



December 21 Fourth Sunday in Advent	Luke 2:8-20	The Shepherds: Love That Finds Us God entrusted the good news of great joy to ordinary shepherds, who couldn't keep it to themselves. Joy grows when it's shared.

RevVibes: Preparing Our Hearts for What's Next

As we enter the season of Advent—a season of holy waiting and wondrous expectation—I find myself reflecting on the ways God is already preparing us for what comes next. Advent teaches us to lean forward with hope, to watch for God's movement, and to ready our hearts for the new life Christ brings. Isaiah's words remind us that God is always doing something new—often quietly, often slowly, but always faithfully.

See, I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?

— Isaiah 43:19

It's in that spirit of anticipation that I want to share a glimpse of something that has been emerging through prayer, listening, conversation, and discernment: our Five-Year Ministry Plan.

Over the past several months, I've spent intentional time listening deeply—to God, to you, to our history, and to the unique gifts and challenges of People's Church. What has emerged is not a rigid blueprint or a list of demands, but a hope-filled roadmap for our next chapter. It is

- Listen slowing down enough to hear God and one another
- Learn growing in wisdom, curiosity, and spiritual maturity

a way of saying: We believe God is not finished with us yet. We believe there is more life to grow into, more compassion to share, more people to welcome, and more ways to shine Christ's light in our community.

In many ways, this plan is our way of preparing the launchpad— strengthening our foundations, fueling our mission, and readying ourselves for the "new thing" God is already igniting among us. Each year will focus on one key movement of discipleship and mission, giving us

time to grow thoughtfully and intentionally as we take the next faithful step together. Nothing about this plan asks us to be something we're not; instead, it invites us to become even more fully the church God created us to be—grounded, generous, courageous, and Spiritled.

As we prepare for the Christ Child—whose arrival changed the world with vulnerability, light, and love—I am filled with gratitude for this congregation. Your openness, your faithfulness, your willingness to dream, and your hope in God's future make this plan possible. I truly believe the next five years will be years of growth, joy, and transformation.

So as the candles of Advent glow brighter each week, may we carry that same light into the new year. Let us pray for open hearts, listening spirits, and the courage to follow where God leads. And may we be ready—steady on the launchpad, hopeful for the liftoff, and trusting the One who guides our future.

God is doing a new thing in us—together. And I cannot wait to see where this journey takes us.

Ms. Kelly from the public library came to read to our students again this month. Ms. Katie, our center director, read to each class this month. This time her books matched the class themes. She read the following books:

- 4K AM/PM: Whose tool is this? A book about tools different occupations use on the job.
- 4K AM2: MatMan Shapes
- Preschool: Corn. A book about corn facts
- Childcare: The little old woman who wasn't afraid of anything.

Our staff participated in 2 different 1 hour training sessions this month. One was "helping children make meaning after trauma", and the other was "from attention to connection: responding to challenging behavior in caring ways".



December Mission of the Month: NINA and Helping Hands by Jen Wiemer

December is our month to focus on supporting two local ministries: the NINA fund (Neighbors in Need of Assistance) and the Helping Hands fund. These funds stay directly in the Oregon area and have a real impact on Oregon families.



The NINA fund was established in December 2002 through the cooperation of Oregon churches and Joe Sullivan, a Community Social Worker. The fund assists families who are in need of the basic necessities of life. The top two requests have been for rent (to avoid eviction) and utilities (to avoid disconnects/to re-connect), as well as water. The NINA fund is supported by donations from churches, businesses, and individuals.

It's unfortunate, but the NINA fund saw significantly less donations this year than in previous years, which seems to be the trend in many communities. Last year, NINA assisted a little over 40 families who were struggling financially in the Oregon area. This year, they are on target to assist about half of that (roughly around 20 families) just due to lack of funds. It is clear that inflation and the high costs of many things lately has had an impact on everyone, including our donors. Even despite these setbacks, this year NINA has been able to assist several families with rent and utilities, as usual.

NINA was able to help refill one family's LP tank who had been living without power for several weeks during the summer. They helped a single mom move into housing for herself and her children. In addition, NINA helped a grandmother, who was tasked with taking guardianship of her grandchildren, move into adequate housing for herself and her grandkids. There are many more stories, but these are a few highlights.



The Helping Hands Fund, administered by St. John's, is an emergency fund for individuals and families who live in the Oregon-Brooklyn school district. The fund is supported by donations from St. John's members, members of area churches, and individuals in the community.

News from Our Social Justice Team

Updates on priority issues:



The Social Justice Team will be considering possible topics for small group pods to be held after the new year. Also in January the team will be looking at ways the church community can support youth in the Oregon School District.

At a future meeting the team will review the "Pulse of the congregation" information collected in recent weeks (on sticky notes). The Social Justice Team will be considering this in light of possible topics for small group pods to be held after the new year. Also in January the team will be looking at ways the church community can support youth in the Oregon School District, perhaps including a pod for parents and kids to share their experiences.

After the first of the year there may be an active shooter training held.

On Sunday December 21 there will be an opportunity after church for anyone to write a card with words of encouragement for LGBTQ+ people. This is an initiative of Wisconsin Faith Voices for Justice, which will distribute the cards. In addition we will be writing cards to people living in local care facilities.

Wisconsin state legislators have introduced legislation (SB 578/AB 598) that creates "Patient Representatives" who would be given the authority to consent to patient admissions to nursing homes without requiring a petition for guardianship or protective placement. The Wisconsin Aging Advocacy Network and other aging, disability, and legal advocates oppose this legislation, as they believe this legislation creates risk for patients and family members, has legal and operational issues, and does not resolve the issue it was designed to address People are encouraged to contact their elected state representatives to urge them to vote against this bill.
