advent or perhaps even a daily Rosary? It just might turn into a great habit. Take advantage of any spiritual happenings in your parish, too. Pray that Christmas will bring you a new zeal and deeper love for Christ this year.

St. Joseph Church's GIVING TREE

The Angel tags for St. Joseph's Annual "Giving Tree" project are in the baskets in Church.

Please consider taking an Angel for you/your family or sharing an Angel with someone else, to help fulfill the wishes of our neighbors in need! The agencies tell us that in many cases, these gifts may be the *only ones* that people will receive for Christmas. Last year, our Parish made a difference in the lives of over 300 of our Danbury-area neighbors. Agency information is on the Parish website.

HOW THE GIVING TREE WORKS: Each local agency/organization identifies their clients (Adults and/or Children) who are in need, and assists them in making their holiday "wish lists". Each desired gift is listed on an Angel tag for someone to select and purchase the gift.

o **CHOOSE AN ANGEL:** *Angel tags for the Giving Tree are in baskets in the Church.* Please remember to take a photo of, write down the tag information, or at least the *Letters & Number code* (such as "#DCF46") for any Angels you choose in case you lose your Angel. We can look up all of the information you need by the code, etc...

o **HOW TO PREPARE GIFTS:** Gifts should all be wrapped *unless otherwise noted on each Angel.* If you purchased more than one gift for the same person, please either tie those gifts together or put them all together in a gift bag. The recipient's name on the Angel tag should be visible and tag securely attached to the gifts/gift bag please-this is important, because it will allow us, as well as the agencies to know who the gifts are for.

o **WHERE TO LEAVE GIFTS:** Wrapped gifts can be brought to Church *any day during regular Church hours* and should be left in/next to the marked bins in the Church vestibules (side & Main St). They will be collected daily.

o **DEADLINE FOR BRINGING WRAPPED* GIFTS TO CHURCH: **WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 10th**** please, so that agencies have enough time to distribute them before Christmas.

Dear Friends in Christ,

In every age of the Church, the Lord has provided faithful shepherds—men who have offered their lives so that others might encounter Christ in the sacraments. Over the decades, our priests have baptized our children, witnessed our marriages, comforted us in times of grief, and nourished us with the Eucharist.

Our parish priests have been true spiritual fathers, and as they age, it is our duty to care for them with the same generosity they have shown us. **To meet this responsibility, our diocese has established the St. John Vianney Trust, an independent non-profit with the sole mission of caring for our senior and infirm priests in the Diocese of Bridgeport.**

It is important to recognize that retirement does not end a priest's ministry. Senior priests continue to celebrate Mass, hear confessions, and offer pastoral guidance wherever they are needed. Our diocese has more than 70 priests past retirement age, a number that is projected surpass 100 priests within 15 years.

Despite dramatically rising healthcare costs, our diocese is committed to providing care for our older priests, but we need more financial resources to do so. Your generosity will ensure that these faithful men, many of whom serve well into their eighties, can continue to minister and live their remaining years with dignity.

Scripture reminds us to "honor your father and mother" (Ex 20:12), and that "kindness to a father will not be forgotten" (Sir 3:14). This principle certainly applies to our earthly fathers, but it is equally true of our spiritual fathers—our parish priests. And so I invite you to give generously to the Faith of Our Fathers campaign.

Finally, please join me in praying for our beloved priests who have passed away, as well as those who are in the autumn of life. As their strength wanes, our support must grow stronger.
