


# **Sundays**

### **RevVibes: You Are Not Alone**

Each year, September 10 marks World Suicide Prevention Awareness Day—a time to shine a light on a topic often shrouded in silence. For many people, struggles with depression, anxiety, trauma, or other mental health concerns can feel isolating and overwhelming. As a church, we want to say clearly: you are not alone.



Faith doesn't make us immune to pain. Even the psalmists cried out, "How long, O Lord?" (Psalm 13). Jesus himself wept and knew deep anguish. Struggle is not a sign of weak faith—it's part of being human. But in our faith, we also find hope. We believe in a God who meets us in the valley, who binds up the brokenhearted, and who calls us to care for one another.

This month, we invite you to:

- Check in with someone who might be struggling. A simple "How are you really doing?" can open a door.
- **Reach out** if you're hurting. You are beloved, and help is available.

- \* If you are a young person in the LGBTQ+ community, call or text the Trevor Lifeline

- **Educate** yourself on the signs of depression and suicide risk. A small amount of awareness can make a big difference.

### A Brief History of Little Angels Early Learning Center:

- 1999-Little Angels Christian Preschool started
- 2005-I took over as the lead preschool teacher and Center director
  - At this point we had:
  - 2-classes with 14 students
  - 2-employees
- 2010-4K began in Oregon School District and we hosted 2 classes
- 2011-Mom's Day Out (parent play co-op) became Parent's Day Out as we had several dads participating.
- 2014-Name changed to Little Angels Early Learning Center as we are no longer just a Christian Preschool, but also an OSD 4K site. This is the year we combined the Parent's Day Out Program and the need of more wraparound childcare care for preschool and 4K families to start our childcare/wrap around program.
- 2018-We added a 3rd 4K class.
- 2019-We held a 20-year celebration with a community open house.
- 2024-I took on the role as full time center director and passed the 4K teaching baton to a former preschool student.
- 2025-As we prepare for the start of the 2025-2026 school year:
  - 21-members on our staff (this includes regular teacher, office staff and substitutes)
  - 3-4K classes with 51 students currently enrolled.
  - 2-preschool classes with 23 students enrolled
  - 9-students enrolled in our childcare/wrap care on various schedules.



As we look to the future, we hope to turn the sand volleyball court into a 2nd playground that has an ADA approved cushioning base and some ADA activity options as well. As we are a site that receives a fair number of students with varying special needs. This year we are expecting our 4th student that uses a wheelchair.

There is so much to celebrate. Thanks for hosting our center as a ministry of the People's Church.

The PUMC Missions Committee has selected the YWCA Madison to be the September Missions of the Month because of the organization's programs to meet families' emergency needs while also helping these families achieve long-term stability.

YWCA Madison has been in continuous operation since 1909 and in 2023, served more than 4,488 individuals across over 20 programs within four areas of work: Employment & Transportation, Housing & Shelter, Race & Gender Equity, and Restorative Justice.

YWCA Madison is Dane County's largest provider of affordable housing for women, as well as one of the oldest providers of emergency shelter. To improve long-term family stability, the organization assists with transportation-related needs and helps each client find work, and/or get additional training to find and keep family-sustaining employment.



From their website: "YWCA Madison strives to make a positive difference in the lives of women, children, and families. Our effort is to support and make recommendations on policies that contribute to the empowerment of women and

the elimination of racism. We also work to promote effective policies that will improve the economic and social conditions for all people, so they can support their families and be part of our community's economic mainstream."

**Project Recovery Crisis Counseling by Phone**—Counselors are providing crisis counseling by phone free of charge, focusing on nonjudgmental listening and helping navigate emotions and reactions to stress caused by the public health crisis.
