We have the great privledge of hosting Teokotai Paitai in Waihōpai and Ōtepoti to share his knowledge and expertise of raranga kete with our community. This is a two day workshop where you will be upskilled in creating your very own kete to keep. All skill sets are welcomed to begin this learning journey of raranga kete from Teokatai. There are 15 available slots for this workshop each in Waihōpai and Ōtepoti.

Teokotai has woven a tapestry of skills throughout his journey within the Arts in Aotearoa. Dance, performance, event management and now raranga kete. He has been the Akl Pride Festival Director, Board Member for Akl Pride, Tautai, Playmarket, and DANZ. He has worked for MAU dance company, Black Grace dance company, Taki Rua Theatre and performed in, or worked on shows in Festivals throughout Aotearoa. He has been blessed to have worked with many of our taonga within Arts Aotearoa through dance, theatre, and film. Currently, Teokotai is sharing knowledge in raranga kete. "Our Kete is one way to see more colour in our daily lives", says Teokotai. Our workshop's are designed to instil well-being through the practice of raranga kete. Teokotai acknowledges the leadership of Tupumaiaga a Niue Trust, and the Pacifica Arts Trust who are both based in Tāmaki Makaurau. We have the great privledge of hosting Teokotai in Waihōpai to share his knowledge and expertise with our community. This will be 2 sessions of raranga and whanaungatanga. 
WHARE TAPERE

<u>1ST WĀNANGA</u> WEDNESDAY 20TH MARCH 2024

Our first engagement with the rangatahi will focus on whanaungatanga, waiata, and whenua. The rangatahi will get to know each other, expand their knowledge on the history of local whenua and Polynesian cultures, and take part in different activities and projects.

MUSIC PROJECT

• Early 2024

In 2023, our rangatahi met and created a waiata that represented them and their culture. This waiata has been made specially for the programme, and was performed by the rangatahi at their end of year showcase.

In 2024, the rangatahi will be given the opportunity to professionally record the waiata and release it on Spotify and Youtube.

There is also potential to design a cover art for the song, with the help of a local tamoko artist.

• Year long

After their first wānanga in March, the rangatahi will have the opportunity to work towards NCEA credits. These credits are based on standards involving pōwhiri, whanaungatanga, and other tikanga Māori. We will work with schools to provide these credits for our rangatahi.

POLYFEST

In the lead up to Polyfest, rangatahi are able to attend workshop with our Key Leaders to learn the skills and knowledge involved in the different areas of Polyfest. The rangatahi will work with their Key Leaders for the week of Polyfest, building their leadership skills so that by the end of the week, the rangatahi are in charge of their roles and areas.

At the end of the year, we will hold workshops with the rangatahi to create mahi toi they can display as an exhibition celebration. This exhibition will include mahi toi the rangatahi make during workshops with our senior artist, the cover art they make for their waiata, kapa haka and performing arts, and much more. It is an opportunity for whānau to see the work their rangatahi have been involved in, and celebrate their achievements.
