After the celebration of Halloween (All Saints Eve), it is our privilege to remember and honor all the saints, both known and unknown, as **the Church celebrates the Solemnity of All Saints on November 1**. On this holy day of obligation, we celebrate those whom the Church has declared to be in heaven, rejoicing in their blissful view of God for eternity. Oh, what an indescribable sight it will be! Do you too not want to be there to gaze upon the face of God forever? This great feast reminds us that holiness is not optional. It is our destiny and our calling. You too can be a saint!

The saints who went before us cheer us on as we run the race of faith, showing us that eternal life with Christ is possible for each of us. In the joyful All Saints Day celebration this weekend, we will give thanks for the countless witnesses to Christ and ask for their prayers. We will honor those heroic men and women with a vigil Mass on Friday, October 31, 2025 at 6 p.m. followed by Alan Ames' healing service. Others of us may have moved to a state of peace, knowing that the souls of the just are in the hand of God. If you can, visit the cemetery to pray for your loved ones and, most especially, those who have no one to pray for them. Our Jubilee is a time to rejoice and thank God for all the blessings we have received during our first 25 years. And as our Jubilee theme expresses, it has been a journey of grace. Our Jubilee is also a time for sharing as an act of thanksgiving. We begin with the Farm Workers food drive on the weekend of 2<sup>nd</sup> November. This is followed by our first Day of Giving Back, when we will visit Matthew's Hope on the 18<sup>th</sup> of November to distribute meals to over 400 friends in need who will visit that facility. November also gives us an opportunity to celebrate **Thanksgiving Day** with our family and friends. Our primary focus is on **THANKING GOD** for all that he has done and continues to do for us. We will have **two Thanksgiving Masses: on Wednesday, 26 November at 7 p.m. and on Thursday, 27 November at 10 a.m.** As you prepare for this holiday, you can perhaps mull over this Thanksgiving Prayer offered by Ralph Waldo Emerson:

For love and friends,
For everything thy goodness sends.
