RevVibes: We're Letting in the Light—Growing in Trust and Transparency

As People's continues to grow in ministry and mission, we also want to grow in transparency and trust. Healthy churches don't hide challenges; they face them together, prayerfully and with faith in God's provision.

Over the past several months, we've taken a closer look at our designated and dedicated accounts. That review revealed that a few unexpected costs created a significant shortfall. Three primary factors contributed:

- An external audit that, while necessary and beneficial, was not included in the budget.
- Interest payments on our line of credit, which had not been budgeted for several years.
- A sharp rise in insurance premiums, reflecting increases seen across many churches and organizations.

None of these expenses were the result of mismanagement — they were simply under-accounted-for costs that now give us a clearer picture of where we stand.

The good news is that we know what's happening now, and that knowledge helps us plan better for the future. The Servant Leadership Council, Finance Team, and Trustees are working together to ensure our budgeting process fully reflects ongoing costs, and that our dedicated funds are restored in a healthy, transparent way.

We will also be introducing a visual display in the Gathering Area to track our progress in paying down the line of credit. Each month, we'll celebrate that number moving downward — a reminder that small, steady faithfulness adds up to big progress over time.

Stewardship Q&A: Understanding Where We Are

What are "designated/dedicated" funds?

These are special accounts set aside for specific purposes — like missions, maintenance, or capital projects. They ensure that gifts given for a particular ministry are used exactly as intended.

Why do we have a line of credit?

The line of credit was opened when People's built the current church, a project costing over a million dollars. Proceeds from selling the old building reduced that balance significantly. During the 2008 recession and again during COVID, payments shifted to interest only, but several faithful gifts have since helped pay it down.

Does this mean the church is in financial trouble?

No. It means we're taking an honest look at our finances and adjusting for expenses that hadn't been budgeted in the past. This is a healthy step toward clearer planning and long-term stability

How can I help?

Pray for wisdom and unity. Continue giving faithfully as you're able. And if you'd like to take part more actively, consider joining the team that will plan, prepare, and carryout this year's Consecration Sunday Stewardship program. Your participation will help create a meaningful celebration of generosity and shared ministry. *

Our financial story, like our faith story, is one of perseverance and hope. We face challenges, yes — but not alone, and not without purpose. Together, with open hands and trusting hearts, we will continue to be faithful stewards of all that God has entrusted to us.

On Wednesday November 26 there will be no Wednesday Night Supper, youth group, or Creative ConnXions.




Thanksgiving Dinner



November Mission of the Month: Another Hope Children's Ministries by Anne Staton

November is traditionally the month when People's Church has a global organization as the mission of the month. The mission of Another Hope Children's Ministries is to bring hope to orphans and abused children in Uganda by providing love and care in a Christian environment. They work to improve the quality of life through education, proper accommodations, health care, and spiritual growth.





We have supported this ministry several times before through our mission giving. The needs are always great and our help provides the opportunity for the leadership to keep moving forward toward achieving their project goals and greater financial security. Two current projects are the planting of 700 avocado trees as a "long-term and high-value commercial venture" and the "purchase of 500 plastic chairs and 4 tents to start a rental business". The need for financial support for school expenses, digging another well to help the farm thrive,

and completing the construction of the staff residence are ongoing needs. Our giving will be used for the greatest need they have at the time it is received.

Uganda often experiences unrest that involves disruption of services and sometimes violence. They currently have no mail service and have had to work with government requirements that make life even more difficult for them. Through this all, the staff continue to strive for success, focusing on the health, happiness, and safety of the children in their care. The mission team thanks you in advance for your support of this November mission of the month.

Blessings Rice Bag Event Update

The goal this year was 5,000 bags. Each bag feeds 6 people, making it possible to feed 30,000 people. But we surpassed this goal by 80 bags, adding another 480 people served. Also, each box contains 40 bags—so this equals 127 boxes transported back to Midwest Mission headquarters at Pawnee, III. All of this happened on Saturday, October 4 at Sugar River United Methodist Church in Verona.





Remember, each bag costs \$2 to make. So the base goal for fund raising was \$11,300. Again, this goal was met and surpassed.

So how was this achieved?

- (1) Bratfest volunteers declaring Sugar River rice bags as their charity: 35 volunteers committed to 160 hours of service at \$12/hr, earning roughly \$2,000.
- (2) Donations: PUMC was able to add \$2,120 to this total through donations with Mission of the Month and shirt sales—but this does not include what the children raised the 2 weeks prior to the event.

VOLUNTEERS—According to Pastor Mike at Sugar River Methodist Church, there were around 150 volunteers that made this event possible. And 9 churches for sure that participated. So, let's break it down.

Each table line has 10 stations and there are 4 table lines, equaling 40 people per shift x 3 shifts=120 volunteers. Then there are 8 table monitors assigned throughout the day, making sure supplies are replenished as needed, give breaks, etc. Then people to set-up and clean-up when completed—not to forget those helping to unload the truck and load the truck after completion. Volunteers were incredibly well organized by Sandy Wolf.



I counted 17 people from our church that helped—Carol Copan, Val Brickner, Pam McIntyre, the MacArthurs (Kate, Ali, Wendy, Brett), Sue McCartney, Karen Baker, Laura Harm, Pastor Vicki, Howard Brantmeyer, Jane Morgan, Jody Lien, Linda Outhouse, Linda Hulett, and myself.

Immigration:
