Big news for our Catholic community: Matthew McLain was ordained a transitional deacon on Friday at Holy Family Cathedral. A seminarian finishing Stage 4 studies at Saint Meinrad School of Theology in Indiana, Deacon Matthew will

complete his preparation for priesthood assigned to Immaculate Conception, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and Saint Joseph parish, arriving in January. He will reside in the Poteau rectory.

Notes for the Octave of Christmas

- » There will be no Mid-Week (Wednesday) Adoration on Christmas Eve or New Year's Eve.
- » There will be no Daily Mass at Immaculate Conception on Friday, Dec. 26, the day after Christmas, nor on Friday, Jan. 2, the day after New Year's.
- » Father Sean and the office staff will take some time off between Christmas and Epiphany Sunday. That doesn't mean that no work will be done, only that our office staff will be in-and-out, on no set schedule. So, if you need anything, please contact us individually and we'll make it happen for you.
- » Father Sean – along with a dozen of our amazing young adults – will attend the SEEK Conference in Denver. Their return is slated for January 6, if all goes well.
- » Father Daniel Gormley, the Associate Pastor of Saint Anne's in Broken Arrow, will preside over Masses on New Year's Day at each of our parishes. Please make him feel welcome.
- » Father Bryan Ketterer will celebrate Vigil Mass of the Epiphany at 5 p.m. on Saturday, January 3, at Saint Joseph Church, Stigler.
- » The Very Rev. Gary Kastl will celebrate the Epiphany Sunday Masses (Jan. 4) at Immaculate Conception and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Father Kastl is vicar general of the Diocese.
- » Family Faith Formation classes are on Holiday Hiatus until January 14.
- » Classes for English OCIA resume on Wednesday, January 7, a special night, but will return to Tuesday scheduling on January 13.
