

Bulletin Blurb for the First Sunday of Advent

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Last week we included a bulletin insert that included encouragement to try and make daily Mass a part of your Advent preparations in anticipation of the Lord's birth. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that Mass is the perfect prayer because it makes present the actual Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of the same Jesus Christ whose birth we wait with joyful anticipation to celebrate. For all of those who make this a regular part of your life of prayer, we all, including myself, can even perfect that practice of attending daily Mass more and more with each Mass we participate in. If Mass is indeed a prayer (which it is!), and prayer is simply a conversation with God, it is advantageous for all of us to try and apply the same logic to how we attend Mass and participate.


Here are a few tips that may make your prayer all the more efficacious when attending daily Mass (or any Mass). Firstly, try and make silence before and after Mass; before Mass, to prepare your mind and heart to enter into the sacrifice on calvary and afterwards to thank God for having received Him (or if you did not receive Holy Communion, to have consoled Jesus for having been present at His crucifixion). Secondly, try and attend Mass as if it were the first time you have ever attended. It is always important to try to, as best we possibly can, know what is going on during the Mass, but sometimes instead of performing the actions of Mass (i.e., responding, standing, sitting, kneeling), it looks more like we are waiting to respond. If prayer is a conversation, then we should be listening attentively to what God is saying through the words of the Mass, rather than just simply waiting to respond or for the next action to take. Thirdly, try your best to respond with the rest of the congregation. When we sing, the melody keeps us from going too fast or going to slow; in the same light, we should treat our responses at Mass. This was certainly part of the mindset of the second Vatican Council in changing the Mass from Latin into the vernacular.

As a priest, I celebrate Mass sometimes multiple times a day and I myself (along with every other priest) always run the risk of treating the Mass as mere actions or having a "task-oriented mind". In that light, please receive these tips as suggestions much more than any sort of criticisms because a parish who worships together (well!), stays together! Be assured of my prayers, especially from the altar, as we begin this sacred Advent season together.


Choose an Angel: Angel tags for the Giving
