


Bulletin Blurb for the Third Sunday of Advent

Praised be Jesus Christ!

You may have noticed that music at Sunday Masses has looked differently than how we have normally had in previous Sundays. We are chanting the entrance and communion antiphons before beginning the entrance and communion hymns, we are omitting organ accompaniment for much of our responses and proper prayers such as the Memorial Acclamation and the Our Father, and we are leaving much more room for silence in the context of the liturgy where there would otherwise be organ playing in the background to aid in our mediation of the Divine Mysteries that we enter into. In the "Order of Prayer for the Celebration of the Eucharist" it reads, "The use of organ and other musical instruments and the decoration of the altar with flowers should be done in a moderate manner, as is consonant with the character of the season, without anticipating the full joy of Christmas".

Our Music Director here at Saint Joseph does an incredible job of ensuring that the selected hymns reflect the readings, the parts of Mass, and accompany the celebration of the feast as well as the season that we are in. During these penitential seasons of Advent and Lent, the silence that we experience in the Mass by the absence of the organ and other musical instruments allows us to enter into these silent mysteries the precede the two biggest celebrations of our faith: the birth of the Incarnate God and the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. If we feel a little awkward or uncomfortable, embrace it! All the more will we be able to enter into the awkwardness. of that very first Advent season, as we accompany the pregnant Mary journeying to the little town of Bethlehem. Even in the celebration of the Mass itself should we feel a longing in our hearts for the Christ Child's coming into the world. I pray that these last weeks leading into the joy of the Christmas season are equally beautiful as they may be penitential so that the joy of Christmas will be all the more incarnational in even the way in which we worship our Lord at the altar of sacrifice.

The Third Sunday of Advent is known as "Gaudete Sunday." Gaudete is the Latin word meaning "rejoice!" Advent is a season of hope, in which we acknowledge that salvation is both mysteriously present and yet to be fulfilled. In today's Gospel, we hear John ask Jesus: Are you the One? Jesus does not answer directly, but points to the signs of the kingdom present in his midst. Try to find signs of hope that God is present in your life and at work in our world, and pray that the world will know God's salvation.


