Our faith formation classes for the 2025-26 year will begin soon for all grade levels.

Ms. Joy Matias-Ramirez will become lead catechist for the confirmation proximate preparation class, and Ms. Jen Hera will continue as lead catechist for the initial preparation class.

We ask that you support these dedicated volunteers in their new roles along with the many other volunteer catechists at all levels who are invaluable to the continued formation of our children and youth. We pray for all students who are beginning their classes later this month, including our youth who are attending college.

Liturgy of the Word for Children ages 3 to 5 begins on 24 August during the 9 a.m. Mass. This is a program where the children are dismissed before the first reading and led by a catechist to the Bride's Room (located in the narthex). Scripture readings are proclaimed and explained on a level appropriate to the children to foster growth in their understanding and love of God. Children will be returned to the congregation following the homily.

Vocation Prayer Challenge: On 7 September, we will begin our Vocations Prayer Challenge. This will be our opportunity to pray for religious vocations which is vital toward ensuring future generations of Catholics priests, deacons, and religious to celebrate the sacraments and help guide us in our faith. I am asking families to take the vocation chalice home with them to pray for one week.
