START: Scott Joplin Mural, 311 Main Street proceed West on 3rd St.

1. 519 W. 3rd, Jamison Building turn left/South on Oak St., continue to W. Broad, turn left/East
2. 221 Texas Blvd, Home of Colonel R.W. Rogers, employer of Julius Weiss (no longer standing) continue East on Broad
3. Main and W. Broad, Ghio's Second Opera House, Joplin performed here
4. 111 E. Broad, Beasley Music Company continue East to Hazel St. turn left
5. 618 Hazel, home of Mrs. Florence Joplin in 1900
706 Hazel, home of the Overholser family, for whom Mrs. Joplin worked
continue North to 7th St., turn right, continue 1 block to Laurel, turn left
6. 809 Laurel, home of Monroe Joplin in 1900
7. 831 Laurel, Orr School proceed North to 9th St., turn right on Beech St.
8. George Johnson Pavilion, (now Kline Park) drive West to State Line Ave

END: 901 State Line Ave, Scott Joplin Marker park behind Chamber of Commerce
